Background:

Staff with the Departments of Public Works and Community Development met on February 16, 2023, with a representative from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources for an audit of the City's Stormwater Management Program. The audit found deficiencies within the City's Stormwater Management Program, Ordinance #5816, concerning the issuance of permits related to Land Disturbance. Currently the City requires a permit be obtained when disturbing one acre or more of land, as does the Missouri Department of Natural Resources. Bill # 6304 will continue to require a Land Disturbance permit for one acre or more, in addition to requiring the Land Disturbance permit for projects that would disturb less than acre if the project is part of a larger common plan or development or sale. The City was directed to amend the ordinance that specifically addresses Land Disturbance permits by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources.

Staff will seek Council's approval of this ordinance at the May 1st meeting.

THIS BILL AS APPROVED SHALL BECOME ORDINANCE NUMBER 6304 AND SHALL AMEND CHAPTER 700, ARTICLE I – STORMWATER MANAGEMENT, OF THE SIKESTON MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF SIKESTON, MISSOURI.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SIKESTON, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I: This Ordinance shall be codified in Chapter 700 of the Sikeston Municipal Code.

SECTION II: Section 700.040. Activities That Require Permit shall be amended to read as follows:

- A. For purposes of this Article, the following activities may potentially alter or disrupt the natural stormwater runoff patterns and as such will require a *Land Disturbance* permit prior to the initiation of any such project.
 - 1. Clearing and/or draining of land as an adjunct to construction;
 - 2. Clearing and/or draining of land for agricultural purposes;
 - 3. Converting agricultural lands to non-agricultural uses;
 - 4. Subdividing land into two (2) or more parcels;
 - 5. Replatting recorded subdivisions and the development of unrecorded subdivisions;
 - 6. Changing the use, arrangement, appearance, intensity or density of structures or land;
 - 7. Altering the shoreline or bank of any surface water body;
 - 8. Any activities which disturb one(1) acre or more of pervious surface, with the exception of farming activities; and Any activities which disturbs greater than or equal to one (1) acre, or less than one acre if the activities are part of a larger common plan or development or sale that would disturb one acre or more, with the exception of farming activities; and
 - 9. Creating and/or increasing pervious surface, either building or parking area, with an area of greater than two thousand (2,000) square feet.

<u>SECTION III</u>: Section 700.070. Construction Site Runoff Control, Subsection A 1 shall be amended to read as follows:

- A. The following provisions shall govern the control of all construction site runoff for all construction projects within the city.
 - 1. Site disturbance permits required. All construction projects which would disturb one (1) acre or more must obtain a land disturbance permit from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources. In addition to the requirements of this Chapter the condition of any land disturbance permit shall be applicable. All construction projects which would disturb greater than or equal to one (1) acre, or less than one acre if the construction project is part of a larger common plan or development or sale that would disturb one acre or more must obtain a Land Disturbance permit from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources, in addition to any land disturbance permit issued by the City.

<u>SECTION IV:</u> General Repealer Section: Any ordinance or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

<u>SECTION V:</u> Severability: Should any part or parts of this ordinance be found or held to be invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, then the remaining part or parts shall be severable and shall continue in full force and effect.

Background:

Bids were opened on March 21, 2023 for street construction projects with consulting engineer, Lambert Engineering. Bids were received from only two bidders: ASA Asphalt Company from Cape Girardeau and Paving Pros from Oak Ridge, MO.

The Base Bid for Bid 23-53 was for milling and resurfacing in the following areas; Stephens St, Euclid Ave, Pine St, Presnell St, and a Front Street alley downtown (between New Madrid St. and Scott St.). It also currently includes the paving of the city owned parking lot just south of the old Collins Music along with the paving of the gravel 'road' along the railroad right-of-way. The low bidder for the base bid was ASA Asphalt Company from Cape Girardeau, MO with a low base bid of \$392,783.34.

In addition to base bid, there were bids on three alternates: Alternate #1 – Paving Stephens in the Sikeston Complex Alternate #2 – The reconstruction of the intersection at N. Kings and Center St. Alternate #3 – The reconstruction of the intersection at N. New Madrid and North St. The low bids for the Alternates were all from ASA Asphalt as shown: Alternate #1: \$68,312.51 Alternate #2: \$109,230.32 Alternate #3: \$177,595.32

Staff is recommending awarding the base bid and alternates #1 and #2 to Asa Asphalt for a combined low bid of \$570,326.17. Funding for this will come from Sikeston Transportation Sales Tax and Economic Development funds through the Essex fund.

Attached is a copy of the bid tabulations on the FY 2023 Street Improvements for Contract 23-53 that was let on March 21, 2023.

As you will note on the attached bid tabulation, ASA Asphalt Company was the low bidder on the FY 2023 Street Improvements - Contract 23-53 for the Base Bid plus Alternates No.1 & No. 2. The Base Bid includes Euclid Street, Presnell Street, Pine Street (between Helen Street and Ables Road) and the alley (between New Madrid Street and Scott Street). Alternate No. 1 includes Stephens Street and Alternate No. 2 includes the intersection of Kingshighway and Center Street. Therefore, we would recommend that ASA Asphalt Company be awarded the contract for the FY 2023 Street Improvements - Contract 23-53 in the amount of \$570,326.17 which includes the Base Bid plus Alternates No. 1 & No. 2.

Background:

Sikeston Department of Public Safety seeks to purchase fire equipment using funds from the Region Homeland Security Oversight Committee Grant.

The first item is for a Paratech Raker system, which is used during structural collapse to help quickly and safely stabilize exterior walls from collapsing causing further traumatic events. This item is only available from buying from Paratech directly or from Banner Fire Equipment who is a Paratech vendor. Sikeston DPS selected Banner Fire Equipment due to them being the cheapest at \$31,590.50. The price for this from Paratech was \$36,000.

The other item we are requesting to buy under this grant is a portable 2-ton portable air conditioning from Global Industrial in the amount of \$4,203.25.

Sikeston DPS would like to select Banner Fire Equipment and Global Industrial as our equipment vendors. The total quote for the equipment is \$35,793.75. Sikeston DPS was awarded \$35,793.75 for Fy-22 RHSOC.



Marsh Wortham provided the attached renewal quotes for the City's Cyber and Multimedia Liability coverages. Both options presented have similar coverages. Option 1 is with Beazley, our current cyber carrier with a premium of \$23,625 and Option 2 is through Travelers, our current Property & Casualty Insurance carrier with a premium of \$20,361.

In 2021 over 2,300 local governments, schools, and healthcare organizations in the United States were affected by ransomware. Ransomware is driving the costs of cyber insurance for municipalities with 97.1% clients receiving a premium increase.

Given the increase in ransomware attacks it is the recommendation of staff to select Option 2 and authorize payment in the amount of \$20,361 to Travelers Insurance for cyber and multimedia insurance for the period of May 1, 2023, through May 1, 2024.

Travelers did increase the windstorm/hail deductible from \$10,000 to \$250,000. Insurers are increasing the deductible across the nation and the \$250,000 is drastically lower than the rest of the insurance market. In no event, however, will the Federal Government be required to pay any portion of the amount of such Insured Losses occurring in a calendar year that in the aggregate exceeds \$100 billion, nor will any Insurer be required to pay any portion of such amount provided that such Insurer has met its Insurer Deductible. Therefore, if such Insured Losses occurring in a calendar year exceed \$100 billion in the aggregate, the amount of any payments by the Federal Government and any coverage provided by this policy for losses caused by Acts Of Terrorism may be reduced.
