Possession CS PG 1 – On Saturday morning, August 19th at approximately 12:45 a.m., an officer conducted a traffic stop on a motor vehicle in the 15000 block of NW Military for exceeding the posted speed limit. As the officer approached the vehicle, the driver opened the driver's door and the officer observed a clear plastic baggie containing a white powder, fall onto the door sill plate. The driver was detained and a presumptive test of the white powder tested positive for cocaine. The driver was taken into custody, processed, and transported to the Bexar County Detention Center where the driver was booked for felony Possession of a Controlled Substance Penalty Group 1 >=4g<200g. The substance will be sent off to the Bexar County Crime Lab for testing.

Burglary of Building – On Monday morning, August 21st, at approximately 9:00 a.m., an officer was dispatched to a business location along Paesanos Parkway in regards to the business being burglarized over the weekend. The complainant indicated, when they arrived for work, they observed drawers to a desk that are normally locked to be open and damaged. The complainant indicated a lockbox containing cash and jewelry to be missing. Officers did not find any signs of forced entry to the building. Surveillance video was obtained showing a suspect and suspect vehicle arriving to, entering the business, and committing the crime the day prior. This case referred to criminal investigations.

Burglary of Vehicle – On Monday afternoon, August 21st, at approximately 4:30 p.m., an officer was dispatched to a business location along Paesanos Parkway in regards to a vehicle being burglarized. The complainant indicated they had arrived at the location approximately an hour prior to calling police and upon leaving, they noticed the passenger side window to their vehicle to have been shattered and property left inside and in plain view, to be missing. Officers conducted their investigation and obtained video surveillance footage of the incident. This case referred to criminal investigations.
