

WARNING: Any person who, by use of force or other means, unduly influences an eligible elector to vote in any particular manner or to refrain from voting, or who falsely makes, alters, forges, or counterfeits any mail ballot before or after it has been cast, or who destroys, defaces, mutilates, or tampers with a ballot is subject, upon conviction, to imprisonment, or to a fine, or both. To vote for a named candidate, completely fill in the oval to the left of your choice. Use blue or black ink.



If a race includes a write-in line, you may vote for a write-in candidate by completely filling in the oval to the left of the line and printing the name of an eligible candidate on the line.



To make a correction, draw a bold line through the oval and candidate name marked by mistake, then fill in the oval next to the correct name.

Return only one ballot. If your mail ballot packet contains ballots for both the Democratic and Republican Parties, mark and return only one ballot, and destroy the other. If you mark and return both party ballots, neither will count.
There are two races for Representative to the United States Congress - District 4 on this ballot. You may vote in both races.
