- <u>Basketball</u> The Parks and Recreation Department registered 165 youth for Basketball. There were (5) Mighty-Mite teams (ages 7-8); (4) Pee-Wee teams (ages 9-10); (4) Junior teams (ages 11-12); (4) Senior teams (ages 13-15 year). All teams were co-ed in 2021 due to low girl enrollment.
- <u>Baseball/Softball</u> The Parks and Recreation Department registered 254 boys for Baseball, 88 girls for Softball, and 79 boys and girls for Blastball. There were (9) Blastball teams (ages 3-4); (6) co-ed T-Ball teams (ages 5-6); (3) AA Coach pitch teams (ages 7-8); (2) Darlings Softball teams (ages 7-8); (4) AAA Baseball teams (ages 9-10); (2) Angels Softball teams (ages 9-10); (3) Majors Baseball teams (ages 11-12); (1) Ponytails Softball team (ages 11-12); (2) Babe Ruth Baseball teams (ages 13-16); and (1) Belles Softball team (ages 13-16).
- <u>Spring Soccer</u> The Parks and Recreation Department registered 361 youth for Spring Soccer. There were (4) Mini-Mite teams (age 4); (8) Mighty Mite teams (ages 5-6); (7) Pee-Wee teams (ages 7-8); (4) Junior teams (ages 9-11); (2) U14 Travel teams (ages 12-14); and (2) U18 teams (ages 15-18).
- <u>Girls Spring Field Hockey</u> The Parks and Recreation Department registered 42 girls for Spring Field Hockey. There were (4) teams, which played in tournaments in Lynchburg, Virginia Beach, and Williamsburg.

- Football/Cheerleading The Parks and Recreation Department registered 167 youth for Football, and 135 youth for Cheerleading. Parks and Recreation Department is a member of Chesterfield Quarterback League (CQL). There were (2) Minors tackle teams (ages 8-9), (2) Juniors tackle teams (ages 10-11), (2) Senior tackle teams (ages 12-14), and (3) Flag football teams (ages 5-7).
- <u>Youth Wrestling</u> There was no wrestling for the 2020/2021 season due to Central Wellness Center renovation andCovid-19.
- <u>Girls Indoor Field Hockey for First Graders</u> The Parks and Recreation Department held an inaugural instructional field hockey league for first graders. There were (8) girls registered.
- <u>Girls Indoor Field Hockey</u> There was not an Indoor Field Hockey League for 2020/2021 season due to Covid-19.





Exercise Classes

- <u>Arthritis Exercise Program</u> The Arthritis
 - Foundation program is a free community based, recreational group exercise and education program designed specifically for people with arthritis and related diseases. Cardio classes are held on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday from 10:00 AM -10:45 AM. Chair exercises are held on Wednesday from 11:00 AM - 11:30 AM. All classes are held the Community Center.
- <u>H.I.I.T</u> H.I.I.T stands for High Intensity Interval Training. This class is a challenging and effective total body work out. This class burns fat, sculpts lean muscle, and strengthens the core. Participants give 100% effort through 20 second intense bursts of exercise, followed by 10 seconds of recovery periods. This class is held on Tuesday nights at the Community Center from 6:30 PM - 7:15 PM.
- <u>Line Dancing</u> This class is instructed by Balette Messer. Dances are broken down for easy instruction, and are all about fun. Class is open for ages 12 and up (under 16 must be accompanied by a parent). This class is held on Thursday nights at the Community Center from 6:30 PM - 7:15 PM.

Exercise Classes

- <u>Mind-Body Exercises</u> This free classes features two "mindful" exercise forms, Yoga and Tai Chi. This class presents strategies and movement sequences to incorporate mind-body exercise into physical activity for all ages. This class is held twice on Wednesday's at the Community Center from 8:00 AM - 8:45 AM, and again from 10:00 AM -10:45 AM.
- Yoga This class involves stretching, and creating balance in the body through developing both strength and flexibility. This class is held on Monday nights at the Community Center from 7:15 PM - 8:00 PM.
- <u>Zumba</u> This class is a fusion of Latin and International music with dance themes creating a dynamic, exciting, and effective fitness workout. The routines features aerobic/fitness interval training with a combination of fast and slow rhythms that tone and sculpt the body. This class is held on Monday nights at the Community Center from 6:30 PM - 7:15 PM.



Summer Program

 Summer Day Camp - Parks and Recreation sponsored its annual Summer Day Camp from June 21 - August 12, 2021. Camp was held on Monday's and Wednesday's at Scott Park and Tuesday's and Thursday's at Temple Park. The day camp times were from 9:30 AM - 2:30 PM. There were (55) youth (ages 6 -12) who participated. Youth participated in various outdoor activities, made crafts, and took field trips to a local swimming pool,



Special Interest

- <u>E-Sports</u> Parks and Recreation partnered with GG Leagues for E-Sports. Ages 8 + were able to participate in their appropriate age groups. Participants could play against other players across the country. The leagues were monitored by a GG League representative.
- <u>Hunter Safety Courses</u> Parks and Recreation hosted the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries instruction of several hunter safety courses. The courses were held at the Community Center.
- <u>Wetlands Paddle</u> -Parks and Recreation partnered with James River National Wildlife Refuge for a self guided tour on April 23, 2021 on the James River with a canoe or kayak. There were (14) participants.



Special Projects

- <u>Eagle Scout Project at Scott Park</u> Eagle Scout Thomas Carden removed the existing flag pole at the Scott Park Pavilion in June 2021. He installed three new flag poles and encased them in stamped concrete.
- <u>Eagle Scout Project at Temple Park</u> Eagle Scout Gabriel Jenkins cleared and cut back trails and repaired the wooden walkway at Temple Park.



Special Events

- <u>Zumba For Heart</u> Parks and Recreation hosts Zumba for Heart yearly during February at the Community Center. There is a \$5 donation to participate, with donations and proceeds going to the American Heart Association. However, this year was cancelled due to Covid-19.
- <u>Appomattox River Regional Park 5K Trail Run</u> -Parks and Recreation, Riverside Regional Jail, and FOLAR hosted the 5th Annual Appomattox River Regional Park 5K Trail Run on April 17, 2021. There were (155) registrants. Proceeds of \$1754.25 went to FOLAR and \$1875.25 went to Special Olympics.
- <u>Skalsky Soccer Tournament</u> Parks and Recreation hosted (18) soccer teams at Scott Park Soccer Venue for the 3rd Annual Jerry Skalsky Memorial Soccer Tournament on September 25-26, 2021. Teams from Prince George, Hopewell, and Dinwiddie participated. Dinwiddie captured all the titles.
- <u>Harvest Festival</u> Parks and Recreation sponsored its 14th annual Harvest Festival on October 23, 2021 at Temple Park from 5:00 PM - 8:00 PM. Approximately 1,000 citizens attended this event for youth up to age 13. There was a haystack ride, hauted forest, blow up moon walk/slide/obstacle course, and free games.

- <u>Zumba Fight Breast Cancer</u> Parks and Recreation hosted Zumba Fight Breast Cancer on October 16, 2021 from 9:30 AM - 11:30 AM at the Community Center. There was a \$5 donation to participate. - <u>Christmas Tree Lighting</u> Parks and Recreation hosted the annual Christmas Tree Lighting beside The Prince George Regional Heritage Center on December 1, 2021. There were featured performances by TRADOC Woodwind Quintet, Art of Rhythm Dance Company Inc, and Prince George High School Choir.
- Christmas Parade Parks and Recreation held the annual Christmas parade on December 4, 2021. The theme was "A Hometown Christmas", The grand marshal was Prince George native Aidan Bryant (finalist for 2021 America's Got Talent competition TV show). There were (54) participants. 




Community Center Gym

Central Wellness Center Gym



Gym Usage


