- Discussed House bill 2018 in the General Assembly 2023 Session. HB 2018 Children's Services Act; Information sharing; Confidentiality exception. This bill allows FAPT and CPMT Teams to share information with local law enforcement or threat assessment teams established by local school boards if the team deems that a child poses a threat of violence or physical harm to himself and/or others.
