The Hopewell, Prince George, Surry Drug Court requires participants adhere to a nightly curfew determined by their phase and progress in the program. RCJA recently streamlined the curfew management process allowing for an easier, user-friendly way to complete on-demand or scheduled location check-ins via SCRAM Touchpoint. This technology allows Drug Court staff to receive a GPS point and uses automatic facial authentication for check-ins. Automated alerts are sent to the participant's phone every time a check-in window is open, resulting in increased compliance. Messaging between Drug Court staff and participants is an additional feature offered to manage client communications, all of which can be securely archived and printed for program records.
