 earning. General Registrar training and certification modules have been available
 since last July. All Registrars must complete the certification within 12 months of
 Certification. Allan Richeson, Prince George Registrar has completed this
 requirement.
 - Risk Limiting Audit (RLA) will be conducted by the Elections community. This will be led by the Department of Elections and their consultants from Voting Works.
 The Kick-off will occur on Feb 16 and audit should be completed by March 6.
 - VERIS update an RFP will be distributed by the Department of Elections for acquisition this summer and installation scheduled for July of 2022.
 - VEBA 2021st 1st Electoral Board Boot Camp for all NEW and Reappointed Electoral Board members is scheduled for Feb 6 – this offering will be a combination of Zoom meeting and in person instruction. All EB members and Registrars are invited to attend.

 - Officers of Elections nominations have been received from the Republican Party. the List from the Democratic Party has not yet been received.

The Electoral Board will review the List of nominations and begin the task of assignment of precincts during the next EB meeting on March 9. This process will continue throughout the Election Cycle. The Electoral Board

will work with the members of the Registrar's staff to manage the ongoing work to process and ensure we have EO's for each election.
