Theft– On Friday evening, May 5th at approximately 7:30 p.m., an officer was dispatched to a business in the 4500 block of Lockhill-Selma for a theft report. The complainant indicated as they departed the location at the end of the workday, they started their vehicle and the exhaust was extremely loud. The complainant related upon looking underneath their car, the catalytic convertor had been cut off the vehicle while parked at the business. Building surveillance video was obtained showing the suspect vehicle in the incident. This case referred to criminal investigations.

Theft – On Monday morning, May 8th, shortly after midnight, an officer was dispatched to a local business in the 4100 block of N Loop 1604 W for a theft report. The complainant related two subjects entered the business and stole a large quantity of ‘vape pens’ from the location without paying for the items. This case referred to criminal investigations.

Forgery – On Tuesday morning, May 9th, at approximately 10:30 a.m., an officer was dispatched to a local business in the 4300 block of Lockhill-Selma for a forgery report. The complainant indicated last summer, a check was issued and mailed to a vender. The complainant indicated a couple months later, the vender sent a past due notice to the complainant for the outstanding balance. The complainant related upon researching the issued check, they discovered the check had been cashed by an unknown party with a local address that was not associated with the vender. The complainant indicated they had filed a fraud claim with their financial institution in January, however it wasn’t until recently, their financial institution directed the complainant to file a police report to document the incident.
