This community event features cars donated by businesses and organizations. The event will take place on Sunday, Sept. 11 at noon at Progress Park.

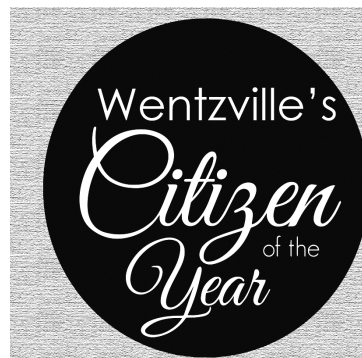
Racers are randomly placed in the cars. This race isn't fueled by gas or electronics — it's just simple gravity as the racers compete against the clock. Racers must be between 4 and 5 feet tall, weigh between 55 and 120 pounds, and fit comfortably in the car (height and weight restrictions are due to the construction of the car). A maximum of 200 racers are accepted, so register early! The child must be present at the time of registration, no mail-in registrations accepted. The races take place on Meyer Road in front of Progress Park. The cost will be \$10 for residents and \$13 for non residents. Please note: Due to facility closures registrations will not be accepted. Sept. 6-10. Race-day registrations will be accepted. Rainout date: Sept. 18 at noon.
