

Acceptable Forms of Identification

The following types of identification are acceptable and must have a Colorado address:

- A valid Colorado driver's license
- A valid identification card issued by the Department of Revenue in accordance with the requirements of Part 3 of Article 2 of Title 42, C.R.S
- A valid U.S. passport
- A valid employee identification card with your photograph issued by any branch, department, agency, or entity of the U.S. government or of this state, or by any county, municipality, board, authority, or other political subdivision of this state
- A valid pilot's license issued by the Federal Aviation Administration or other authorized agency of the USA
- A valid U.S. military identification card with your photograph of eligible elector
- A copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document that shows your name and address. For example:
 - A cable bill or telephone bill
 - Documentation from a public institution of higher education in Colorado containing at least the name, date of birth, and legal residence address of the student elector
 - A paycheck from a government institution or private company
 - A Certificate of Degree of Indian or Alaskan Native blood
- Written correspondence from the county sheriff or his or her designee to the county clerk indicating you are confined in a county jail or detention facility.
- A valid Medicare or Medicaid card issued by the Centers for Medicare/Medicaid Services (formerly the U.S. Health Care Financing Admin)
- A valid certified copy of your U.S. birth certificate issued in the U.S.
- Certified documentation of naturalization
- A valid student identification card with your photograph of the eligible elector issued by an institute of higher education in Colorado, as defined in C.R.S. §23-3.1-102(5)
- A valid veteran identification card with your photograph issued by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Veterans Health Administration with a photograph of the eligible elector
- A valid identification card issued by a federally recognized tribal government certifying your tribal membership
- Verification that you are committed to the Department of Human Services, but eligible to register and vote.
