


BIKE RODEO

Police and Community Together Program

In 2013, the Prince George County Police Department developed and implemented an exciting and innovative program for our autistic residents - the **Police and Community Together** program, also known as **P.A.C.T.** The Police Department recognizes the need to partner with the families of a special segment of our community in order to provide the highest level of service possible.

The **P.A.C.T.** Program introduces public safety resources from Prince George County to our autistic residents and their families. We want to identify this special segment of our community that has family members under the age of 18 who have been diagnosed with Autism. The Police Department would like to obtain vital information about your loved ones that can be used to locate them if they become lost or inadvertently walk away.

The Prince George County Police Department has partnered with the Prince George County Schools, Department of Social Services, District 19 Community Services Board, Prince George Special Olympics, and the Ft. Lee Exceptional Family Member Program to assist with the **P.A.C.T.** Program.

CHIEF FRANKENSTEIN ANNOUNCES PROMOTIONS

The Prince George County Police Department recently tested for promotions for the positions of Lieutenant and Sergeant. Business Watch Program Expands to More County Businesses

In January 2013, The Prince George County Police Department started a "Business Watch" Program for area businesses designed with focus on Crime Prevention and Business Security. The program's goal is to reduce crime, or the fear of crime, while promoting communication between the area businesses and the Police Department. The "Business Watch" program is a form of Neighborhood Watch and will allow "neighbors" to have an avenue for sharing information as well as understanding/promoting basic crime prevention. This program was started in the area of the Crossings Shopping Center with Ms. Traci Hackley of the Baymont Inn and Suites being the first to register as a member. Since then, over 200 other businesses have signed up as members. "Business Watch" has started to expand to other County businesses along the Temple Avenue corridor with both Crossroads car dealerships and the Work Zone as members.
