If you are just visiting, we think you will find our County a fantastic place to live or locate a business. We believe our vision statement truly reflects who we are, “A welcoming community, embracing its rural character and focusing on its prosperous future.”

If you are one of the County’s residents, you already know our County is a great place to live, work, and raise a family.



When established in 1703, Prince George County encompassed an area from where the Appomattox River joins the James River, south and west to the North Carolina line, and to the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains. Today this area is divided into 17 counties and four cities. Our County is rich in history from the first days of Captain John Smith’s exploration of the new world through the Civil War. President Lincoln spent two weeks in Prince George County just before the fall of Petersburg and Richmond as the Civil War was ending.

Prince George County operates with five elected Supervisors under the traditional Board form of government. The Board has legislative responsibilities to include adopting ordinances and resolutions which govern the County. The Board also has administrative responsibilities such as levying taxes, establishing a budget, appropriating funds, and overseeing general County operations. A County Administrator oversees the day to day operations of the County.

Prince George County is proud of its rural heritage. Our Comprehensive Plan recognizes this and works to preserve our rural character while designating specific areas in the northern portions of the County for business development. Our industrial park has many internationally known businesses. Just to name a few: Amazon, Goya Foods Distribution Center, Perdue Farms, and Service Center Metals. We are also home to the Commonwealth Center for Advanced Manufacturing. The industrial park is served by three Interstate Highways, US Route 460, the Port of Virginia, and Norfolk Southern railroad which makes the transportation of products very easy in all directions. Prince George County is also the home of the Fort Gregg-Adams Army Base.

On behalf of the Board of Supervisors and the County Administration, thank you for visiting our County. Whether you live here or are just visiting, we are certain Prince George County has much to offer.

Prince George County, Virginia, has been open for business for almost 400 years and business development is thriving today. Known for its prime location in central Virginia and the Mid-Atlantic region of the United States, Prince George is easily accessible to the global marketplace. Prince George County is home to the likes of Commonwealth Center for Advanced Manufacturing, GOYA, Amazon, Perdue, Service Center Metals, and many more.

In 2005, a Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) law was passed by Congress. One of BRAC's requirements was the relocation of the U.S. Army Ordnance Center and School headquarters, the Ordnance Mechanical Maintenance School, the United States Army Ordnance Munitions and Electronic Maintenance School, and the Ordnance Museum to Fort Lee (now renamed Fort Gregg-Adams) by the end of 2011. The transfer of artifacts from Aberdeen to Fort Gregg-Adams began in August 2009, with the former museum now designated the U.S. Army Ordnance Training and Heritage Center at Fort Gregg-Adams.

DID YOU KNOW?

There are 3 rivers in Prince George County: Appomattox, James, and Blackwater Rivers.

GETTING HERE



From Richmond:

Take I-95 S to VA-629 E/Rives Rd in Petersburg. Then, take Exit 47 to follow VA-629 E to Prince George County.

–OR–

Follow I-64 E to Exit 200 for I-295 toward US-60/Rocky Mt NC. Follow signs for I-295 S. From I-295 S, take Exit 3A and merge onto US-460 E toward Norfolk. Then, turn left onto VA-629 E and continue to Prince George County.

From Hampton Roads:

Take VA 164 to US 13/58. Then, turn left to stay on US-258S/W Main Street. Then, turn right onto US-460W/General Mahone Blvd and continue to Prince George County.

From Rocky Mount, NC:

Take I-95 N to Templeton and then take Exit 41 for VA-35/US-301 toward VA-156/Courtland. Continue to Prince George County.

From Washington, DC:

Take I-395 S to I-95 S. Follow signs for I-295 S. From I-295 S, take Exit 3A and merge onto US-460 E toward Norfolk. Then, turn left onto VA-629 E and continue to Prince George County.

Merchant's Hope Church parish was established in 1657. The building was constructed circa 1740 and remains an active parish church, one of the oldest in the nation.

Rising Mount Zion Baptist Church was founded in 1876 as a congregation called "Jessie's Church," a reference to its founder, Deacon Jesse Williams. The congregation originally met under a bush arbor on James Parham's farm. Wings to the original wooden structure were 20th Century additions.

The Church of the Sacred Heart is the remaining symbol of the nucleus of Czech families that settled after the Civil War to form the community of New Bohemia. Today's church structure is the third, the first having been erected in 1906.

Established in 1714 and believed to be the first Baptist Church in Virginia, Oakland Baptist Church became the Oakland Czech-Slovak Baptist Church in 1923. It remained primarily a Czech speaking group until the 1950s.

This historic church structure for Martin's Brandon Parish was designed by Baltimore architect Niersee & Neilson and built in 1855 as a replacement for an earlier structure. It features several beautiful stained glass windows, including two sanctuary windows designed by Louis Comfort Tiffany.

Built by Williamson Simmons on Second Swamp near present day Disputanta, Chester Estates was a historic plantation with Greek Revival architecture unique to the county in 1845. It was later owned by local philanthropist and business leader, Rennie Arnold. Today, Chester Estates is a bed & breakfast and event venue that hosts weddings and other parties.

Founded with a 1618 land grant to Sir George Yeardley, Flowerdeew Hundred was the site of the first windmill in North America. Created by a land grant in 1616 to John Martin, an original Jamestown settler, Martin's Brandon Plantation features a house built in 1765 by Nathaniel Harrison. The plantation remains an active farm enterprise, one of the longest running agricultural operations in the United States.

Upper Brandon, divided from the original Brandon land in 1807, features a main house erected in 1825 with wing additions completed in 1859. Please contact PG County Regional Heritage Center for information.

Evergreen is a plantation home built by the Ruffin family in early 1800's. Birthplace of Edmund Ruffin, noted agriculturist and secessionist, who worked extensively on revitalizing the depleted soils of Prince George County farms. This late eighteenth century home was built by Thomas Cocke. Its unique architectural features include hand-done reeding around windows and doors, unique mantels in each of the main rooms, and a transverse hallway that opens for ventilation at each end. Pavilion Reservations: County citizens, businesses, and organizations may reserve pavilion facilities through the Parks and Recreation Department. 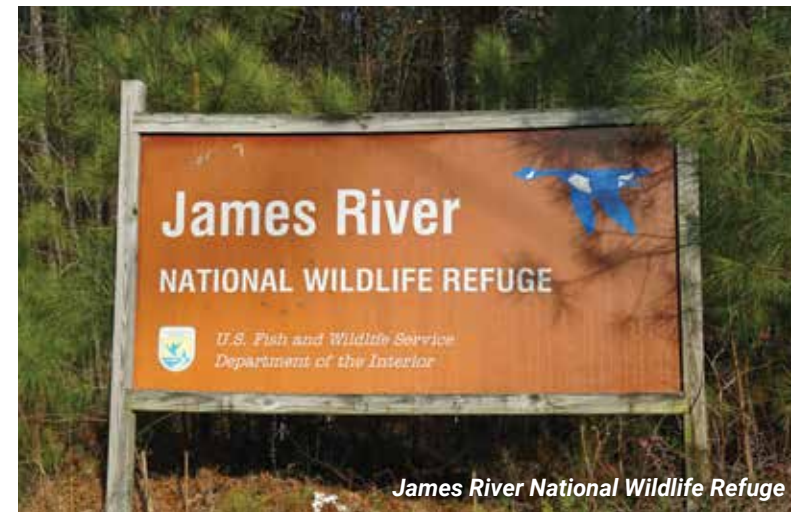

Hunting the Refuge

Approximately 4,000 acres of the Refuge is open to the public for hunting. The refuge permits hunting of white-tailed deer, coyote, turkey during designated dates and seasons. General public hunts must be arranged by making an advanced reservation, and these reservations are made on a first-come, first-served basis.

For other hunting inquiries, visit the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries website at dgif.virginia.gov or call 804-367-1000. Hunting is prohibited at public parks without a permit.

Powell Creek Nature Trail

The Powell Creek Nature Trail is designed to promote the physical and mental benefits that are associated with outdoor activities. This pedestrian trail offers a tranquil setting for a leisurely stroll and see native plants and wildlife in their natural environment.

Fort Gregg-Adams

DIVE INTO HISTORY

The history of Fort Gregg-Adams has three phases beginning with the United States’ entry into World War I. With the Declaration of War in April 1917, the Army leased 9,000 acres in Prince George County for the construction of one of 32 new cantonments built to train the mobilizing Army. Following a whirlwind of construction, Camp Lee became the home of the 80th “Blue Ridge” Division, which deployed to France in May 1918. A daily population of more than 40,000 troops trained at Camp Lee until the Armistice in November 1918. Serving as a demobilization station until 1921, Camp Lee was dismantled with the land reverting to the Commonwealth of Virginia for use as a forest and game preserve. It would remain so until war again threatened. In 2023, the installation was renamed to honor Lt. Gen. Arthur Gregg and Lt. Col. Charity Adams Earley, two Black officers who excelled in the field of Sustainment.

On display rare sample uniforms that highlight the role of the Quartermaster Corps in designing, producing, and supplying Army clothing from 1842-1963.

It originated at Fort McClellan, Alabama in 1955 until it was moved to Fort Gregg-Adams, reopening in May 2001. The Museum honors women’s contributions to the Army telling their stories with interactive exhibits and videos throughout the gallery.

The U.S. Army Women’s Museum serves as an educational institution, providing military history training and instruction to soldiers, veterans, and the civilian community. The museum is the custodian and repository of artifacts and archival material pertaining to the service of women across all branches and organizations of the U.S. Army from inception to the present day. The museum collects, preserves, manages, interprets, and exhibits these unique artifacts for training and educational outreach.

The museum is free and offers guided tours, film viewings, an art gallery, distance learning programs, and a kid’s corner.

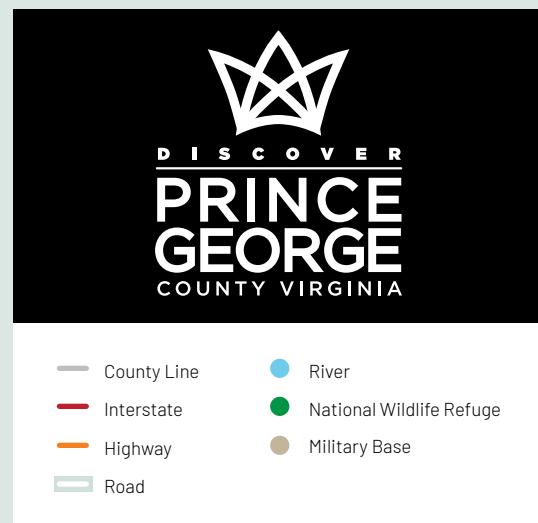
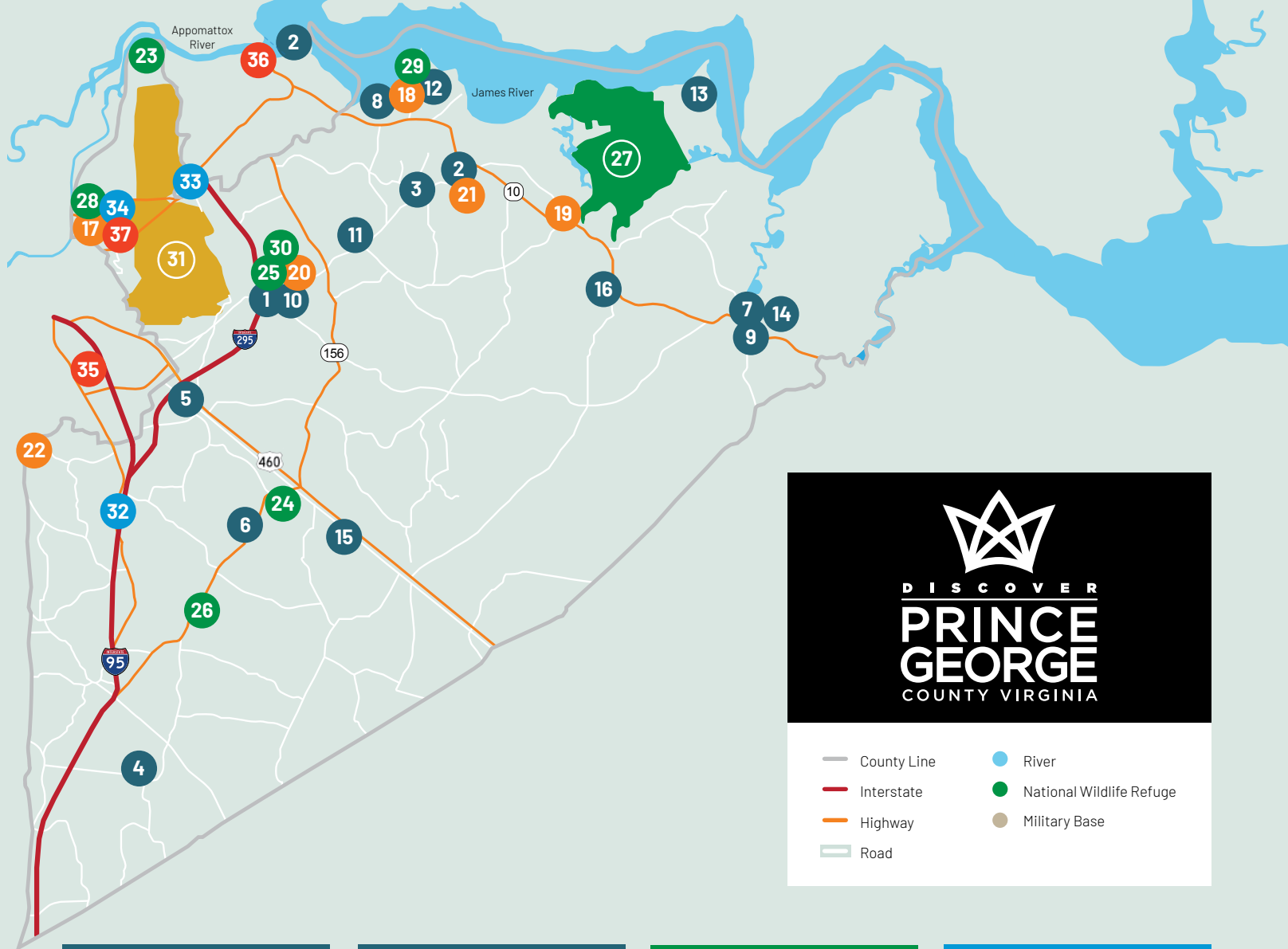
