The Year in Review

As we look back on the year of 2022, the City of Sutherlin has undertaken many projects to bring economic growth to the community and transform the standard of livability in our community. Here are some highlights:

One of the most notable, with its canopy of contrasting colors of blue and white, is the multi-use stage that now stands as an anchor in Central Park.



It provides a venue for Music Off Central, the summer concert series, with plans to expand and bring in more events throughout the year for the benefit of the community. It also provides a permanent place for the City's signature Christmas trees and will now include the 50' tree that will light the way to the new year of 2023.

The Sutherlin Downtown Development, Inc. and the City announced that a grant in the amount of \$199,835.75 was awarded by the Oregon Main Street Organization to Sutherlin for the restoration of the Historic Bank Building. Matching funds of \$60,000 will be provided from the Urban Renewal District. The face of Central Avenue will continue to change as

the façade of additional buildings and businesses are upgraded. Central Plaza Park has had a cover and entry arch added, with thanks going to Sutherlin FFA, Buglin' Heights Drafting & Design, Harvey Engineering, Great Northern Trailer Works, Inc. and Sutherlin Public Works Department.

The urban wildlife refuge and 'Jewel in the Crown' of Sutherlin, is Ford's Pond Community Park. The Friend's of Ford's Pond and the Community Development staff have generated 1.2 million in grants toward the purchase of playground equipment, the installation of restrooms, the creation of picnic areas, completion of the pond loop path and additional parking. This also allows for the planned Phase 2 construction to move forward in 2023. As stated by Board President Jim Houseman, "It is a place to walk and contemplate, an oasis for the community."



Annual Christmas Tree Lighting



The annual Sutherlin Christmas Tree lighting will be held on Sunday, December 4th, beginning at 5:00 p.m., in Central Park. The trees designed by Adam Sarnoski of Cooper Creek Creative will be secured on the multiuse stage and the 50' tree will again be the centerpiece of the display with a multitude of colored, blinking lights to welcome the Christmas season. Refreshments will be available. The event is sponsored by the Sutherlin Area Chamber of Commerce and Visitor's Center.



Timber Town Toy Land Electric Light Parade Celebrating Thirty Years

Christmas will again be on parade through the streets of downtown Sutherlin on Saturday, December 17, 2022. Now in its thirtieth year, the Timber Town Toy Land Electric Light Parade is a long standing Christmas tradition for the community. Each year the parade draws on a classic, holiday theme for contestants to represent in the decoration of their vehicles. This year, the theme is 'WhoVille', the fantasy village found in the timeless story of 'How the Grinch Stole Christmas', written by Dr. Seuss.

All entrants will be judged prior to the start of the parade, which begins at 7:00 p.m. Registration and lineup begins at 5:00 p.m. and is located at the corner of Hastings and Taylor. The four categories designated for the judging are:

* Best of Theme

* Santa's Favorite

* Commercial or Non-Profit

Entry into the parade is free and all floats must be festooned with lights. The awards will be given out at the end of the parade in the Sutherlin Community Center.
