David Verrill moved to a Winterport farm with his family as a young boy, and has left his imprint here as few others have done. He played basketball at the late lamented Winterport High School, helped work the farm, was part of the crew that built the airport, and went on to serve in the Korean War. Returning home, he bought and restored the Brick Block in the village, but later sold it in order to acquire land on which to build a house. He married Carolyn, and they raised their children, Jeff and Kate, in that house while Dave grew his business building and repairing the houses of his neighbors in town. Jeff remembers being enlisted, along with his sister, to help his father deal with various domestic crises at all hours and seasons. There is a tale of false teeth being flushed down a toilet that won't be expanded on.

While working as a carpenter and builder, Dave managed to find time to serve on the school board for many years, work on the planning and budget committees of the town, and occasionally drive the school bus so that the regular driver could go hunting. He is a long-time member of the American Legion, having served for over fifty years. Two of his deepest commitments have been to scouting and the Winterport Union Meeting House. He has been implemental in helping to preserve Winterport's history, and his Boy Scouts still remember his lessons on woodworking, carving and, most importantly, life.

Dave continues to contribute to the town and its people. He can drive down any road or street in town and point out the houses he has had a hand in, and the families he has, and continues to, help.

Mrs. Fletcher was born on October 27, 1910 at her families Washington Street residence in Winterport, one year after the Boston Post Cane's were first distributed. Edwina was married for 55 years to the late Henry Fletcher, a retired Chief Engineer from the Merchant Marine, and together they raised four children in Winterport.

TOWN MANAGERS AND COUNCIL REPORT

An early spring is definitely in the air and I am sure that everyone shares my hopes for a sunny and dry one after last year's dismal weather, which only made the previous winter seem that much longer.

This is a very special year for Winterport as we celebrate our 150th birthday. We kicked off the celebration on Friday, March 12, with a reenactment of the day's activities that took place in 1860, a reading of the original speeches given at the Old Commercial House. This was followed by a talk by Teddy Weston and slide show given by Bernie Littlefield at My Fork Bar & Grille. The sharing of a beautiful birthday cake, made by Montez Catering, concluded the day's events which were attended by a very large group of Winterport residents. We will continue this celebration through the summer and cap it all off with the 5th Anniversary Winterport Music Festival scheduled for Saturday, August 7th.

Winterport, like other areas of the State, continues to face tough times ahead due to falling revenue streams and lower support from both the State and Federal Government. The Town Council and the Budget Committee worked very hard on the upcoming budget for fiscal year 2010-2011, and it appears that we will be able to keep taxes approximately where they currently stand. We have, in the past two years, cut approximately \$162,000.00 from the Municipal side of the budget in order to try to lessen the burden on our residents. In this upcoming year Winterport's share of the projected school budget will increase by \$100,000.00 and is a driving force behind any real increases or decreases in our local tax rate. I would encourage everyone to get involved in the schools budget talks and to make your voice heard by the School Districts Budget Committee members to insure the passage of a budget that provides a good education without breaking the backs of the local taxpayers. We face even tougher times within the next few years as State funding for schools will be lower and flat along with the loss of \$500,000.00 in Federal Stimulus funds that were used this year to help balance the budget. Added to all of this will be the addition of the new high school and its associated costs increasing the challenge faced by your Municipal Officers in trying to maintain our current tax rate.

This past year the residents of our Town showed why we love to call Winterport our home. There were two fund raising dinners held to help Gabe Allen and Peter Degennaro, along with a Cure for Cancer Drive. These events were enthusiastically supported by our local clubs, organizations, town officials, and our residents and were a stunning success, thank you all.

In closing, the Town Council and I look forward to seeing all of you at Town Meeting on Thursday evening June 10th at the Wagner School cafeteria. We promise you that we will do our best, working with you, and for you, as Town Manager and Town Council, to keep Winterport the place we love to call home. Please remember that when you are at the town office make sure you say hello.

To the Citizens of Winterport

The Winterport Fire and Rescue Association is a group of volunteers who are dedicated to lending a helping hand to the citizens of Winterport and surrounding towns. The association operates the Ambulance Service and performs a number of volunteer tasks which prepare us to assist you. The members donate many hours receiving training to be prepared to render aid on the ambulance when you are sick or injured and to be prepared with equipment, such as the Jaws of Life, to assist the ambulance service at accident scenes. The ambulance attendants and drivers donate untold unpaid hours responding to calls and training. On the fire side of the slate the volunteers attend training four times a month. This training is everything from how to operate the different pieces of equipment we have, safety, traffic control and fire suppression.

This year the ambulance service funded and purchased a new ambulance. The Winterport Fire and Rescue Association is very proud to report that this purchase was funded completely from the Association without any money from taxation.

The association also takes on a number of volunteer activities, including: Placing the Christmas decorations and the banners which take there place during the rest of the year; Providing traffic control for various function such as the annual Christmas Pageant and Parades;

The Winterport Volunteer Ambulance Service has been in operation and serving Winterport residents since 1972 and Frankfort residents since 1973.

For the calendar year 2009, we responded to 295 ambulance calls. Our calls average about 2 hours in duration with 2 to 3 people on each call. This gives an estimated 1,770 man hours. Time is also given in training to stay licensed, administration time (paying bills, record keeping, picking up supplies etc.), cleaning and maintenance of the ambulance, for an approximate total of 2500 man hours which are donated to the service.

There would not be an ambulance service if we did not have dedicated people to call upon. We wish to thank each and every one for their time and commitment. We also thank their families for allowing our volunteers to answer calls whether in the middle of a meal, delaying plans, or the middle of the night.

In the last few years, because we have a billing agent, Tammy Higgins, we have been able to fund a new Rescue Vehicle for the Fire Department (2008) and a new Ambulance (2009) to service the town.

Ambulance Subscriptions are available for Winterport residents (for immediate family members that reside in your home for the year of subscription). This covers basic emergency services not covered by your insurance. A subscription is \$30.00 per year (for this we take only what your insurance pays us and will not bill you for the remainder of services rendered by WVAS for each call to your home).

We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinions.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the governmental activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Winterport, Maine as of June 30, 2009, and the respective changes in financial position thereof for the year then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

The management's discussion and analysis and budgetary comparison information on pages 2-5 and 24, are not a required part of the basic financial statements but are supplementary information required by accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. We have applied certain limited procedures, which consisted principally of inquiries of management regarding the methods of measurement and presentation of the required supplementary information. However, we did not audit the information and express no opinion on it.

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the Town of Winterport, Maine basic financial statements. The introductory section, combining and individual nonmajor fund financial statements, and other supplementary information are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the basic financial statement. The combining and individual nonmajor fund financial statements and other supplementary information have been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and, in our opinion, are fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the basic financial statements taken as a whole. The introductory section has not been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and, accordingly, we express no opinion on them.

THE NEIGHBOR'S CUPBOARD

April 2010

The Neighbor's Cupboard is Winterport and Frankfort's emergency food pantry. Last year 160 families used the Cupboard. The total number of individuals among the 160 families was 474. These 160 families made 1044 visits. Of our 160 families, 66 were new families which had never visited before. The visiting families received a total of 2633 bags of food. This is a marked increase from the year before. This increase in need is happening at just the time when our inexpensive sources of food are drying up. Even the Good Shepherd Food Bank is cutting back the amount of food it can provide to us and often resorts to passing on good deals they get at Hannaford—similar to buying on sale.

Financially, last fall's fundraising letter brought in about the same donations as the year before so we are good for the near future but going to be hurting next year if inexpensive food resources remain so elusive. The government has helped a bit and made a slightly increased amount of "surplus" food available to us.

All this comes at a time when the volunteers at the Cupboard have pulled together to do the job with me being away since mid-August of 2009. I am in Boston with my son, Gabriel, as he recovers slowly but surely from his traumatic brain injury.

So I will pass along to you that the volunteers manning the Wednesday Cupboard are fantastic. They are upbeat and creative and have kept everything running in top form. If you want to help, be aggressive in collecting funds or food at your school or workplace and notify either Phylis Allen (223-9951) or Coleen Rancourt (223-5726). Stop in any Wednesday to the Calvary Apostolic Church, our host organization, between 9:00am and 10:00am to donate or see if this is the type of organization for you to join as a dynamic volunteer.

For those who may not know, there are seven public cemeteries in Winterport:

1. Oak Hill Cemetery on Lebanon Road
2. Bald Hill Cove Cemetery on the Rt. 1A and Old County Road
3. Grant/Littlefield Cemetery on Goshen Road
4. Clements Cemetery on the Monroe Road
5. Ellingwoods Corner Cemetery at Rt. 69/Ellingwoods Corner
6. Twining Cemetery on Twining Road
7. Cole Cemetery on Meadow Road

In addition to providing a final resting place, these cemeteries are also one of the best sources of the history of the people of Winterport, commemorating citizens and soldiers from as far back as the Revolutionary War. Unfortunately, time and neglect have put us in danger of losing permanently some of this history, especially in the smaller cemeteries. The Cemetery District is committed to preserving this part of our heritage.

Grave lots in the Cemeteries are available for \$225.00 per grave (\$75.00 per grave, \$150.00 for perpetual care). Although the traditional sales of graves in lots of six are still available, they are also available individually or in groups of less than six. The Treat family has figured prominently in the history of the Frankfort /Winterport area since Lt. Joshua Treat became one of the earliest settlers on the Penobscot west shore in mid 18t century. Two of his descendants, Fran Grant and Ruth Treat Crowell, recently presented a program relating their experience in locating and appropriately marking the grave of this first Treat.

The recent death of William W. Treat has ended the illustrious career of a Winterport son and benefactor of the historical society. He graduated from the local high school, went on to the University of Maine, and embarked on a remarkable career in law, banking, politics and public service. He earned the respect of presidents and international leaders, especially in his work on the Human Rights Commission at the United Nations. Yet he never lost interest in the town where he grew up. He made frequent visits to our museum, contributed monetary gifts and donations of historic materials. His grave is to be in Oak Hill Cemetery.

WHA programs presented: Francis LeBaron Goodwin Family; Historic Images from the Glass Plate Image archive-Penobscot Marine Museum, Winterport Memorial Library, Lt. WINTERPORT FIRE DEPARTMENT

To the Citizens of Winterport

Emergency responses in 2008 held on the averages we have been experiencing for some years now. The cost of home heating oil and the resulting risks associated with alternate heating methods have been of a concern. Thankfully, appropriate care is being exercised and fire calls are not increasing.

The 1983 Mack fire engine obtained last year continues to demonstrate its value. We have had to replace inner tubes and wheel components on the right side of the vehicle due to rust. We will do the left side of the vehicle this year in a preventative maintenance mode rather than the rushed mode on the right side.

Our 2009 application for an Assistance to Firefighters Grant has not been denied it also has not been approved. As you read this we will have applied again in 2010. Should we be so lucky as to have the "GRANT GODS" look favorably upon us, we will be purchasing a new engine which is setup identically to our 2004 pumper/tanker.

Our fleet is aging. The trucks are 6, 24, 27, and 32 years old. With the effort to keep taxes down the capital reserve account has not been funded to the level which is required for timely replacement without borrowing. If we are not successful in getting a grant for a new fire engine soon, either the funding of the capital reserve account will have to rise significantly or the purchase will need to be financed.

It is EXTREMELY important that you have your street number posted to make your address easy to locate. Since about half the time it is dark, these numbers should be *reflective*. It is particularly important that these numbers are displayed so as to be easily viewed as responders approach from either direction. "First red house on the right" does not work well as a description at night.

Fire permits are required for ALL open burning. Permits are available from Fire Warden, Thomas Doe, and Asst. Fire Warden Sam Butler or at the town office (9 to 5, Monday thru Friday). These permits are issued at no cost. For a fee of \$7.00 permits may be obtained any hour of the day or night on line at <http://www.maineburnpermit.com/> subject to the conditions imposed due to the environmental conditions.

The firefighters continue with mandatory training to be fully prepared to address whatever emergency we may be confronted with. This training is both internal and working with our mutual aid departments.

We have added one additional firefighter this year. Anyone interested in joining our ranks should contact the Fire Chief, Thomas Doe at 223-4412, or come to our monthly meeting which is generally the first Sunday of each month at 7:00 pm, at the fire station.

Inside you will find information regarding our recent activities in your communities as well as some statistics from 2009 county wide. Our staff has worked very hard over the last year to respond to the requests of the citizens of Waldo County as well as be proactive in many areas of Corrections and Law Enforcement.

We are proud of the opening of the new Maine Coastal Regional Re-entry Center and know that this is a huge step forward in progressive corrections. Simply warehousing individuals and later putting them back in our communities with no more tools than what they came in with will certainly lead to more crime and more victims. By providing individuals with the tools to go back into society and gain employment, housing, positive relationships, mentoring and support for issues that led into our system, we are making our communities a much safer place helping to mend the tear in our social fabric.

Our Patrol Division has been extremely busy and has recently received some new tools to assist them in providing services to your communities. The receipt of a federal grant to upgrade the video recording units in our cruisers will assist them in making strong cases for prosecution and are a great tool in our ability to train new officers and make them more effective in performing their duties. We recently got together with the Belfast and Searsport Police Departments and received a grant for two speed boards and a mobile intoxilizer unit in an effort to address speeding and OUI violations on our roads.

Our Detective division has conducted some outstanding investigations over the last year, leading to the arrest of several individuals for felony violations as well as the recovery of thousands of dollars of stolen cars, guns, jewelry, and other property as well as the seizure of thousands of dollars of drugs and cash. Their expertise in conducting more forensic investigations into the more serious crimes has been a huge asset to the citizens of Waldo County.

Our Civil Division will have wrapped up 2009 with yet again a record year for service of civil papers to include another record year of serving foreclosure notices. While this work is our statutory obligation, we take no pleasure in it and look forward to the time when we have none to serve.

**ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT
WINTERPORT WATER DISTRICT
2009**

As Superintendent of the Winterport Water District I am pleased to present my annual report to the Town of Winterport.

The year 2009 was a very busy one for our utility. The District has taken advantage of significant grant and principle forgiveness funding to complete some much needed projects. This funding was awarded to its customers under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. Generous funding like the ARRA funding defrays a significant amount of costs to the District's customers for much needed improvements to its water and sewer systems.

Water Utility operations benefiting from stimulus funding include the installation of a redundant back up well. A new 8-inch well will provide mechanical redundancy in the event of a failure of the existing drinking water supply well. The District received principle forgiveness of \$57,600 with the remaining project funding amount to be a 0% interest loan.

Over 700 feet of security fencing was installed in the wellhead area on Nason Bean Lane to help secure the well site and the Don Weston Pumping Station. This project was funded entirely through a series of wellhead protection grants the District received from 2005 to 2009.

Sewer Utility operations benefited from a very successful application process as the District was awarded Stimulus funding from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. This funding is to be used for sewer system rehabilitation in order to comply with the Federal Consent Order issued by EPA in 2003. The District applied for Stimulus funds administered by the ARRA 2009 through the United States Department of Agriculture Rural Development Utilities Division (Maine) and the Clean Water State Revolving Fund. The U.S. Department of Agriculture Rural Development has awarded the District a \$250,000 low interest loan and a \$460,000 grant for a total funding of \$710,000. The District has also been awarded a grant of \$1,185,379 from the Maine Department of Environmental Protection under the Clean Water State Revolving Fund.

The total funding package shows grants and principle forgiveness in the amount of \$1,645,379 and a loan of \$250,000 for total project funding of \$1,895,379. The funding is being utilized by the District for sewer system infrastructure rehabilitation of approximately 8,300 feet of deteriorated sewer lines. The rehabilitation project will help the wastewater treatment plant mitigate overflows of partially treated wastewater into the Penobscot River during spring runoff and other wet weather events.

The District updated its CSO Master Plan and modified the compliance schedule supported by recently collected data from a Sewer System Evaluation Survey (SSES). As a result of the SSES conducted by Olver Associates of Winterport, streets that have found to be the largest contributors of infiltration include Whig St, Oak Street, North Main Street, Dean Street, Ferry Street, Willow Street & Park Street. These streets will undergo construction in 2009 and 2010 to rehabilitate structurally deficient sewer lines.

District personnel conducted a spring and fall system-wide flushing of all water mains, a process completed every year to maintain water quality and monitor the integrity of the system. The new pumping station constructed in 2007 continues to provide a significant increase in hydrant flushing capacity.

The District saw one of its longest tenure employees leave Maine to be closer to his family in Pennsylvania. The District recognized part-time employee Scott Clukey and thanked him for his years of service to the District and its customers.

WWD continues to participate in a monthly area water utilities meeting, comprised of nine nearby water systems that share information and resources. The group meets at the Bangor Water District and collaborates on current issues, ways to reduce costs to our customers and maintaining quality customer services.

In closing, I wish to extend my thanks to the Board of Trustees, the Town of Winterport, our customers, and all of the District's employees for their support during the last 12 months.

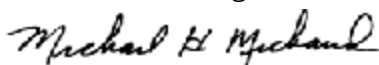

We owe it to our children and grandchildren to exercise increased wisdom when it comes to the administration of our fiscal assets.

It remains a great honor to represent your interests here in Augusta and I am thankful you have given me the opportunity to do so.

We faced many difficult decisions in the First Regular Session of the 124th, and I expect the same for the second session of the Legislature. State revenues have continued to fall far below projected amounts, resulting in yet another massive budget shortfall of \$483 million to date and we are only into January with 6 more months until the fiscal year closes.

Unlike last session where we had a massive infusion of one-time stimulus dollars, this session we can expect little help from the federal government. Augusta must solve the problem on its own. Maine families have been forced to make tough economic decisions and the time has come for state government to do the same.

This economic downturn gives lawmakers in Augusta the opportunity and the mandate to look closely at state government and engage in the responsible budgeting and decision-making process that Maine people want and expect from their elected officials. Dear Citizens of Winterport:

In 2009, I began my third term in the United States Senate. I remain deeply honored by the trust the people of Maine have placed in me, and I appreciate this opportunity to report on some highlights of my recent work in the U.S. Senate.

A significant accomplishment came in December when the President signed transportation legislation that includes a provision I authored to create a one-year pilot project to allow trucks weighing up to 100,000 pounds to use federal highways in Maine. This is moving heavy trucks off Maine's secondary roads and out of our downtowns and onto our modern, multi-lane, controlled access highways for one year, during which time a study of the impact on safety, commerce and road wear-and-tear would be conducted. In addition, this change helps to level the economic playing field, as neighboring states already have this exemption.

My appointment in early 2009 to the powerful Appropriations Committee has allowed me to have greater influence on the funding of priorities that are important to Mainers, such as shipbuilding, health care, education, and transportation, while also giving me the ability to continue pressing for the elimination of wasteful spending that exacerbates our federal deficit.

As a member of the Senate Armed Services committee, I continue to be an advocate for Bath Iron Works, the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard, the Maine Military Authority in Limestone, and the many other defense contractors and institutions in Maine that contribute so much to our national security. In August, I traveled to Iraq and Afghanistan and had the opportunity to meet with many service men and women from Maine. My conversations with them were the most important aspect of my trip to the region. Our troops are brave, dedicated, compassionate, and highly skilled. I will continue to work hard to ensure that they have the support their difficult missions require.

Perhaps the greatest challenge facing our nation continues to be the struggling economy, and among my highest priorities are getting our people back to work and our economy back on track. That is why in early 2009 I joined a bipartisan effort to pass the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. The bill contains robust infrastructure spending, significant funding for state aid and education, and tax relief for low- and middle-income families and for small businesses. As a result of this bill, Maine is receiving approximately \$133 million for highway investments, more than \$50 million combined for the Clean Water and Drinking Water State Revolving Funds, and \$70.5 million for weatherization and energy efficiency projects.

Energy policy remains another great challenge: America's reliance on foreign oil harms our economy, our security, and our environment. Meeting the challenge of developing energy alternatives will provide great opportunities for Maine to build an economy for the future, with new industries and thousands of good jobs. This endeavor received a significant boost last October when the U.S. Department of Energy announced an \$8 million grant for deepwater offshore wind research at the University of Maine, and Congress also approved \$5 million I sponsored for the Maine Offshore Wind Initiative at UMaine. This January, the U.S. Department of commerce announced a \$12.4 million laboratory construction grant for the University of Maine. I strongly advocated for these projects because, with some of the strongest winds in the nation off our coast and some of the best engineers in the field, Maine has great potential as an ideal location for

offshore wind projects and can take the lead in the development, of clean, renewable, and affordable energy for America. Estimates are that development of five gigawatts of offshore wind in Maine – enough to power more than 1 million homes for a year – could attract \$20 billion of investment to our state and create more than 15,000 green energy jobs that would be sustained over 30 years.

Of course, this past year brought not just successes. A disappointment was the failure of congress to produce bipartisan health care reform legislation that would contain soaring costs, and provide more choices for struggling families and small businesses. I am deeply concerned about the nearly \$500 billion in Medicare cuts included in the bill.

It is fiscally irresponsible to raid Medicare – a program which already has long-term financing problems – to pay for a new entitlement program, particularly at a time when the number of Medicare beneficiaries is on the rise. The bill would saddle Maine's hospitals with some \$800 million in Medicare cuts over the next ten years, and could push one in five hospitals, nursing homes, and home health providers into the red. Ultimately, such cuts could jeopardize access to care for millions of our nation's seniors.

As the Ranking Member of the Senate Homeland Security Committee, I am committed to ensuring that our nation is as safe as possible and that government is better prepared to respond to disasters. The Christmas Day terrorist attempt to detonate explosives on an aircraft reminds us of the dangers we continue to confront. My homeland security priorities include further strengthening our defenses against terrorism and providing our first responders with the resources the need.

On March 19, 2009, I reached a personal milestone when I cast my 4,000th consecutive roll call vote, continuing a record of participating in every single roll call vote since I first came to the Senate in 1997. I am grateful for the opportunity to serve Winterport and Maine in the United States Senate.
