

2010 DOG PROJECT TEST STUDY GUIDE

JUNIOR, INTERMEDIATE AND SENIORS

- # Always know the parts of the dog taken from the back of your showmanship manual.
- # Know what AKC Group your dog belongs in or in the case of a mixed breed dog, the closest match to the AKC Group. You can find group descriptions and pictures on the internet at www.akc.org/breeds
- # Know at least a few dogs from all seven of the AKC groups (Working, Sporting, Non Sporting, Hound, Herding, Toy, Terrier)
- # Know what shots are needed in your city, county, state. Know if your rabies is a one, two, or three year vaccination and what other shots are needed for your area. (check with your vet)
- # Know about parasites (intermediate & senior),
- # Know your showmanship patterns (found in showmanship blue book). Be able to identify them by sight.
- # What is the average temperature of a dog? (101-102.5 degrees)
- # Know the difference between showing a judge the bite and showing the judge the teeth.
- # Study the definitions in the back of your book. There might be mix and match questions using these descriptions.
- # Read through the gold portion of your age specific book. This gold portion is located on the right hand side of the book.
- # You might be asked questions that you learned in class - example - what foot do you lead off with when you want your dog to stay (right).

JUNIORS - 8-10 years old:

Your test questions will be taken out of the Wiggles and Wags, Dog 1 Book.

INTERMEDIATES 11-13 years old:

Your test questions will be taken out of the Canine Connection, Dog 2 Book.

SENIORS 14 & above:

Your test questions will be taken out of the Leading the Pack, Dog 3 Book.
