Fraudulent Use of ID Information – On Thursday morning, May 11th, at approximately 11:30 a.m, an officer was dispatched to an area residence on Fawn Drive for a fraud report. The complainant indicated they had received a bill from Verizon for the purchase of a new phone. The complainant related they had never conducted this transaction and do not have a Verizon account. The complainant related they had reported the fraud to Verizon and was told to obtain a police report to dispute the charges. This case referred to criminal investigations.

Driving While Intoxicated– On Sunday evening, May 14th at approximately 3:00 a.m., officers were on a traffic stop in the 15900 block of NW Military Highway, when a vehicle approached the officers traveling in the opposite direction, in the center turn lane, at a high rate of speed. One officer on scene at the traffic stop, returned to their patrol car and was able to initiate a traffic stop on the vehicle observed driving erratically. Upon contact with the driver of the vehicle, the driver displayed signs of intoxication and failed field sobriety testing. The driver was placed into custody for suspicion of DWI and taken to a facility for a test of their breath. The results of the test, indicated a level of intoxication over the legal allowable limit of .08%. The driver was then transported to the Bexar County Detention Center and booked on a criminal charge of DWI.

Theft of Mail – On Thursday evening, May 17th, at approximately 8:00 p.m., an officer was dispatched to the area of the 400 block of Cliffside for a report of a suspicious activity relating to possible mail theft. The complainant indicated they observed a red Toyota Camry with paper plates taking mail from their and their neighbors' mailboxes. The complainant related they followed the vehicle to gather more information on the vehicle, until the vehicle traveled outside the city onto Loop 1604 where they lost sight.
