LABOR TRAFFICKING

Compelling men, women and children to work against their will for little or no pay.



RED FLAGS: VICTIMS MAY...

- Feel pressured by their employer to stay in a job or situation they want to leave
- Owe money to an employer or recruiter
- Not be paid what they were promised or are owed
- Not have control over their documents
- Be living & working in isolated conditions where they are cut off from support systems
- Be threatened by their boss with harm or deportation
- Appear to be monitored by another person
- Be forced to live in dangerous, overcrowded or inhumane conditions by their employer
- Exhibit injuries, malnutrition, dehydration
- Have to work in dangerous conditions without proper safety gear or protection

BE AN INFORMED CONSUMER



Know who makes the products you buy and the food you eat so that you can keep slavery tainted items out of your home.

Visit the Department of Labor for a list of goods that could be subject to child labor or forced labor. Shop for goods with the Fair Trade Certified label.
