Subject: Ordinance Calling for an Election to Allow the sale of Liquor by Drink in Excess of 5%

Background:

Currently cities in Missouri with a population of less than 19,500 cannot sell liquor by drink in excess of 5% without a resort drink license and this requires \$75,000 in food sales. The only exception to this would be a fraternal organization. In recent months staff received inquiries regarding the procedure to permit the sale of liquor by the drink in excess of 5%.

To provide retail opportunities that are equal to cities with a population in excess of 19,500 inhabitants, promote retail growth and equal opportunities for businesses that do not have a liquor license connected with food or other retail sales, Ordinance 6316 presents the City of Sikeston residents the opportunity to determine if they want to allow sale of liquor by the drink greater than 5%. Applicants would still have to meet zoning requirements and follow distance regulations for churches and schools, prior to obtaining their license. Currently the minimum distance is 100 feet unless written permission is given by the church or school.

Ordinance 6316 places this issue on the November 7, 2023 ballot.

THIS BILL, AS ADOPTED AS AN EMERGENCY MEASURE, SHALL BECOME ORDINANCE NUMBER 6316, CALLING FOR AN ELECTION IN THE CITY OF SIKESTON, MISSOURI ON THE QUESTION OF WHETHER TO ALLOW THE SALE OF LIQUOR BY DRINK IN EXCESS OF 5% TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 7, 2023; AND DIRECTING THE CITY CLERK TO GIVE NOTICE OF THE ELECTION.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Sikeston, Missouri, under the authority of Section 311.110 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri has determined upon its own motion that the question herein be submitted to the voters to determine whether or not intoxicating liquor as defined in Chapter 311 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri shall be sold, furnished, or given away within the corporate limits of the City of Sikeston, Missouri; and

WHEREAS, said election is required prior to liquor by the drink being authorized in accordance with Section 311.090 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri; and

WHEREAS, the substantial form of the ballot issue is set forth in Section 311.130 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SIKESTON, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I: This ordinance shall not be codified in the City Municipal Code.

SECTION II: A special election is hereby ordered to be held in the City of Sikeston, Missouri on November 7, 2023 on the following question:

IN ORDER TO PROVIDE RETAIL OPPORTUNITES THAT ARE EQUAL TO CITIES WITH A POPULATION IN EXCESS OF 19,500 INHABITANTS AND IN ORDER TO PROMOTE RETAIL GROWTH AND IN ORDER TO PROVIDE EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR BUSINESSES THAT DO NOT HAVE A LIQUOR LICENSE CONNECTED WITH FOOD OR OTHER RETAIL SALES, SHALL INTOXICATING LIQUOR, CONTAINING ALCOHOL IN EXCESS OF FIVE PERCENT (5%) BY WEIGHT, BE SOLD BY THE DRINK AT RETAIL FOR CONSUMPTION ON THE PREMISES WHERE SOLD?

SECTION III: The form of the Notice of Special Election for said election, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and made a part hereof, is hereby approved.

SECTION IV: That said election be held on the 7th day of November 2023, and that appropriate steps be taken to ensure that said election be held on said day.

SECTION V: Any other ordinances or part(s) thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION VI: Should any other part or parts of this ordinance be found or held to be invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining part or parts shall be severable and shall continue in full force and effect.

SECTION VII: This ordinance is passed as an emergency measure, as it must be forwarded immediately to the appropriate County Clerks for inclusion on the November ballot, in order to meet the requirements of State Election Law, Chapter 115 of the Missouri Revised Statutes.

SECTION VIII: Record of passage:

A. Bill number 6316 was introduced to Council and read the first time this 31st day of July 2023.

B. Bill number 6316 was read the second time and discussed this 31st day of July 2023, and voted as follows:

Contract approval for Flock Camera addition to City-Wide Camera Infrastructure

Background:

The Department of Public Safety would like to enter into a 5-year agreement with Flock Safety to add four Flock cameras to the existing city-wide camera infrastructure. This adds to our existing four Flock Cameras. These cameras have proven to be very useful with investigations and recoveries that may have gone undetected. To date, the existing four cameras have been responsible for the direct recovery of two stolen vehicles and two stolen license plates (totaling approximately \$20,000 in recovered value). The system directly contributed to the locating of a missing person as well as a person with an active felony arrest warrant. Officers successfully used the system to locate a suspect involved in the leaving the scene of an accident incident. With the information received from the Flock system, the officer identified the suspect and cleared the report that resulted in a felony amount of damage to a vehicle. These cameras have only been online since June.

Since the approval of our initial cameras, at least three other local police departments have begun the process of purchasing and installing Flock Safety cameras in their jurisdictions. Once installed, Sikeston DPS will be able to obtain access to the data captured by those cameras and utilize that information for future investigations. Those departments will also get access to all data obtained by our Flock system to assist with their local investigations. The cost quoted is a total of \$60,600 billed annually with the first payment being \$12,600 (this first year includes installation fees). The remaining years will be billed at \$12,000 per year. This amount would be covered by the current DPS camera budget.
