

Waupaca County Writ of Restitution (Including Seizure of Property)

The Waupaca County Sheriff's Office (WPSO) requires a \$75 prepayment for service of a Writ of Execution. WPSO has 60 days to serve and attempt to satisfy the judgment on a Writ of Execution. If your execution includes the seizure of property to satisfy the judgment, that is located within Waupaca County, please note the following:

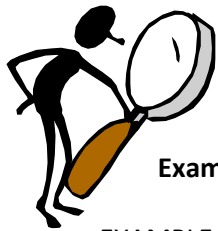
Supplemental Hearing

If your execution states that property can be seized to satisfy the judgment amount, unless the writ specifically identifies the property ownership (e.g., serial or VIN numbers) a supplemental hearing from the court may be necessary to determine ownership of property. This hearing is at the creditor's expense. At this hearing an order is issued indicating property ownership and what property can be seized by WPSO.

THE WAUPACA COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE WILL NOT SEIZE PROPERTY PURSUANT TO EXECUTION WITHOUT PROOF OF OWNERSHIP.

Bond

A bond of indemnity (provided by creditor) indemnifying (holding harmless) the Waupaca County Sheriff in this action will be needed. The value of the bond shall be twice the value of the property to be seized.



Potential Charges

These potential charges are determined by factors including the item being seized, towing fees, storage, appraisers, deputy involvement, etc.

Example of Potential Costs in a Seizure of a Property for Judgment Satisfaction:

EXAMPLE: VEHICLE VALUED AT \$5,000

Service Prepayment:	\$	75
Bond (for \$10,000)	\$	100
Towing	\$	85
Storage (30 days @\$25)	\$	1,050
Appraiser Fees	\$	36
Posting of Sale	\$	75
Holding of Sale	\$	75
Officer Time	\$	Productive hourly rate



The WPSO will have a claim for costs and fees exceeding the non-refundable deposit and any lien holders on the property will have a claim to proceeds from the sale before any amount is applied to the judgment.

Sheriff's Sale of Property

Seized from Writ of Execution

Once WPSO has possession of the seized property a sheriff's sale will be held to generate funds for your judgment. The fee to WPSO for the posting of the sale is \$75. A separate fee for the sheriff sale of \$75 will also be charged.

Notice of sale shall be posted pursuant to Wis Stat. 815.29(1). This notice shall be posted no fewer than 21 days prior to sale.

At any time prior to sale, if the debtor claims an exemption under Wis Stat 815.18(6a) the seizure and/or sale will be halted and any property seized will be returned to debtor.
