On October 14, 2019, the School Board received a presentation from Moseley Architects related to the new Walton Elementary School. The presentation is included as **Attachment A** (with the email and cover memo from the School Superintendent).

The School Board is requesting a funding commitment of \$1,845,432 to address the design phase of the elementary school (see slides 14, 17 and 19). Slide 17 provides a summary of what is included in the Architectural /Engineering (A/E) Services. It is not known why Bidding and Construction Administration is being requested as a current need. Additionally, slide 14 shows \$263,633 in Testing Services; and it is not known whether any of those services are needed prior to bidding the project.

To honor this request, an appropriation of \$1,845,432 (or updated amount) is needed to the County-wide CIP fund. If approved, this amendment/appropriation will require a public hearing because the total dollar amount exceeds 1% of the adopted FY2020 budget (Adopted FY2020 budget = \$123,068,958; 1% = \$1,230,690).

The Board could appropriate \$1,230,689 or less without a public hearing.

If needed, a public hearing **could be held at the November 13 board meeting** as budget amendment notice is required only once at least 7 days prior to the public hearing.

Possible sources to fund the A/E services (for any amount) are:

1. Include all or part of the A/E fees in the **future borrowing for the school project**. This option will require approval of a **reimbursement resolution**, which will allow the board to reimburse itself for A/E fees with a future issuance of bonds/debt. Financing / borrowing for A/E as part of the Elementary School project will result in increased interest payments.



2. Pay for the design phase *in whole or in part* from fund balance, using FY2019 excess revenues over expenditures for both Schools and County. This excess reverts to fund balance for both entities. Schools commonly refer to this excess as "carryover."

This option will prohibit further FY19 "carryover" re-appropriation to schools in FY2020 for any other operating or capital purpose. Paying cash instead of borrowing for \$1,845,432 of the school project could save an estimated \$1,356,213 in interest on debt service (calculated at 4% interest with a 30 year term).

3. Pay for the design phase *in whole or in part* from fund balance, using FY2019 excess revenues over expenditures for only the County. This excess reverts to fund balance.

This will allow carryover re-appropriation consideration to schools in FY2020 for other operating or capital purpose. Paying cash instead of borrowing for \$1,845,432 of the school project could save an estimated \$1,356,213 in interest on debt service (calculated at 4% interest with a 30 year term).

ATTACHMENT B provides the details of the unaudited School Operating (Fund 0500) and General Fund (Fund 0100) FY2019 revenues over expenditures and provides amounts reserved/committed for purchase orders and grants.

Use of fund balance for A/E fees is **not** expected to bring the percentage of fund balance below policy limit of 12.5% of operating expenditures.




Project Timeline – Site Finalized 3-1-20

COUNTY OF PRINCE GEORGE NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO FY20 BUDGET

Notice is hereby given pursuant to § 15.2-2507, <u>Code of Virginia</u> (1950, as amended), that the Prince George County Board of Supervisors will conduct a public hearing for the purpose of receiving comments on a proposed amendment to the FY2019-20 Prince George County Annual Fiscal Plan (the "Budget") during its regular meeting of Tuesday, **November 13, 2019**, beginning at 7:30 p.m., in the Boardroom of the County Administration Building, Third Floor, 6602 Courts Drive, Prince George, Virginia. All interested citizens are invited to attend and participate in the public hearing.

The current FY2019-20 budget is \$123,068,958. The proposed budget amendment would add **up to \$1,845,432*** to the FY2019-20 budget to fund completion of design phase architectural and engineering services for a new elementary school.

A copy of materials related to the proposed budget amendment can be examined in the County Administration Department of the County Administration Building. The building is open from Monday - Friday, 8:30 AM - 5:00 PM.
