Recently, a sign was erected on the site of Ford's Pond, strong and sturdy, it has been built to last. The sign states simply and clearly, 'Ford's Pond, a Community Park, City of Sutherlin'. Reflected in the message of this reclaimed pond, is the greater one of endurance. Sutherlin is once again embracing changes that test the strength and vitality of the community.

In response to the resignation of Seth Vincent as Mayor, Councilor, Michelle Sumner has now assumed the role of Mayor for the City of Sutherlin. She intends to make the transition a seamless

one, ready to lead with the confidence and an accessibility that will allow people to get to know her with the knowledge that she is listening to their concerns.

Mayor Sumner has worked in the public sector for twenty-nine years and takes pride in the contributions she has made during her years of service. In the eleven years that she has been a part of the Sutherlin community, she has seen an abundance of positive growth in the services that the City has provided to its citizens. The specific examples she gives are the response to 'Snowmaggedon' of 2019 and the wildfires last year. Holiday Food Baskets – Building Bridges

The title of School Resource Officer that Jake McGarvev holds within the Sutherlin Police Department does not define the limits of his position. He views his primary responsibility of the job is in building relationships and to develop ongoing communication with the students. This creates an atmosphere of trust while also teaching students to respect the role that Officer McGarvey has and to be aware of the boundaries that are necessary for the relationships. As the holiday season approaches, those boundaries are exceeded in the effort to help provide students and their families with a food basket that is an annual event for Sutherlin schools and one that Officer McGarvey has been involved with for four years. He considers himself one of the volunteers that contribute to this tradition, taking on every task from donation collection, to the delivering of the baskets. His outreach and collection of food donations at the beginning of October with teachers, staff and students all involved in making



contributions. Local businesses also contribute, which includes Sherm's Thunderbird, Costco and Sutherlin Servpro are among those that donate each year. The space for donations is limited so each school designates an area to be used temporarily until it is time for distribution. The basket building begins when the number of families to receive them are identified; the amount is usually between 22 to 24

The decision on which baskets. students will receive a basket is determined by the observation of the teachers and the privacy of the families is always protected.
