Budget Amendment and Appropriation of Debt Proceeds to Capital Projects Fund-

Related to Approved Capital Improvement Projects

As part of the adopted FY2017 budget and CIP process, the County proposed debt issuance to accomplish a number of Capital Improvement Program projects. Davenport & Company issued an RFP to solicit bids for a Tax Exempt General Obligation Bond and reviewed the results and recommendation with the board on March 14, 2017. The board authorized financing through Carter Bank & Trust for \$10,000,000 on March 14, 2017.

The board conducted public hearings for both the issuance of debt and related budget amendments and appropriations on March 14, 2017.

Staff is requesting approval of budget amendments and appropriations of debt proceeds to CIP Fund for the projects **shown on page 2**. In keeping with past practices, a separate appropriation resolution for each project is being provided for board consideration.

There are 5 projects for which staff is also requesting authority to issue a contract. Resolutions for those projects request appropriation and authority to issue a contract. Those related attachments (F - J) show the procurement documentation and recommended contractor are provided for those projects.

Project Description:

Replacement of the County public safety radio system.

Project Justification:

To ensure continued quality radio coverage. Increase and expand interoperability with other agencies. Current system will reach end of life with repair not guaranteed.

Impact if Project not Completed:

Interoperability will become increasingly difficult as other agencies that we interact with move forward with replacement. The County's equipment will become antiquated with limited usage as the system approaches end of life. Replacement parts will also become increasingly difficult if not impossible to find. In the event of any portion of the system failing, repair will more than likely not be an option. This has an impact on public safety personnel and potentially the safety of the public,

Financing:

The current estimated cost for the replacement is \$20.0 million and is scheduled to be completed with the issuance of debt service for fiscal year 2018.

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Final Assessment Report

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1.0 Opinion of Probable Cost

Table 1-1 summarizes AECOM's opinion of probable cost of the conceptual system design described in Section 6 of the Needs Assessment report. Included in this opinion is a 5 RF tower site, 6-channel simulcast P25 Phase 2, 700/800 MHz trunked radio system. The new configuration identifies four sites that already exist in the County to avoid constructing new towers and one new Greenfield site; however, the opinion of probable cost has included new site development and new tower construction for all 5 RF sites in case lease arrangements for existing towers are not viable or the structure for a County-owned site is insufficient. The system includes the radio infrastructure, a new single channel simulcast UHF paging system, funding for in-building coverage systems for between 5 and 7 buildings, subscriber units including growth, independent verification and validation (IV&V) fees for Phase 3, implementation and acceptance, any upgrades to the physical facilities, and a microwave backhaul connectivity system.

Table 1-2 summarizes AECOM's opinion of probable cost for new subscriber units such as mobile radios, portable radios, and desktop control stations. The estimate is provided at the agency level.

1.1 Estimate Categories

Table 1-1 contains three estimate categories:

- List Estimate: An estimate for the project based on the list costs database which is based upon AECOM's
 research.
- Negotiated Estimate: List price costs adjusted for the effect of negotiating with a sole source vendor or system integrator. The list costs are reduced by the percentages that we have typically seen in this type of procurement.
- Competitive Estimate: Estimates are further reduced to reflect cost reduction typically seen in highly competitive procurements.

1.2 Cost Elements

Table 1-1 is separated by the cost elements or the categories of equipment that make up the radio system and costs.

1.2.1 Infrastructure

The estimate for radio system infrastructure generally includes the fixed equipment located at the transmission and control sites, as described in Section 6 of the Needs assessment report, supplied under separate cover, such as:

- Transmitters
- Receiver
- Repeaters
- Antennas
- Switches
- Routers
- Multicouplers
- Combiners
- Simulcast equipment
- -48 VDC Power Supplies
- Over-the-Air Programming (OTAP)
- Over-the-Air Rekeying (OTAR)

The infrastructure equipment for a P25 trunked radio system also includes centralized core equipment such as a master controller and associated computers for administration and management of the radio system. Two interoperability gateways, replacement Console systems, a UHF simulcast paging system, and in-building coverage enhancement systems are also included in the infrastructure costs.

1.2.2 Microwave

The estimate for microwave infrastructure generally includes the content described in Section 6:

- Microwave radios
- Microwave antennas
- Waveguide
- Cabling
- DC power supplies

This estimate assumes that all sites and the ECC will be connected by microwave as described in Section 6. The ECC radio site is connected to the EOC via existing fiber optic cable.

1.2.3 Physical Facilities

The estimate for physical facilities generally includes the following, as described in Section 6:

- Tower analyses for County-owned towers
- New towers
- Tower foundation pad
- · Geotechnical surveys
- New shelters
- Uninterruptible Power Supplies (UPS)
- Site clearing and development
- Security fencing
- HVAC
- Generators
- Grounding
- Alarm system
- Utilities
- Site access and parking

New shelters have been included at the 5 RF tower sites.

1.3 Subscriber Units

Table 1-2 contains the subscriber equipment quantities and cost estimate. This includes pricing for new mobile and portable units, as well as new control stations.

For cost estimation purposes, we make the following assumptions:

- New mobile and portable radios include the capability to utilize OTAP and OTAR.
- New mobile and portable radios include AES encryption for the Police Department only.
- Mobile and desktop control station estimates include the antenna, installation, remote control head, speaker, and a microphone.
- Mobile and control station antenna installations assume "normal" conditions.
- Warranty service for a new radio is provided for one year.

1.4 Additional Cost Elements

1.4.1 Vendor Services

Some of the effort on the part of a major radio retailer and/or a systems integrator would be to outsource those efforts not part of their core business. As would be expected in the outsourcing, the price for the service is escalated with pass-through fees and administrative add-ons, as well as risk factors for unanticipated activities.

In the cost estimate there is a category for Vendor Services. This accounts for the expenses experienced by the Vendor to perform procedures for professional engineering, design, project management, and their own verification of performance for these elements to match your requirements. In our experience, 18 percent of the cost of the project, not including subscriber equipment, can be expected for vendor services.

1.4.2 Independent Verification and Validation (IV&V)

The IV&V estimate contains the necessary fee for an independent consultant to assist with the specification, procurement, implementation, and acceptance of the system. This critical fee will provide the expertise to facilitate a clean procurement cycle and a smooth implementation. This will also provide management with the confidence that the console and radio systems purchased meet your requirements.

1.4.3 infrastructure Spares

Spare parts for both the console system and the radio system infrastructure are estimated at 1 percent of the infrastructure costs.

1.4.4 Contingency

In a project of this size and complexity, unexpected occurrences and expenditures will be required. All of the estimates and all of the proposals will be predicated on such terms as "normal conditions", that there will be no zoning appeals and/or delays, suitable access will be available, and other such conditions. While successful and detailed negotiations can assist in protecting the project, the unexpected will occur. In our experience, 10 percent of the cost of the project, not including subscriber equipment, is an appropriate contingency fund.

1.5 Recurring Costs

1.5.1 Maintenance

The new radio system will come with a one-year comprehensive warranty that covers all new equipment and systems purchased. After the first year, the Prince George Police Department will enter into an annual maintenance contract with the system vendor. The Prince George Police Department will be able to select from a number of services tailored to its needs. Maintenance options include remote monitoring, intrusion detection, software maintenance, software upgrades, infrastructure repair, subscriber repair, and technical support.

The maintenance contract can support all systems supplied under a turnkey project, including those not manufactured by the radio vendor. The maintenance cost for the conceptual system design will depend upon the number of sites and quantity of subscribers.

If the agencies choose to reuse existing equipment such as subscriber units, this equipment will not be covered by warranty and depending upon its age, the vendor may not be willing to include them in the maintenance contract.

1.5.2 Radio Technicians

Items such as installing and removing radios, programming radios, preventive maintenance, and managing the radio system are all examples of tasks that will have to be performed, either by the Prince George Police Department's own personnel or through contracts with service providers. Although the

Prince George Police Department currently performs these duties through contracts, hiring personnel can be a cost-effective approach for systems of this size.

1.5.3 Site Leases

The Prince George Police Department may be required to pay monthly leases for radio sites which it does not own. Costs are based on the location of the site (whether it is in a high-demand urban area, or whether it is in a more rural location), the number and location of antennas (space higher on the tower is more valuable) and the space required for shelters and generators.

1.5.4 Subscriber Equipment

The County radio system upgrade will be a migration from UHF to a 700/800MHz radio system; therefore, no UHF subscriber units from the existing UHF radio system will function on the new 700/800MHz radio system. New 700/800MHz subscriber units will have to be purchased by the County as shown in Table 1-2 above. Over time, as the number of radio user grows, all new units purchased must be capable of P25 Phase 2 operations.

James River Drive Fire & EMS Station

Project Description:

The Director of Fire and EMS was charged by the Board of Supervisors and County Administration to conduct a study on future fire station needs and locations. This study was completed in December, 2013. The results of the study identified several locations in which a Fire and EMS station needs to be located in the future. Several citizens from the Rivers Edge Subdivision have expressed the need for a Fire and EMS station located closer to their area. Developers have been working with staff to secure a site for the station to be constructed.

Project Justification:

After the insurance industry changed its practice on underwriting homeowner's policies, several citizens have seen an increase of up to 150% of their previous cost for fire insurance. This issue coupled with long response times in higher populated areas as well as areas in which future development plans are underway, and fatalities resulting from structural fires have prompted action.

Impact if Project not Completed:

If not completed, the result will be an inability to house essential personnel and resources in areas with higher call volumes. The inability to house essential personnel and resources will result in long response times from other stations.

Financing:

The estimated total cost of the new fire station is \$1,000,000. Scheduled to be constructed with appropriated funds of \$500,000 from FY16 and a debt issuance in FY2017 of \$500,000.

Wireless Broadband

Project Description:

The wireless broadband project will bring high speed internet to areas of the County that do not have reliable service or the limited service options have high cost structures. The system will be built with regional connection opportunities. The concept is to have the County own the assets (towers/cables) and lease space to internet service providers (ISPs) who will operate the service. This allows the assets to be used for future County needs (i.e. public safety communication system).

Project Justification:

The lack of broadband service negatively impacts the following: large industrial businesses in our business park still on DSL, home businesses with no service, and students who cannot view their grades, homework, lunch account, lunch menu, or project research from their homes. As Prince George County government, schools and businesses invest in technology upgrades, our telecommunications issue is simple, the failure to reach last mile consumers. In the fall of 2014, Prince George County worked with the Virginia Tech: Accelerate Virginia to have a speed test completed in the County. The data collected by Jean Plymale, Virginia Tech, was utilized to target the most underserved broadband areas of the County. http://acceleratevirginia.org/speedtest/

Business prospects and home buyers will not select Prince George County without this service. The tax base will erode as location decisions are made to areas with reliable, cost-effective internet.

Impact if Project not Completed:

There will be continued lack of internet service, poor internet service or expensive, non-competitive internet service to the rural areas of Prince George County.

Financing:

The project is slated to be debt financed in FY2017 and is estimated to cost \$2,000,000.

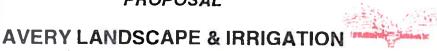
