In a changing world, meeting the challenges and learning to navigate her way through, at times, uncertainty in the work place is just a part of the job for Sutherlin City Recorder and Human Resources Manager, Diane Harris. She states that she is very committed to her job; therefore personally adapting to the necessary changes was not as difficult for her. The City Manager, Jerry Gillham provided the much needed consistent leadership to often traverse unknown territory. The laws and requirements during the pandemic brought on the need to create, update, and amend a countless number of personnel policies and the questions that were presented about those policies were ever changing as well. One of the biggest changes that the pandemic brought was the need to periodically work from home each week and adapting ways to communicate with coworker, Deputy City Recorder, Melanie Masterfield as they continued to complete multiple tasks in an accurate, efficient, and timely manner. It also required the willingness to learn new skills such as hosting and attending virtual meetings to keep the public informed in an inclusive manner.

Diane views the remodel of the offices of Sutherlin City Hall as representing the redefinition of the roles for the city staff. "The city has a responsibility to the public. Our remodel is our way of stepping up to meet the needs of the community during an emergency and or a disaster large or small." As part of a network of city recorders we have a huge support group of city recorders/clerks throughout the state. We all realize that even though we live in different parts of the state and work in different sized cities, we all have similar pressures and expectations put on us."

"At all times the job can be a challenge. There are only so many hours in a day. The established priorities can change each day, even by the hour. It is having a great team of people that are continually working together for the greater good, willing to shift and change their way of thinking so all the balls stay in the air. The bottom line is that we are here for the community and its citizens."





The responsibilities and duties of Melanie Masterfield go far beyond the job title of Deputy City Recorder. In her own words, "it is really hard to compile a list of tasks that the city recorder's office performs. It changes daily and even hourly." Often it is a juggling act keeping the 'to do' lists manageable while constantly reassessing priorities. Working in collaboration with Diane, is the key to establishing an open line of communication with both city staff and the citizens of Sutherlin. At the top of the list of priorities is keeping the community aware of updated and current information with access via social media, the new website, or monthly newsletter.

There is much that entails the job of providing services to the city and it requires the ability to take on multi-level tasking at all times. The list could begin with Records Management although that leads to the myriad of related responsibilities. It involves keeping all city records

both public and private organized and following retention programs. Both jobs for Melanie and Diane interface with multiple entities. They also work extensively with departments within the city, Community Development, Finance, Public Works Facilities and Utilities, Fire Department, Police Department and the C. Giles Hunt Memorial Library. They coordinate with a litany of agencies that cover city insurance, employee benefit programs, SAIF, OSHA, the city attorney, risk management, pre-loss and health insurance. In addition, both Melanie and Diane manage recruitment, compensation, benefits, training, and employee services for all city staff. To maintain a high standard of professionalism, both attend trainings and seminars to stay proficient with material, policies and procedures.

Their office is the point of contact for City Council members, guiding those elected officials through the election process. They also advise them regarding their role as councilors, including duties, policies, procedures and expectations. The organizing of City Council and Urban Renewal Agency meetings is also their responsibility, which involves preparing the council agendas. These duties require that they keep up to date with public meeting laws and provide the required documentation.

In addition to all of this, Melanie is also the assistant to Jerry Gillham, Sutherlin City Manager and unofficially holds the title of 'party planner', by keeping the 'fun' in functions for the city staff. "We could not do our job without the great team we have here, working together."

City Hall Remodel – Taking Care of Sutherlin

As a result of recent events, such as Snowmagedon and the Archie Creek Fire, the city is being proactive and preparing for the next possible event. After installing back-up generators, portable fueling station, etc. the next step towards preparation is remodeling the city hall conference room and kitchen/break room to accommodate the city's Emergency Operation Center (EOC).



It is currently under construction with an estimated completion date of December 31, 2021. Kevin Kennedy Construction received the bid award. The EOC will allow the ability to function with an organizational structure at the complexity or demand of each incident without being hindered by power outages, fallen trees, or any other safety issues.
