Background:

In accordance with RSMO 67.110, all political subdivisions must establish their 2013 property tax rates by September 1, after a public hearing. After receiving assessed valuation data from both Scott and New Madrid Counties, the State Auditor's Office calculates rates permitted in order to be in compliance with laws pertaining to revenue restrictions established by the Hancock Amendment and those subdivisions with voluntary reduction restrictions.

Due to requirements of the State of Missouri, this is being done as an emergency bill and asks that Council adopt Ordinance #5925.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

A hearing will be held at 11:30 a.m., August 26, 2013 in the City Council Chambers in the City Administration Building, 105 East Center Street, Sikeston, Missouri, at which time citizens may be heard on the property tax rates proposed to be set by the City of Sikeston. The tax rates shall be set to produce the revenues for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013 subject to Article X, Section 22 of the Missouri Constitution. The value of the new construction and improvements is \$3,067,553.00.

AN EMERGENCY BILL, WHICH UPON ADOPTION AND PASSAGE, SHALL BECOME ORDINANCE NUMBER 5925, AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE RATE OF TAXATION ON ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY IN THE CITY OF SIKESTON, MISSOURI, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2013-2014.

WHEREAS, the Sikeston City Council held a public hearing in accordance with Section 67.110 RSMO prior to the adoption of the City's 2013-2014 Tax Rate.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Sikeston, Missouri, as follows:

Section 1. This ordinance will not be codified in the Municipal Code Book of the City of Sikeston.

<u>Section II.</u> That for the purpose of maintaining a general fund, there is hereby levied a tax rate of forty and four one-hundredth cents (\$.4004) per one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation on all taxable property in the City of Sikeston, Missouri, for the year 2013-2014.

<u>Section III.</u> That for the purpose of maintaining a public library fund, there is hereby levied a tax rate of seventeen and forty five one-hundredth cents (\$.1745) per one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation on all taxable property in the City of Sikeston, Missouri, for the year 2013-2014.

<u>Section IV.</u> That for the purpose of maintaining public parks, there is hereby levied a tax rate of seventeen and forty five one-hundredth cents (\$.1745) per one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation on all taxable property in the City of Sikeston, Missouri, for the year 2013-2014.

<u>Section V.</u> General Repealer: Any other ordinance or parts thereof inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

<u>Section VI.</u> Severability: Should any part or parts of this Ordinance be found or held to be invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining part or parts shall be severable and shall continue in full force and effect.

<u>Section VII</u>. Emergency Clause: Due to requirements of the State of Missouri, this ordinance will become effective upon its passage.







CHAPTER 90. SALE OF SURPLUS PROPERTY (CITY OWNED)

Article 05. Generally

The City of Sikeston, during its normal course of operations, accumulates property that can no longer be used. Good business practice dictates that surplus property should be disposed of on a regular basis. The Missouri Constitution mandates that no City property may be given away or given away for less than its value. Using these parameters the following policy has been established for the disposal of surplus City property.

Article 10. Authorization Required

A list of property that has initially been determined to be surplus shall be presented to the City Council, and the Council shall pass a resolution directing the sale of same at public auction or by sealed bid.

Article 20. Public Notice

A list of authorized surplus property shall be published in the local newspaper. This advertisement or notice shall include:

- 1) A listing of the property to be sold along with brief description of the property;
- 2) The location, time, and date of where this property may be viewed;
- 3) Terms and conditions of the sale;
- 4) The date, time and location of where sealed bids will be accepted or in the case of an auction, the date, time and location of the auction.

Article 30. Sale of Surplus Property

- a) Surplus property will be sold to the highest bidder, via sealed bid or by public auction. Should the highest bid be below the market value of the property being offered, the City may reject all bids and retain ownership of the property.
- b) The proceeds from the sale of City owned surplus property shall be deposited to the Capital Improvement Fund.

Article 40. Amendment of City Property Records

All documents (receipts, titles, deeds or bills of sale) pertaining to the sale or disposal of City property shall be forwarded to the City Clerk. The City Clerk or his designee will amend the City property files to accurately record the disposal of said property.



The Animal Health Center will be responsible of the removal from the premises and relocating incinerator to private farm in Scott County. All expenses of moving will be paid by the Animal Health Center and liability will be solely on said corporation.

The Animal Health Center will be responsible for gaining the necessary permits from the DNR to operate the incinerator at a new location in compliance with the State of Missouri.

The Animal Health Center will continue to provide cremation services for the City of Sikeston and Sikeston Area Humane Society at a rate of \$100 per 450 pound burn. The AHC will provide a freezer for storage and arrange pickup of carcasses on a timely basis. The rate of \$100 per burn will remain in effect for a minimum of three years.

The Animal Health Center will continue to provide euthanasia services for the City of Sikeston and Sikeston Area Humane Society at \$1 per cc of euthanasia used on each animal.

The Animal Health Center is submitting a bid of \$10,000 for the incinerator listed as surplus property by the City of Sikeston. My hope is that the money will be donated to the Sikeston Area Humane Society, if the City of Sikeston so chooses.
