Recycling Yard Waste

Leaves and brush are picked up only on the 2nd and 4th Mondays. Have your yard waste out by 8:00am. We will only travel the road once. Please have cut ends of branches facing the road edge for easier

disposal. No thorns or poison ivy/oak. Do not put dirt in bags. Any bag over 50 lbs. will be left behind. No plastic garbage bags.

Rubbish Pickup

◆ Place trash & recycle at the road by 6:00 a.m. as recycle collection is very early.

Please remember that Ord-35,102 Section 2. states that rubbish containers shall be placed at the curb no earlier than 5:00 p.m. of the day preceding the collection day and all containers must be taken in prior to 8:00 p.m. on the day of collection and placed out of general view. Snow Removal

Seniors and/or disabled residents may be eligible for snow removal services. You must be 65 years and/or disabled and have no additional persons residing with you that are able to shovel snow. You must provide a doctor's slip confirming disability. If you have any questions please feel free to contact the Village Hall. If you have been on the snow removal list in the past, applications will be going out soon. Make sure you completely fill out the 2 forms: the application and the waiver (be sure to sign the waiver) we will need both copies returned to us.

Snow Plowing/Mailboxes

If you can shake your mailbox, it probably needs maintenance. More often than not, damage to mailboxes is caused by snow pushing against weakened posts or hardware. Flying snow makes it look like snow plow trucks are traveling much faster than they are, but the average speed is about 25 m.p.h. Even at this speed, the force of the snow being pushed off the road can damage mailboxes or other roadside items. Take time now to make any repairs needed so your mailbox will be strong enough to survive the winter.

Snow Emergencies

If there are four or more inches of snow, cars are not allowed to park in the road right-of-way. Vehicles parked in the right-of-way during a snow emergency will be towed. To confirm that a snow emergency is in effect, listen to WJR or WWJ. We ask that property owners use caution when plowing or removing snow from your driveways. **PUSHING SNOW INTO THE STREET IS A**VIOLATION OF LAW Section 257.677A (4) of the Michigan Penal Code and Motor Vehicle Law states "A person shall not deposit, or cause to be deposited, snow, ice, or slush on any roadway or highway."

Lawn Care Tips for Fertilizing

Late fall fertilizing is a crucial last step in lawn care. Sometime in November when the grass stops growing or slows down to the point of not needing to be mowed.

Fall fertilization builds strong roots by taking in the nutrients before the turf goes dormant for the winter. Do not spread fertilizer or weed and feed products on frozen ground.

Make sure to keep your fertilizer on the lawn. If you do get it on the pavement, sweep it back onto the lawn.

Keep a distance between fertilizer and areas such as rivers and storm drains. This protects these areas from fertilizers going into rivers and lakes which causes algae to grow, which uses oxygen that fish need.

Keeping Kids Safe on Halloween

- · Always trick or treat with an adult.
- Only trick or treat in familiar areas that are well lit.
- Cross streets at corners.
- Make eye contact with drivers and watch for cars that are turning or backing up.
- Walk on sidewalks or paths, if there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible.
- Wear light-colored, flame retardant costumes decorated with
- reflective tape or stickers.
- Wear well fitting, sturdy shoes to prevent trips and falls.
- · Carry a flashlight or glow stick to increase visibility to drivers.
- · Wear face paint and makeup, a mask can restrict a child's vision.

Drive Safely on Halloween

- Drive more slowly and anticipate heavy pedestrian traffic.
- Be sure to drive with your headlights on so you can spot children.
- Take time to actively look for kids at intersections and on sides of roads.
- Remember costumes can limit children's visibility and they may not be able to see your vehicle.
- Enter and exit driveways slowly and carefully.
- Remember children are excited on this night and may move in unpredictable ways.


