Minor in Possession Alcohol/Possession of Drug Paraphernalia – On Friday evening, September 29th at approximately 11:00 p.m., an officer conducting stationary radar enforcement in the 15000 block of NW Military Highway, observed a vehicle traveling 77 mph in a 40-mph speed zone. The officer conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle for exceeding the posted speed limit. As the vehicle was coming to a stop, the officer observed subjects inside the vehicle to throw something out of the vehicle. The officer contacted and detained all four subjects inside the car. During their filed investigation, officers located suspected marijuana as having been thrown from the vehicle, along with alcohol inside of the vehicle. The subjects involved were all under the age of 21 which is the legal age to possess alcohol. The subjects were all cited for the various offenses and released.

Driving While Intoxicated – On Sunday morning, October 1st at approximately 3:45 a.m., officers were dispatched to a business in the 4000 block of N Loop 1604 W for a report of a subject passed out inside of a car. Upon arrival, officers observed the subject in question who was asleep behind the wheel of their vehicle with the engine running. Officers were able to eventually awake the driver who displayed obvious signs of intoxication

and failed Field Sobriety Testing. The subject was taken into custody and transported to a local facility for breath testing. After the subject failed to provide an adequate specimen of their breath, officers transported the subject to the Bexar County Adult Detention Center where they were granted a warrant to obtain a blood sample from the subject. Upon completion of the warrant, custody of the subject was transferred to magistrate personnel and the subject charged with DWI.

Warrant Arrest/Possession Controlled Substance/Possession Drug Paraphernalia – On October 2nd at approximately 5:00 p.m., officers received a phone tip regarding a subject that would be arriving at a local business in the 3400 of Paesanos Parkway; who had several outstanding warrants for their arrest, had been a fugitive from justice for a considerable amount of time, and would flee if they see the police. Officers were able to ascertain the identity of the subject and confirmed the subject had several active warrants. Plain clothe officers then set up surveillance on the location where the subject was to visit and upon their arrival, officers were able to take the subject into custody without incident. During a search of the subject, the subject was in possession of suspect narcotics and narcotic paraphernalia. The subject was then transported to the Bexar County Adult Detention Center and booked on the drug possession charge along with 12 outstanding warrants out of Travis County for:

Warrant Arrest – On Tuesday evening, October 3rd at approximately 7:15 p.m., officers were dispatched to a location in the 4100 block of Pond Hill for a disturbance. Call notes indicated a male subject was running after a barefoot female. Upon arrival to the area, the officer located the subjects involved and discovered the two they were in a dating relationship and arguing over money one owed the other. As the officer checked on both subjects, the officer discovered one of the subjects to have two active warrants for their arrest. The subject was taken into custody and

transported to the Bexar County Adult Detention Center where they were booked on the outstanding warrants for:
