**Forgery** – On Friday morning, August 11<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 12:30 p.m., an officer was dispatched to a location in Napier Park in regards to a check that had been altered and cashed. The complainant related they had been notified by their bank of a suspicious check being passed, which appeared to have been altered. The complainant confirmed the check was not valid and reported the incident to police. This case referred to criminal investigations.

**Evading Arrest w/ Motor Vehicle** – On Saturday morning, August 12<sup>th</sup> at approximately 4:50 a.m., an officer observed a vehicle driving erratically in the 3700 block of DeZavala Road. As the officer attempted to conduct a traffic stop on the vehicle, the vehicle began to speed up and take obvious actions to evade the officer. The vehicle turned southbound onto NW Military Hwy, then made a u-turn and proceeded northbound on NW Military Hwy towards North Loop 1604. As officers attempted to stop the vehicle, the vehicle then began driving down the center turn lane to avoid other vehicles, at a high rate of speed. Due to the driving behavior displayed, the officer terminated the vehicle pursuit. This case referred to criminal investigations.

**Evading Arrest w/ Motor Vehicle** – On Monday morning, August 14<sup>th</sup> at approximately 2:00 a.m., officers were dispatched to a parking lot in the 4500 block of Lockhill Selma Road for a report of two vehicles doing donuts and driving erratically in the area. As officers arrived to the location, they observed the vehicles in question. The two vehicles, then sped out of the parking lot with officers attempting to conduct traffic stops on both vehicles. One vehicle fled northbound in the southbound lanes of Lockhill Selma road. An officer attempted to stop the vehicle, but lost sight of them as they approached North Loop 1604. The second vehicle fled southbound on Lockhill Selma and was pursued by a second officer. The driver of the second vehicle increased speed and began driving through red lights. The second officer discontinued pursuit of the vehicle due to the driving behavior, but was able to visually observe the driver and obtain a license plate number of the vehicle.

The same day of the incident, investigators were able to identify of the second driver and obtain an arrest warrant. The following day of the incident, investigators were able to locate the second driver as he arrived at his place of employment and take the subject into custody without incident. The vehicle involved in the incident was impounded. The subject involved was transported to the Bexar County Detention Center and criminally charged with Evading Arrest w/ Motor Vehicle (Third Degree Felony). The case remains under investigation as investigators follow leads to identify the driver of the first vehicle involved.
