Summer Construction Projects

Several major road projects scheduled for construction in Wentzville this summer may impact travel times.

- First, the City is adding a center turn lane on Wentzville Parkway from William Dierberg Drive to Schroeder Creek Boulevard.
- The City is also scheduled to contract for full pavement reconstruction on Corporate Parkway with work expected to begin in mid-July.
- Also in July, MoDOT expects to begin construction of a roundabout at the all-way-stop intersection of Highway Z at Church Street and the west-bound off-ramp from Interstate 70.
- A considerable amount of slab replacement is also scheduled throughout Wentzville subdivisions during the summer months as well.

Hazardous Waste Drop-Off

Each year, from May 1 through Sept. 30, St. Charles County residents may safely dispose of Household Hazardous Waste that is not typically collected through curbside recycling programs. Residents may bring unwanted items such as chemicals, auto fluids, pesticides and oil-based paints (no latex paints) to the **Recycle Works Central** location (60 Triad South Drive in St. Charles) from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., Tuesdays through Fridays, and the last Saturday of each month, with no appointment necessary. There is a \$15 fee for loads up to 50 pounds. For larger loads, the fee is the base \$15, plus an additional \$1 for each pound of material above 50.

Recycle Works West, located at 2110 E. Pitman Ave., in Wentzville, also accepts other recyclables (not including household waste). Visit the County's website at <http://bit.ly/hazardouswastedropoff> or call (636) 949-1800, for a list of materials accepted at each facility.

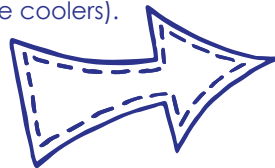


4th of July Celebration
