COMMITMENT: to our community, our families, ourselves and each other.

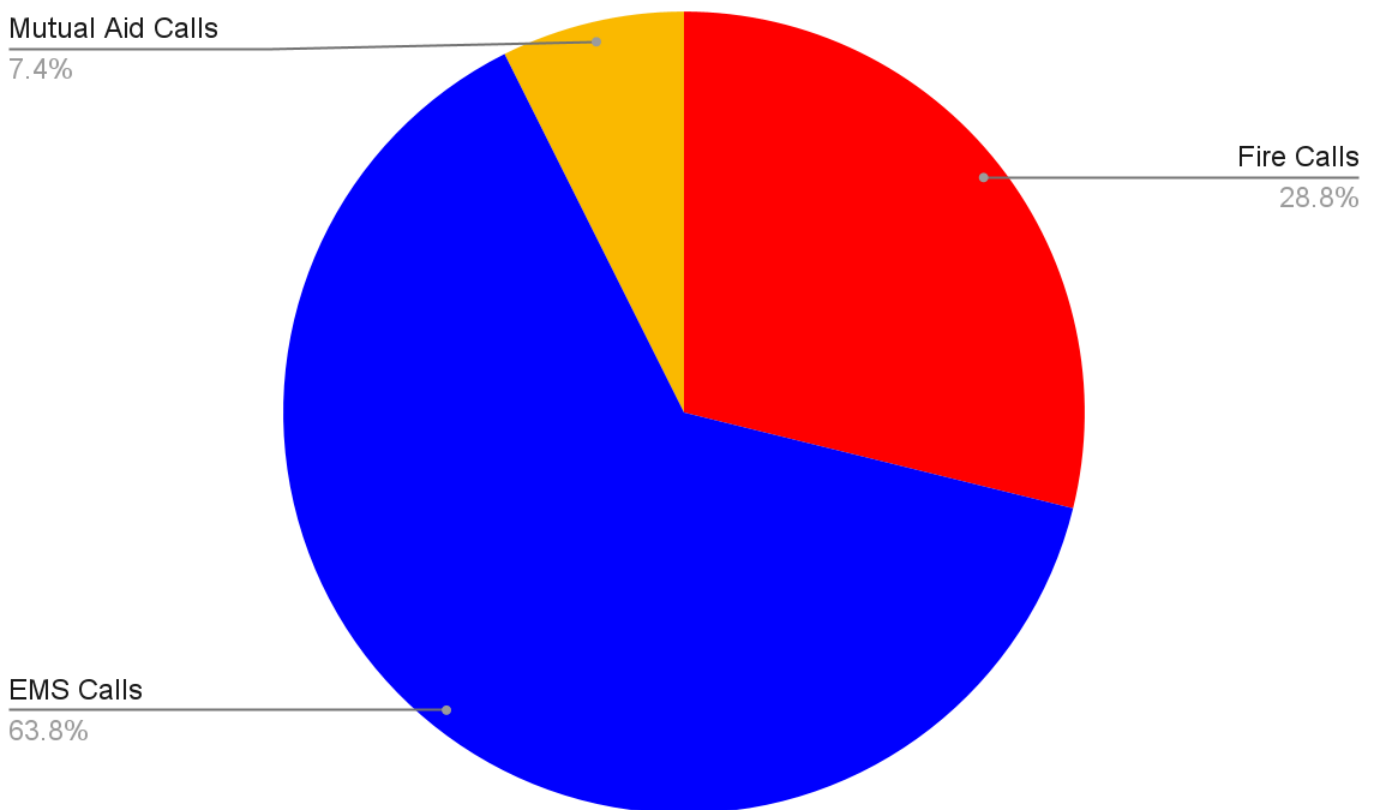

Message from Chief Bertler

As the Chief of the Suamico Fire Department, it is my pleasure to present to you our annual report for 2024. The Suamico Fire Department (SFD) strives to provide nothing less than outstanding Fire, Rescue and EMS Services to the residents of the Village of Suamico. As we closed out our 72nd year in 2024, I want to take a moment to look back and reflect on a few of the milestones and achievements we experienced.

Call Summary

The Suamico Fire Department responded to 695 calls for service in 2024, significantly up from a department high of 569 calls in 2023. Here is a brief summary of our call activity for 2024:



Community Relationships & Programs

We continue to nurture current relationships and programs while building new ones within the community to better serve the Village of Suamico.

Here are some highlights from 2024:

- Bay Port High School Youth Apprenticeship Program.
- Bay Port High School Summer Internship Program.
- Annual life safety inspection program for schools & businesses.
- Fire Extinguisher training for businesses and residents.
- Public Education program in our schools with the students.
- Car Seat Installations with Center for Childhood Safety.

New Rescue Equipment to Enhance Our Services

In 2024, Suamico Fire Rescue was able enhance our technical rescue abilities through the purchase of several specialized tools:

Drone 1211

In late 2023, the Suamico Firefighters Volunteer Association launched a fundraising campaign and successfully raised \$12,000 to purchase and donate a drone to Suamico Fire Department. The state-of-the art drone arrived in early 2024 and is optimized for public safety and is equipped with advanced optical and infrared/thermal imaging cameras. This drone will help Suamico Fire Rescue with fireground situational awareness (structural, wildland and HAZMAT), post-incident fire investigation and analysis, search and



rescue (missing persons, ice/water, natural disasters), and pre-incident planning.

Marine 1211

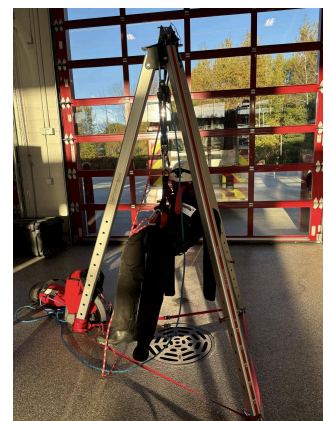


The Village of Suamico includes approximately six miles of Green Bay shoreline, including Long Tail Beach and Little Tail Point. Although the Brown County Sheriff's Department has jurisdiction on the Bay, the Suamico Fire Department is often called upon to assist in rescues off the west shoreline. On May

6th of 2024, SFD Station 1 took delivery of Marine 1211 - a 26 foot state-of-the art rescue boat designed specifically for use on the Bay. The boat was purchased using private donations from a generous local donor and includes Garmin GPSMAP Touchscreens and Radar, as well as a FLIR (Forward Looking Infrared) Camera that was also donated by the Suamico Firefighters Volunteer Association.

Confined Space Rescue Gear

Suamico Fire Rescue received a Capital Credit Union's Elevate Communities Grant for confined space rescue equipment in 2023. This equipment was purchased in 2024 and is used to safely rescue individuals trapped or incapacitated in confined spaces, such as tanks, silos, sewers or tunnels, which often have limited access and hazardous conditions like toxic gases or low oxygen.

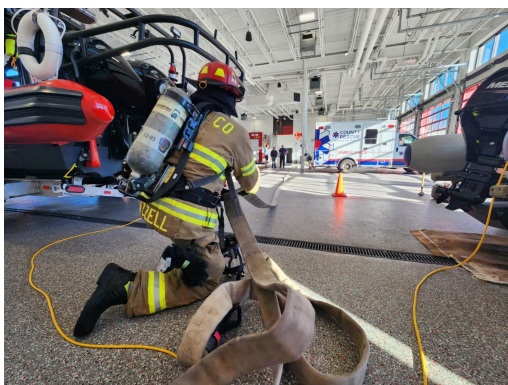


Physical Fitness & Agility

In The News

In 2024, The Suamico Fire Department received extensive news coverage across various social and mainstream media channels. Here are a few highlights:

Winter Structure Fires

2024 began with urgency for the department, as firefighters responded to two significant structure fires in the early months, reinforcing our commitment to rapid response and community safety. These incidents highlighted the dedication and skill of our personnel, who worked tirelessly to contain the blazes and prevent further damage.



Marine 1211 Making Waves

The Suamico Fire Department significantly enhanced its water rescue capabilities with the addition of a 26-foot rigid inflatable boat (RIB) from Ocean Craft Marine. This state-of-the-art vessel was purchased using private donations and features dual 150-horsepower engines, a comprehensive navigation system, and a thermal imaging camera.



Women of Suamico Fire Rescue

SFD continues to outpace The US Fire Administration's nationwide average of 9% of all firefighters being women. We had several opportunities this year to celebrate our Women Firefighters that serve the Village of Suamico!



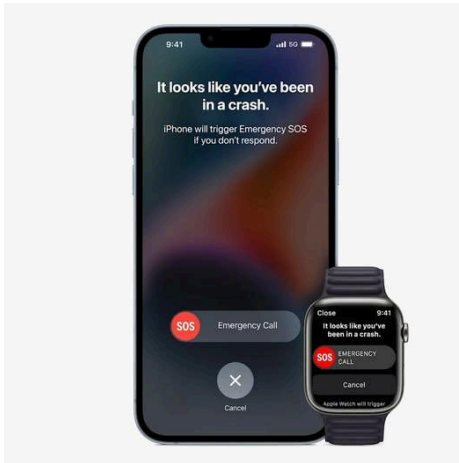
Missing Persons Searches

Suamico Firefighters helped with several missing persons searches throughout the year, starting with Elijah Vue in March.



In July, Marine 1211 assisted in the search for an 18-foot Gulf Coast Sailboat named “My Lady Blue” that was reported missing after a Little Suamico father and his two young children didn’t show up to their destination. Lastly, SFD helped with a Silver Alert in Marinette County, searching for an elderly man that was missing for several days.

Crash Detection Education



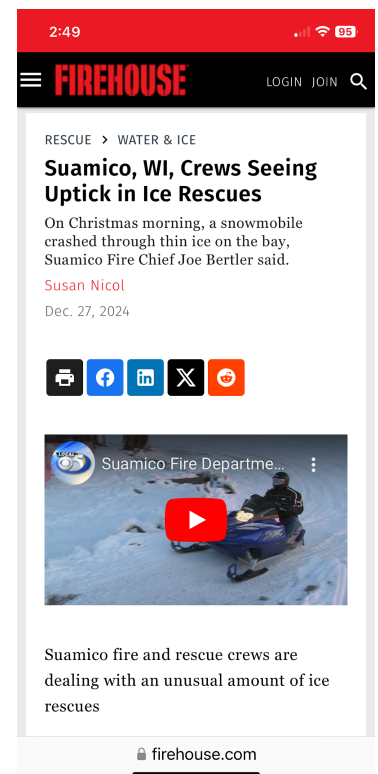
Recent phone and software updates include crash detection, which is designed to detect severe car crashes such as front-impact, side-impact, rear-end collisions, and rollovers and automatically notify 911 dispatchers.

Unfortunately, when a phone is set on a vehicle and forgotten, the device will detect an “accident” when it hits the pavement and

automatically contact 911. SFD was dispatched to numerous “accidents” in 2024 only to find a phone laying on the road. This was an opportunity for us to educate our community with a Facebook post that reached 47,500 individuals, was viewed 102,376 times, shared 157 times, and was picked up by three local news stations.

Early Season Ice Rescues

In late 2024, the Suamico Fire Department responded to several ice-related incidents, highlighting the dangers of early-season ice and the importance of exercising extreme caution when venturing onto frozen bodies of water. In early December, an 87-year-old man from De Pere tragically lost his life after falling through the ice while fishing alone on the bay. On Christmas morning, two individuals riding a snowmobile fell through thin ice on the Bay of Green Bay, approximately 200 yards from shore; they managed to self-rescue, but their snowmobile remained submerged in about 12 feet of water.

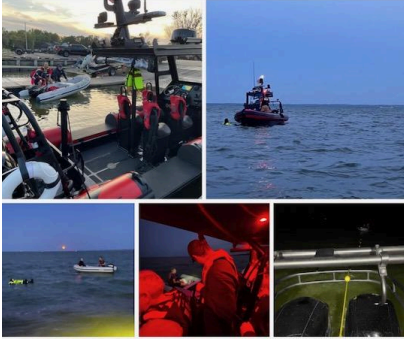

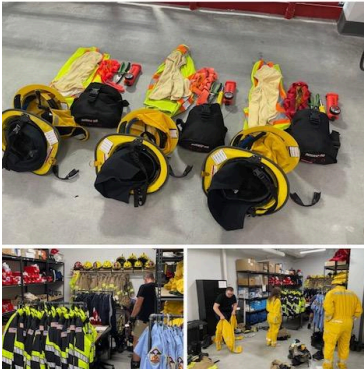

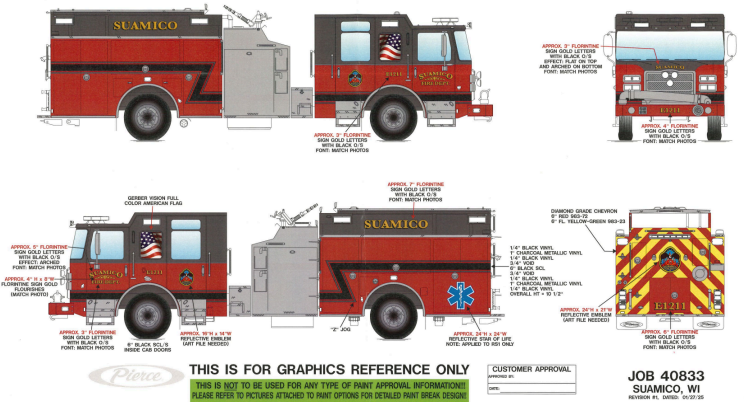
New Chief 1201 Command Vehicle



Chief 1201 received an upgraded Chevrolet Tahoe Command Vehicle in 2024. The previous command vehicle was moved to Station 2 and is currently used as a weekday EMS vehicle and a weekend Duty Chief vehicle (pictured).

New E1211 Update

The new Engine 1211 from Pierce Mfg. is on-track to be delivered in November of 2025! Pre-build meetings between Pierce project managers and SFD leadership in January of 2025 finalized all the line-item details.



Tender Refurbish Update



The Village of Suamico approved the refurbishment of both Tender 1211 and Tender 1221 in 2025. Pierce Mfg. will take approx. 3-4 months per tender to repair and upgrade and will stagger the schedule so only one tender is out of service at a time.

Apparatus Repairs

As a Department, we are fortunate to have several crewmembers with knowledge and experience in vehicle repairs, saving SFD thousands of dollars in labor costs with many repairs being completed in-house. Fire Response Summary

EMS Updates

2024 was our third full year as an Emergency First Responder department, resulting in 440 EMS calls, up from 394 calls in 2023 - a 11.7 % increase. Here are some additional details of our EMS activity in 2024:



- Seven of Suamico Fire Department's apparatus are equipped with EMS bags, AEDs, and basic body substance isolation equipment to respond to medical calls. These vehicles are Station 1's Command 1201 Tahoe, Engine 1211, Rescue 1211, Brush 1211, Marine 1211 and Station 2's EMS 1221 and Engine 1221.
- 22 out of 38 members of the Suamico Fire Department are EMS certified and able to provide emergency scene care in the Village of Suamico, 11 of which are equipped with medical "Jump Bags" and 9 of which carry AED's and Glucometers.
- To continue education and maintain proficiency, Suamico Fire conducts EMS training once a month. Our training is led by Dr. Bob Zemple, Emergency and EMS Physician at Aurora BayCare Medical Center, and our Assistant Chief, Chris Gabryszek, who is the Operations Director for County Rescue Services. Training consists of topics needed for recertification per state and National Registry requirements, and other topics associated with requests from within the department's personnel.

Fire Inspections

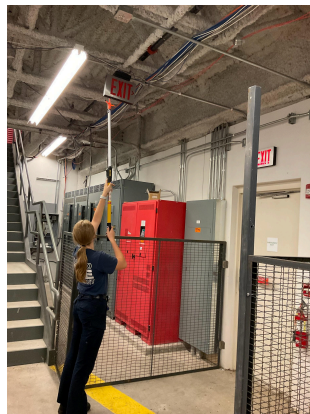
