ing a helping hand where ever it is needed.



Cooling Assistance

The Prince George Department of Social Services will begin accepting Cooling Assistance <u>commonhelp.virginia.gov</u> or return a completed application signed and dated, Monday-Friday

The Prince George Department of Social Services will begin accepting Cooling Assistance applications from June 15th –August 15th. You may submit an application online at https://italia.gov or return a completed application signed and dated, Monday-Friday 8:30 am-5:00 pm, or by fax to 804 733-2652.
The Cooling Assistance Program provides purchase or repair of cooling equipment/ and or payment for electricity to operate cooling equipment. To be eligible, a household must contain at one vulnerable individual who is 60 or over, disable, or under age 6, be a resident of the locality in which the application is made, have a cooling expense responsibility, and fall within the income eligibility guidelines.

Did you ever wonder how Prince George Social Services performs when compared to their peers? It is easier than ever to find information about our community.

The Virginia Child Protection Accountability System (System) collects and makes available to the public information on the response to reported cases of child abuse and neglect in the Commonwealth. Quarterly reports provide information on the number of referrals received, accepted, investigated, founded and appealed by locality and for the State as a whole.
