
Despite our best efforts, as well as many other communities similarly situated, we are disappointed to be informed that the Commonwealth is not committed to supplying towns with vaccines for a local vaccination site.

Please know, the Town is prepared and ready to administer vaccines. Proper measures have been planned and are ready for implementation. All we are missing is the vaccine. Town Officials are disappointed in the State's decision, and ongoing efforts continue in an effort to allow West Bridgewater to vaccinate our residents. We will continue to advocate this course of action.

The Commonwealth strongly believes that sites capable of serving multi-communities should be the primary vaccination sites, which includes Gillette and the Marshfield Fairgrounds. The vaccination clinic at the Marshfield Fairgrounds will be open to residents who meet the Phase I and Phase II criteria and is available to all 27 communities in Plymouth County.
