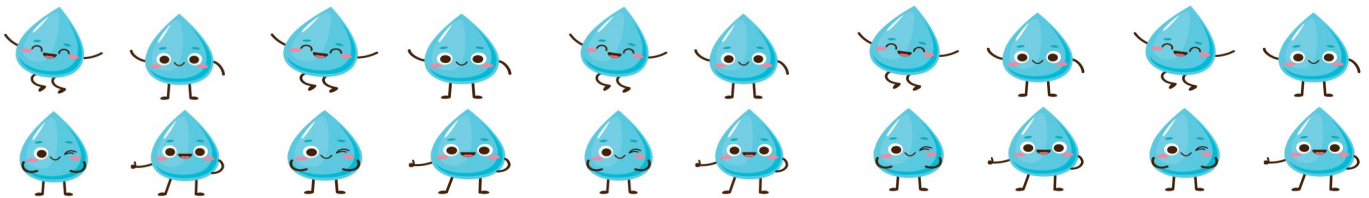

located next to the Village Hall entrance.**

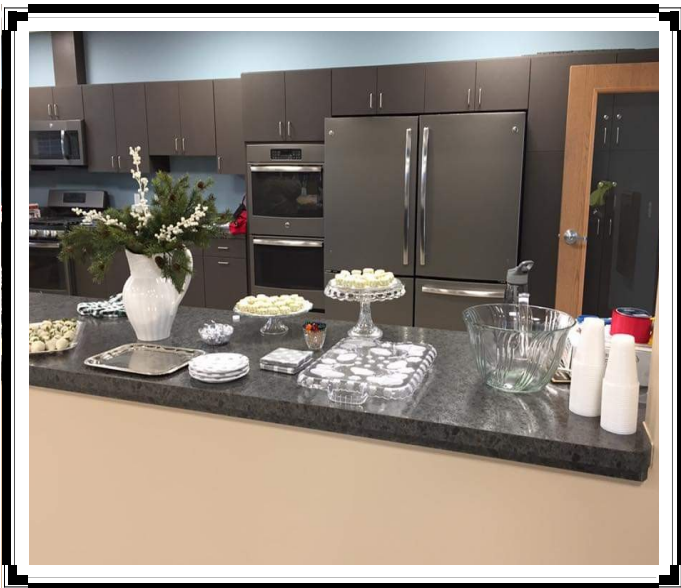

2024 Village Taxes

Taxes are payable from July 1, 2024 thru Sept. 16, 2024.

- You may pay your taxes at the Village of South Rockwood Hall or at First Merchants Bank in Flat Rock (28417 N. Telegraph Rd).
- If you would like to make a partial payment, it can only be done at the Village Hall.
- If you received a Village Tax Statement that says ***Copy for your Records***, this means that your taxes are paid by your mortgage company.
- ***Pink copies*** are the original tax bill to be paid by the home owner or business.

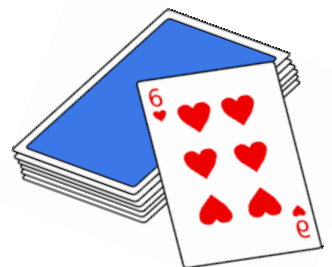

Firework Ordinance

- Consumer Fireworks are defined as: Firework devices that are designed to produce visible effects by combustion, that are required to comply with the construction, chemical composition, and labeling regulations promulgated by the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission under 16 CFR parts 1500 and 1507, and that are listed in APA Standard 87-1,3.1.2,3.1.3, or 3.5. "Consumer Fireworks" does not include low impact fireworks.
- It shall be unlawful for any person to ignite or discharge except for the use of consumer fireworks on the day preceding, the day of, or the day after the following holidays in accordance with the listed prohibited hours of use.
- Prohibited hours of use: Independence Day, July 4th, 12:00 Midnight-8:00am. Labor Day, first Monday of September, 12:00 Midnight-8:00am.
- No person shall ignite, discharge or use consumer fireworks on public property, school property, church property or another person property without that organization's or person's express permission to use consumer fireworks on those premises.
- Consumer fireworks shall not be ignited, discharged or used by a person under the influence of alcoholic liquor or controlled substance or combination of both.

Although it is ok to contact us using the office phone, if there is something happening that needs attention by an officer, **the best and quickest way to get in contact with someone from the Police Department is through Central Dispatch.**

In the case of an emergency always dial 911.

The Monroe County Central Dispatch center is always in constant radio contact with our on duty officer.

734-243-7070 is the number you should call if you need a police officer sent to your house for non-emergency services.

Please make note of this number so that you may better activate and utilize the services that your Police Department provides.

POLICE DEPARTMENT NEWS

We here at the Village of South Rockwood Police Department wish to introduce our newest Ordinance Officer, Officer Hernandez. Officer Hernandez comes to us from Taylor Police Department. If you have any questions or would like to talk to Officer Hernandez, please get a hold of him at the Police Department.

During the summer, please keep in mind that the Village Ordinances are being enforced. Various complaints come in about the height of someone's grass:

Sec. 10-102 states:

“It shall be the duty of every person who owns or occupies lands within the village, to cut to a height not to exceed six inches and destroy from said lands all such weeds and/or grass growing within 200 feet of the road right-of-way.”

A 10-day warning will be issued to owners of said property, at which time after the 10 days, the village will cut the said property and will be at the owner's expense.

Blight is also a Village Ordinance that will be being enforced.

- A.Storage or parking of trucks and trailers longer than 48 hours.
- B.Inoperative motor vehicles.
- C.Modified vehicles.
- D.Repairing or dismantling vehicles.
- E.Building materials.
- F. Litter, junk and garbage.

*These are only a few of the Blight Enforcement Sections.

Summer Driving Tips:

According to the recent Department of Transportation data, summer, not winter, as many might expect is the most dangerous driving season. To help prepare for this summer driving season, here are a few tips to ensure that your next road trip is a safe one.

Check your tires to stay safe and save money. Well-maintained tires provide protection against avoidable breakdowns and crashes, improved vehicle handling, better fuel economy, and increased tire life.

Manage glare and heat. Keep sunglasses handy and use a sun shield beneath your windshield when parked to keep your interior heat down. Never leave a child or a pet unattended in a vehicle. The summer sun can also dehydrate you during long road trips so always travel with plenty of water.

Summer storms and even sun showers require extreme caution. Roads become very slippery in the first few minutes of rainfall because the rain mixes with the oil and dirt on the road. It takes about 30 minutes of steady rain to wash the oil and dirt off the road.

Texting and driving. If you're texting while driving, your chances of being in a serious car or truck accident increases 23 fold. The Michigan texting while driving law prohibits reading, typing, or sending text messages using wireless two-way communication device in a persons hand or lap while driving a car.

Under Michigan Law, Texting while driving is classified as a primary offense. This means that you can be pulled over and ticketed based on a TEXT MESSAGING OFFENSE ALONE.

SIMPLE SUMMER RECIPE'S TO BEAT THE HEAT

Best Classic Potato Salad

Ingredients

- 3lb Yukon Gold potatoes, cut into 1/2" pieces
- 1 small red onion
- 1 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 1/4 cup chipped dill pickles
- 1 Tbsp Dijon mustard
- 1 Tbsp fresh lemon juice
- 1/2 tsp paprika
- 4 hard boiled eggs, chopped
- 1/4 cup thinly sliced chives
- Freshly ground black pepper



Directions

- In a large pot, cover potatoes with water; generously season with salt. Bring water to a boil and cook until potatoes are easily pierced with a knife, 12 to 15 minutes. Drain and let cool slightly.
- In a large bowl, mix onion, mayonnaise, pickles, mustard, lemon juice and paprika until well combined. Fold in potatoes, eggs and chives; season with salt and pepper. Refrigerate until ready to serve.

Watermelon Caprese Salad

Ingredients

- 1 small watermelon, sliced
- 1 mozzarella ball, sliced
- 2 Tbsp sliced fresh basil
- Flaky sea salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- Extra-virgin olive oil
- Balsamic Glaze



Directions

- Slice watermelon into 1/2" thick squares, about 3" x 3". Slice mozzarella into 1/2" slices.
- On serving dish, alternate slices of mozzarella and watermelon. Sprinkle with basil, flaky sea salt and pepper. Drizzle with olive oil and balsamic vinegar.

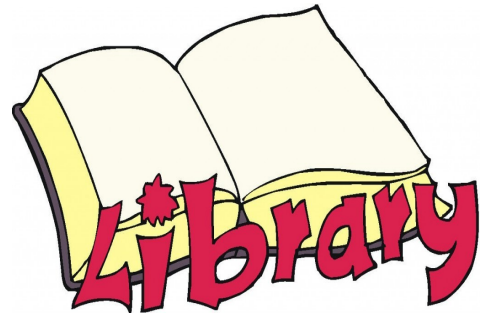

Water/Sewer Unit Charges 2024 / 2025

Water Usage (WA) rate \$4.14 per 1000 gallons.

This rate is used to pay the City of Detroit for the water purchased.

Water Debt Service (WD) \$10.71 flat fee per month per residential equivalency unit.

This fee pays for the Michigan Drinking Water Revolving Fund Bond Principle and interest payments.

Water Maintenance (WM) \$18.04 flat fee per month per residential equivalency unit.

This fee covers all other expenses of the water fund which include the following:

Payroll for reading meters, preparing utility bills and posting payments; the water departments share of utilities, legal and engineering fees; water main break repairs; purchase and installation of meters, hydrants and valves; hydrant flushing, valve turning and all other required maintenance. It also covers the cost of training and certification for the employees as required by the Michigan Department Environmental Quality.

Sewer Usage (SW) rate \$6.36 per 1000 gallons.

This usage pays for the processing of the sanitary sewage, downspouts, sump pump or other groundwater diverted into the sanitary sewer.

Sewer Debt (SD) \$21.08 flat fee per month per residential equivalency unit.

This fee pays for several bond principles and interest payments each year. The State of Michigan has required several improvements to the sewer processing plant. These improvements were paid for by the sale of bonds.

Sewer Maintenance (SC) \$17.95 flat fee per month per residential equivalency unit.

This fee covers all other maintenance cost of the village's sewers which include the following; any upgrades to the sewer mains; contractual services with the Monroe County Drain Commission to operate and maintain the three pump stations and to flush and remove clogs from the sewer mains. It also covers Sewer Funds share of utilities, engineering, legal fees, payroll and payment collections.

Rubbish (RU) \$13.43 flat fee per month per residential equivalency unit.

Monthly total \$81.21 (Revised 8/8/24)

Addendum to 2023 CCR Report included in April Newsletter

Great Lakes Water Authority (GLWA) is required to notify water users of any unresolved significant deficiencies identified by the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy, Drinking Water and Environment Health Division (EGLE). Below is the status of significant deficiencies in the GLWA water system identified by EGLE:

How to grow a green lawn while protecting waters

Keep fertilizer and lawn clippings on the lawn

Sweep or blow fertilizer and grass clippings back onto the lawn and not into the street to prevent them from getting into the storm drains and ditches , which can cause algae problems. Don't dump lawn clippings into drains or ditches.

Mow high and leave clippings

Set your mower deck high (Three inches) to establish strong, healthy roots and shade out weeds. Leave clippings on your lawn to return nutrients to the soil.

Hire a knowledgeable contractor

Check out Michigan Green Industry Association endorsed companies for the Healthy Lawn Care Program for Watershed Protection at www.landscape.org

Create fertilizer-free zones

Keep a 15ft buffer along waterfronts in your yard by not fertilizing or just letting the grass grow. A buffer helps keep grass clippings and fertilizer from getting into the water and causing algae problems. A buffer can also help discourage geese.

Keep Your Ditches Cut

The upkeep of your ditch is your responsibility.

Section 8.303: Property Between Lot Line and Street Edge

The area between the lot line or sidewalk and the edge of a street shall be maintained with grass or other suitable groundcover.

Property owners shall be responsible for the condition, cleanliness and maintenance of the areas within the right-of-way in front of their lot between their lot lines

Keep Your Grass Cut

It is the land owners responsibility to keep their grass under 6" in length

Section 10-102: Duty to Remove

It shall be the duty of every person who owns or occupies land within the Village to cut to a height **not to exceed six inches** and **destroy from said lands all such weeds and/or grass growing within 200 feet of the road right-of-way.**

Yard Waste

Grass clippings & leaves will be picked up every Monday.
They need to be in a green mesh or biodegradable bag.

**Brush is picked up on the
2nd and 4th Monday of the month.**

Burning Brush at the Village Hall:

Please note that the gate to burn
brush in the back of the Village Hall
closes at 2:45pm, Monday-Thursday.

***No treated lumber
No plastic garbage bags***

ONLY grass, weeds and brush allowed!

RUBBISH PICKUP

Remember to place trash and recycle out by the road by 6:00am, as recycle collection is very early.

Make sure ALL your garbage is placed IN A BAG.

This prevents loose garbage from falling onto the roadway and into our yards when the garbage company dumps the cans.

In the event that your garbage falls on the ground, please pick it up and bag it so we can keep our community clean.

Please remember that Ord-35,102 Section 2. states that:

- Rubbish containers shall be placed at the curb **NO EARLIER THAN 5:00PM** on the day before collection day.
- All containers must be taken in **BEFORE 8:00PM** on the day of collection and placed out of general view.
This includes recycle totes.

This includes recycle totes. Totes & trash cans damaged by traffic will be replaced at the expense of the homeowner.

Water Meters

**Please trim or remove any bushes, shrubbery, etc.
from around the outside water meters.**

Section 38-71 of the Village Code of Ordinances states: Owners and occupants are prohibited from obstructing meters or to do anything that interferes with the reading of water meters.
