

Cluster / Community Mailbox Security

Cluster / Community mailboxes have proven to be vulnerable to thieves. Unfortunately, theft of mail from both individual mailboxes and cluster mailboxes is a problem in neighborhoods all across San Antonio and Shavano Park. Our police constantly patrol our neighborhoods and keep an eye out for suspicious activity at the mailboxes, but the speed in which mailboxes can be accessed makes catching thieves a tall task.

Last month, the City wrote letters to our Texas Legislative Representative and Senator, both of our Texas U.S. Senators, Our U.S. House Representative, the Postmaster General, the Chief Postmaster Inspector, and our San Antonio Postmaster. Our main point in the letter was the construction, design and access to

individual mail slots on community mailboxes are easily broken or accessed using a common key and a significantly upgrade the construction and security of community mail boxes is required.

Unfortunately, residents are left with few actions they can take to minimize risk of their mail theft. I realize these are not necessarily convenient or easy, but here are some tips I've seen published:

- Use the "Hold for PickUp" option when receiving packages (then pick up at local Post Office)
- Check mail soon after the mail delivery
- Deposit mail close to pick up time
- Don't send cash
- Hold mail at the Post Office during extended travels

City Budget

Shavano Park City Council recently passed our annual Fiscal Year budget. Here are a few budget facts:

- General Fund expenditures are budgeted \$5.46M;
- Total expenditures budgeted for all funds is \$7.76M.
- Property tax rate is \$0.287742 / \$100 of valuation no change from last year
- The average Taxable Homestead Value (all homes) is \$714,124
- The City's portion of tax on average taxable homestead value is approximately \$2,065/year
- 42% of residents qualify for the Over 65 Tax Freeze (City taxes do not increase)
- Sales tax revenues are expected to be approximately \$465,000
- Police and Fire account for 65% of the budget
- Capital Replacement funds are saved yearly in advance to fund large cost items
- Total Debt Obligation is \$3.4 M
- The City maintains a AAA Bond Rating

The detailed budget can be located on the City website under the Financial Transparency (big blue button). A more detailed budget summary can be read on pages 1-4 of the budget document.

HALLOWEEN FIRE SAFETY TIPS

- ▶ When choosing a costume, stay away from long trailing fabric. If your child is wearing a mask, make sure the eye holes are large enough so he or she can see out.
- ▶ **Provide children** with flashlights to carry for lighting or glow sticks as part of their costume.

If your children are going to Halloween parties at others' homes, have them look for ways out of the home and plan how they would get out in an emergency.

- ▶ Dried flowers, cornstalks and crepe paper catch fire easily. **Keep all decorations** away from open flames and other heat sources like light bulbs and heaters.
- ▶ Use a battery-operated candle or glow-stick in jack-o-lanterns. If you use a real candle, use extreme caution. Make sure children are watched at all times when candles are lit. When lighting candles inside jack-o-lanterns, use long, fireplace-style matches or a utility lighter. Be sure to place lit pumpkins well away from anything that can burn and far enough out of the way of trick-or-treaters, doorsteps, walkways and yards.
- ▶ **Remember** to keep exits clear of decorations, so nothing blocks escape routes.
- ▶ **Make sure** all smoke alarms in the home are working.
- ▶ Tell children to stay away from open flames including jack-olanterns with candles in them. Be sure they know how to stop, drop and roll if their clothing catches fire. (Have them practice, stopping immediately, dropping to the ground, covering their face with hands, and rolling over and over to put the flames out.)

The City of Shavano Park City Council recently adopted the following ordinances:

Adopted Ordinances Not Yet Codified

The listing below includes all legislation received by Municipal Code since the last update (printed or electronic) to the Code of Ordinances. This legislation has been enacted, but has not yet been codified.

O-2019-007 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 6-165. – WATER SERVICE AND CHAPTER 34- UTILITIES, ARTICLE II. – WATER, DIVISION 1 OF THE CITY OF SHAVANO PARK CODE OF ORDINANCES TO PROVIDE FOR DEFINITIONS, BACKFLOW PREVENTION DEVICE INSTALLATION, TESTING AND MAINTENANCE, DESIGNATION OF A PROGRAM COORDINATOR AND ENFORCEMENT; PROVIDING A CUMULATIVE & CONFLICTS CLAUSE, PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

PASSED AND APPROVED on the first reading by the City Council of the City of Shavano Park this the 22nd day of July, 2019.

PASSED AND APPROVED on the second reading by the City Council of the City of Shavano Park this the 26th day of August, 2019.

O-2019-008 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 36-39. OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES TO REMOVE CERTAIN COVERED PARKING CONSTRUCTION REQUIREMENTS; PROVIDING A CUMULATIVE & CONFLICTS CLAUSE, PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance shall be effective upon passage and publication as required by State and Local law.
