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DEDICATION



It is rare to dedicate the town's annual report to an individual that does not reside within Winterport. This year is an exception as this man might as well have lived in Winterport for he spent most of his working hours within our town lines.

Dale Williams is a rare individual. Those who know him know how good of a person he is. For the last three decades he has either been a teacher or a principal in one of our schools. He has worked in the school district for the last 37 years.

Born and raised in Bingham he went on and studied music at the Northern Conservatory of Music until 1972. Dale went on and received his Bachelors degree in Elementary Education from UMO, graduating in 1974.

September of 1974 Dale was hired by SAD#22 as a 4th grade teacher in Newburgh. While at Newburgh Dale became a Boy Scout Leader and started a summer program for kids. In 1976 Dale took on the responsibilities of being Newburgh Elementary school's Principal.

In 1982 Dale came to the Leroy H. Smith school as a 6th grade teacher and has not left our community since. Becoming the Assistant Principal in 1991, while being a part time teacher at Smith School, Dale was responsible for the middle school grades. He also received his Master's in Administration while teaching at the Smith School. When the Samuel Wagner Middle School was built in 1992 Dale Williams became its first and only Principal. This year Mr. Williams took on the responsibilities of being the Principal of both Smith and Wagner Schools.

Looking at the history of Dale Williams career in our district and town shows the dedication, hard work, and love he has had for the education and welfare of our communities children. Through the years he has been teaching our children, Dale has been a leader, advisor, friend, mentor, and someone to look up to and respect in his views. He cherishes every child and the dedication he gives to them makes sure they have the best chances in life. He has helped so many families and individuals since being in Winterport. He will be a hard person to replace, a man everyone will miss, as he enters the next stage of his life.

In 1993 when Dale had his first staff meeting at the Samuel Wagner Middle School, he told his staff he had a vision, he wanted the students to feel they had ownership of the new school. The staff and students would be a big family, taking pride in the way they treated each other, how they would be educated, and how they would take care of the new building. At that time it was to be known as "WAGNER PRIDE", every year all the new students that entered Wagner Middle School were taught Wagner Pride. Pride in yourself, pride in your community, pride in helping and learning day to day. Dale Williams is the perfect example of "WAGNER PRIDE". To know Wagner Pride, is to know what kind of man Dale Williams is.

Asking Dale why he has stayed in Winterport all these years, he said the closeness and down to earth people of the community, along with the loyalty and dedication of the staff, made for the ideal situation for his career.

On June 18th from 3-5PM there will be a retirement party for Mr. Williams at Wagner Middle School. Anyone that would like to attend, past and present students, staff from the schools, district administration, and community members, are invited. Please come and say thank you to Mr. Williams.

The Winterport Fire and Rescue Association is a group of volunteers who are dedicated to lending a helping hand to the citizens of Winterport and surrounding towns. The association operates the Ambulance Service and performs a number of volunteer tasks which prepare us to assist you. The members donate many hours receiving training to be prepared to render aid on the ambulance when you are sick or injured and to be prepared with equipment, such as the Jaws of Life, to assist the ambulance service at accident scenes. The ambulance attendants and drivers donate untold unpaid hours responding to calls and training. On the fire side of the slate the volunteers attend training four times a month. This training is everything from how to operate the different pieces of equipment we have, safety, traffic control and fire suppression.

The association also takes on a number of volunteer activities, including: Placing the Christmas decorations and the banners which take there place during the rest of the year; Providing traffic control for various function such as the annual Christmas Pageant and Parades;

The Winterport Volunteer Ambulance Service has been in operation and serving Winterport residents since 1972 and Frankfort residents since 1973.

It is with great sadness that we are reporting the loss of 2 of our members... Sam Butler, Sam gave quite a bit of himself to the service, Sam is greatly missed, and Larry Lowe, Larry had given of himself to the service, Larry also is greatly missed.

For the calendar year 2010, we responded to 344 ambulance calls. Our calls average about 2 hours in duration with 2 to 3 people on each call. This gives an estimated 2,064 man hours. Time is also given in training to stay licensed, administration time (paying bills, record keeping, picking up supplies etc.), cleaning and maintenance of the ambulance, for an approximate total of 2600 man hours which are donated to the service.

There would not be an ambulance service if we did not have dedicated people to call upon. We wish to thank each and every one for their time and commitment. We also thank their families for allowing our volunteers to answer calls whether in the middle of a meal, delaying plans, or the middle of the night.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

October 28, 2010

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Winterport, Maine as of and for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2010, which collectively comprise the Town's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Town of Winterport, Maine's management. Our responsibility is to express opinions on these financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall general-purpose financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinions.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the governmental activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Winterport, Maine as of June 30, 2010, and the respective changes in financial position thereof for the year then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

The management's discussion and analysis and budgetary comparison information on pages 2-6 and 25, are not a required part of the basic financial statements but are supplementary information required by accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. We have applied certain limited procedures, which consisted principally of inquiries of management regarding the methods of measurement and presentation of the required supplementary information. However, we did not audit the information and express no opinion on it.

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the Town of Winterport, Maine basic financial statements. The introductory section, combining and individual nonmajor fund financial statements, and other supplementary information are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the basic financial statement. The combining and individual nonmajor fund financial statements and other supplementary information have been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and, in our opinion, are fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the basic financial statements taken as a whole. The introductory section has not been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and, accordingly, we express no opinion on them.

THE NEIGHBOR'S CUPBOARD

April 2011

The Neighbor's Cupboard is Winterport and Frankfort's emergency food pantry. Last year 132 families used the Cupboard. The total number of individuals among the 132 families was 394. The 132 families made 746 visits. Of our 132 families, 58 were new families which had never visited before. The visiting families received a total of 1814 bags of food. This is a slight decrease from last year's record use.

The Government has slightly increased its food allotment to Maine and to our Cupboard. Two local farms, Anderson's and Fisher's Organic Farm supplied us with a ton of fresh vegetables. Our fundraising enabled us to purchase food from the Good Shepherd to round out our pantry.

Our Volunteers have continued to grow in number and spirit. Last week when we were all attending we had 11 helpers greeting, filling bags, restocking shelves, selecting food from the refrig and freezer, breaking down boxes, interviewing new clients all with smiles and comradery and not running into one another! I have returned to my home. My odyssey of accompanying my son Gabe to various TBI treatment centers has ended with him being almost ready to leave Brewer Rehabilitation and Living Center and living independently this June.

Fundraising and food drives keep us going so any of you who have money or food to donate be creative, generous and know we couldn't be successful without you. Please support local school, scout, and Letter Carriers Food Drives.

REPORT OF THE WINTERPORT CEMETERY DISTRICT

Sadly, the District lost long time Sexton, Sam Butler, this year. His loss is a great one. Sam had served on the District Board since it was created and we continue to be reminded of all that he did over the years. Donald Nelson has kindly agreed to serve as Sexton and we thank him for that. The District Board meets on the third Wednesday of each month throughout the year. Time has been spent adopting a unified policy of regulations for operation of the cemeteries, developing an updated inventory of the cemetery lots and repairing damage caused by time and vandalism.

For those who may not know, there are seven public cemeteries in Winterport:

1. Oak Hill Cemetery on Lebanon Road
2. Bald Hill Cove Cemetery on the Rt. 1A and Old County Road
3. Grant/Littlefield Cemetery on Goshen Road
4. Clements Cemetery on the Monroe Road
5. Ellingwoods Corner Cemetery at Rt. 69/Ellingwoods Corner
6. Twining Cemetery on Twining Road
7. Cole Cemetery on Meadow Road

In addition to providing a final resting place, these cemeteries are also one of the best sources of the history of the people of Winterport, commemorating citizens and soldiers from as far back as the Revolutionary War. Unfortunately, time and neglect have put us in danger of losing permanently some of this history, especially in the smaller cemeteries. The Cemetery District is committed to preserving this part of our heritage.

Grave lots in the Cemeteries are available for \$225.00 per grave (\$75.00 per grave, \$150.00 for perpetual care). Although the traditional sales of graves in lots of six are still available, they are also available individually or in groups of less than six. Our meetings are held the second Monday of each month, October through May. You do not have to be a member; you are welcome to attend and bring a guest. During The months of July and August the museum is open from 2:00-4:00 PM on Tuesdays. If you would like access to our collections at any time, please contact our archivist, Theodora Weston 223-5556.

During the first week of August, 2010, the Historical Association took an active part in the celebration of the Winterport Sesquicentennial. The museum was open daily and a pamphlet, prepared especially for the occasion, was distributed freely. On the day of the parade more than 75 people visited the museum. On one day a group of about fifty participants took the walk through the middle of town led by the archivist who provided historic information along the way. It was very gratifying to see that there was much interest in knowing more about the history of our community.

At a ceremony on Blueberry Hill on October 18, 2010, Representative Michael Thibodeau presented a framed copy of the legislative resolution to Theodora “Teddy” Weston, naming her the official historian for the town of Winterport. She is a charter member of the Winterport Historical Association and has been the archivist for more than twenty-five years. This presentation followed the dedication of the Winterport Blueberry Fields to the memory of Donald Weston, another charter member of WHA, honoring him for his years of service to the Town of Winterport. An appropriate marker has been placed at this very beautiful location.

At the January meeting, Richard Jagels presented a talk on “Bangor Pool Peapods” – small double-ender wood and canvas boats used on the Penobscot River by rod and reel salmon anglers. In the late 19th and early 20th centuries throngs of fishermen came each spring to this area to test their mettle against the “king of fish”. Steve Forrest (Forrest Auto Body of Winterport) has continued the tradition by building several new peapods on one of the original molds, as well as restoring older double-enders and canoes. Jagels’ talk was based on an article he researched and published in WoodenBoat magazine.

TOWN DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

The Town Development Committee is a group of citizens and Town officials that were appointed by the Town Council to assist the Council in developing and promoting projects that will enhance economic and residential growth in Winterport. Areas of interest for the Committee include trying to develop the Town's waterfront resources along the Penobscot River and Marsh Stream, to consider the Town's long term building and infrastructure needs for the Town Office, Public Safety, and Post Office, and to promote the development of recreational facilities for the Town's citizens including public waterfront access, bicycle trails, and walking and hiking trails.

The committee has been meeting since January, 2011 and has focused its efforts this year on the Town's waterfront resources. In two surveys of Winterport residents conducted over the past ten years, the Town's citizens have overwhelmingly stated that public access to the waterfront is a high priority for them. At present, the Town does not have any public access to the Penobscot River. The Committee is in the process of talking to several riverfront property owners to determine if public access can be obtained. We are also developing a plan for a walking trail that could potentially connect the Penobscot River with Town-owned property along Marsh Stream.

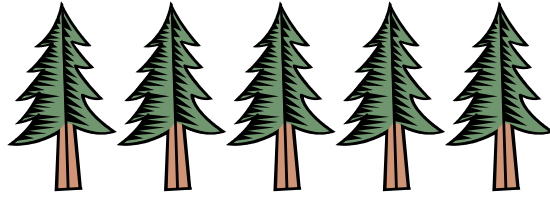
The Committee's initial goals are to work to develop this walking trail system which will promote recreational activities along the Town's waterfront. In the long run, the Committee would also like to develop additional waterfront access including possibly a boat launching area, picnic trails along the river, and a park. The Committee hopes that, by focusing on the unique waterfront resources that Winterport enjoys, additional economic and residential development will be encouraged throughout the Town, and especially in the downtown area.

To-date, the Committee has identified all properties that are currently owned by the Town. We have also met with several property owners that might be interested in participating with the development of a waterfront hiking trail project. We have also met with representatives of several development and funding agencies to determine the level of financial resources that may be available to assist with this project. We will be meeting with regulatory agencies in the upcoming months to determine criteria that must be met in order to develop these types of projects. We are also exploring the concept of developing a Land Trust that could be formed to oversee and maintain any walking trails or hiking trails that might be constructed.

The Committee is off to a strong start and looks forward to working with the Town Council and the citizens of Winterport to promote development that enhances our community.

In 1989, the Winterport Board of Selectmen established the Winterport Conservation Committee. The committee put together a detailed Management Plan for the 260 acre Blueberry Hill land. Thanks to this committee, the Blueberry Hill property is a valuable asset to the town and will be preserved for future generations. Our thanks to Don Weston, Louis Deckers, Ellie Groden, Stephanie Francis, Robert Patterson, Jane Dopheide, David Knupp, David Bright, Charles Holt and many more who helped develop the original plan.

During December 2010, the Winterport Town Council appointed and approved a new Conservation Committee to continue the good work of the previous committee. The Committee seeks to ensure that the town owned property is available for all citizens and that we protect our town's natural resources — such as water quality, scenic views, native plants, trees, and wildlife habitat — for future generations.

Our duties will include, consulting with town officials on the oversight of the 1990 Conservation Committee's Management Plan of Blueberry Hill, Winterport's Town Forest Plan (airport property), Winterport's Stream Road Forestry Plan, and all plans for Winterport's town owned land. Create and maintain maps of all the town's lands and their current uses. Conduct research on recreational uses of open space on town owned lands, controlled timber harvesting, and wildlife habitat.

We are fortunate to have all this beautiful land to enjoy and explore! We encourage everyone to learn more about our town's natural assets and enjoy them.

WINTERPORT FIRE DEPARTMENT

To the Citizens of Winterport

Emergency responses in 2009 remain on average. The cost of home heating oil and the resulting risks associated with alternate heating methods continues to be of great concern. Thankfully, appropriate care is being exercised and fire calls are not increasing.

The firemen are in the process of “repurposing” the chassis from the 1978 Chevrolet fire engine which was replaced with the 1983 Mack fire engine which was obtained in 2007. We have replaced the pumper body with the tank body which was home built many years ago.

Our 2010 application for an **Assistance to Firefighters Grant** has not been denied it also has not been approved. As you read this we will have applied again in 2011. Should we be so lucky as to have the “GRANT GODS” look favorably upon us, we will be purchasing a new engine which is setup identically to our 2004 pumper/tanker, except that it will be on a single axle truck with less water carrying capacity which will provide for improved mobility.

Our fleet is aging. The trucks are 7, 25, 28 and 33 years old. With the effort to keep taxes down the capital reserve account has not been funded to the level which is required for timely replacement without borrowing. If we are not successful in getting a grant for a new fire engine soon, either the funding of the capital reserve account will have to rise significantly or the purchase will need to be financed.

It is EXTREMELY important that you have your street number posted to make your address easy to locate. Since about half the time it is dark, these numbers should be *reflective*. It is particularly important that these numbers are displayed so as to be easily viewed as responders approach from either direction. “First red house on the right” does not work well as a description at night.

Fire permits are required for ALL open burning, year round. Permits are available from Fire Warden, Thomas Doe, or at the town office (9 to 5, Monday thru Friday). These permits are issued at no cost. For a fee of \$7.00 permits may be obtained any hour of the day or night on line at <http://www.maineburnpermit.com/> subject to the conditions imposed due to the environmental conditions.

The firefighters continue with mandatory training to be fully prepared to address whatever emergency we may be confronted with. This training is both internal and working with our mutual aid departments.

We have added one additional firefighter this year. Anyone interested in joining our ranks should contact the Fire Chief, Thomas Doe at 223-4412, or come to our monthly meeting which is generally the first Sunday of each month at 7:00 pm, at the fire station.

Dear Citizens of Waldo County

I take great pride in, once again, providing to you the annual report of the Waldo County Office of the Sheriff. In addition to the annual statistics I always provide, this year I am providing you with a quick description of the agency and its missions. Waldo County Office of the Sheriff consists of several different divisions all overseen by the Chief Deputy. First is the corrections division managed by the Jail Administrator and staffed by 12 officers. One part of this division is a 72 hour hold or "Book and Bail". This unit takes in new arrests and then arranges for bail if appropriate, court appearance or transport to a longer term holding facility. It is all that is left of our once traditional county jail. The transport team works for this division and consists of one full time and several part time officers that provide transport of prisoners to court appearances, medical appointments, civil hearings and transfers to other facilities. These officers work 24 hours a day seven days a week to assure the smooth movement of inmates through the system.

The Maine Coastal Regional Reentry Center is the largest part of the corrections division consisting of 5 contract employees and a contract director who work with the corrections officers to provide reentry programming and services to up to 32 residents of the center. The residents at this facility are men coming back to the coastal area from both state and county facilities throughout the state. This program provides them with tools to address their behaviors, skills, and basic needs to assist them in reintegration back to the communities and reduce the risk of their reoffending.

As most are aware, the Office of the Sheriff provides civil services to include court subpoenas, divorce papers, civil litigation notice, foreclosure documentation, protection orders, civil orders of arrest, etc. This division conducts thousands of services every year with an administrative assistant and three part time deputies who travel thousands of miles a year to accomplish this task.

The patrol division is the most visible part of county government and the most familiar to most citizens. We conduct patrol services to include traffic enforcement and criminal investigations as well as responding to numerous complaints that don't always fit into these categories. This division consists of 2 sergeants, 9 patrol officers, 3 detectives and a lieutenant. Officers of this division have a number of specialties to include crash reconstruction, drug recognition expert, polygraph examiner, firearms instructors, self defense instructors, and a number of other academy certified instructors. These officers are either working or on call 24/7 and are out when others are advised to stay home, due to weather or road conditions. They respond to thousands of calls every year and traditionally have a very impressive clearance rate in regard to the crimes they are called to investigate.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT WINTERPORT WATER DISTRICT 2010

As Superintendent of the Winterport Water District I am pleased to present my annual report to the Town of Winterport.

The year 2010 was yet again a very busy time for our small utility. The District continues to take advantage of American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funding, the Maine DEP Clean Water State Revolving Fund, as well as financial support from the U.S. Department of Agriculture Rural Development Utilities Division. This initial funding received in 2009 from these entities coupled with very favorable bids from contractor bidding have allowed the District to complete considerable more sewerline rehabilitation projects than was originally estimated. The rehabilitation project will help the wastewater treatment plant mitigate overflows of partially treated wastewater into the Penobscot River during spring runoff and other wet weather events.

Due to the extensive amount of sewerline rehabilitation projects and the unexpected Route 1A watermain replacement project conducted in 2010, the connection of the 8-inch redundant drinking water well installed in 2009 did not get completed. This well project, which was 40% grant funded, will have priority in 2011 to be concluded.

The Route 1A Reconstruction Project conducted by the Maine Department of Transportation required the water district to replace 1,600 feet of water mains, 600 feet of transmission mains, and 1,000 feet of house service lines in the construction area. The project area extended from Washington Street and continued on 1,600 feet towards Hampden. Some of the lines replaced were in excess of 100 years old. Olver Associates, Inc. of Winterport provided engineering services while H. E. Sargeant of Hampden was the low bidder for the project. The waterline work, with the exception of 600 feet of transmission main, was completed in late fall of 2010. The 600 feet of transmission main will go out to a bid process in the spring of 2011.

Sewer system rehabilitation work took place on Willow Street and Park Drive in 2010. The S.E. Bridges Company was awarded the project as the low bidder. A total of 1,985 linear feet of sewer main was replaced along with 551 linear feet of house laterals on these streets.

District personnel conducted a spring and fall system-wide flushing of all water mains, a process completed every year to maintain water quality and monitor the integrity of the system.

The District welcomed new employee Greg Ireland II to its staff. Greg brings with him 3 years of water utility experience and a Maine Class II drinking water operations license.

WWD continues to participate in a monthly area water utilities meeting, comprised of nine nearby water systems that share information and resources. The group meets at the Bangor Water District and collaborates on current issues, ways to reduce costs to our customers and maintaining quality customer services.

At its December 2010 Annual Meeting in Freeport the Maine Rural Water Association recognized the Winterport Water District as the 2010 recipient of its “Award for Outstanding Water Utility Operations” for small water system operations.

In compliance with the Maine Public Utilities Commission’s Chapter 140 for Utility Area and Infrastructure Mapping the District submitted these details both in paper and in a geospatial information system format as required. RCAP Solutions assisted the District with this digitized mapping project. All costs associated with this compliance project were financed under a financial grant program through the United States Department of Agriculture Rural Development.

The District’s staff and Board of Trustees participated in a series of asset management plan training sessions for the water utility. The Check Up Program for Small Systems (CUPSS) software from the USEPA allows the District to organize and develop a plan for the physical and financial health of our drinking water utility. RCAP Solutions also provided this training module to the District under a financial grant from the Maine Drinking Water Program.

The Board of Trustees approved the District’s participation in Maine WARN, a formalization of mutual aid for utilities throughout the state. Participation enhances Winterport Water District’s access to resources for information during emergencies.

In closing, I wish to extend my thanks to the Board of Trustees, the Town of Winterport, our customers, and all of the District’s employees for their support during the last 12 months.

Maine continues to face many challenges. As I travel across our state, I am inspired by stories of innovation and entrepreneurship, yet there is much more we need to do to improve our economy and create jobs.

That is why I am working so hard to improve our nation's trade policies and ensure that Mainers are competing on a level playing field. I was especially pleased that the International Trade Commission found in favor of U.S. paper manufacturers and their workers who filed a petition against Chinese and Indonesian companies that illegally dumped subsidized paper into our market. I worked hard to support this petition, and the tariffs that now apply to these imports will help keep Maine companies competitive and allow them to create and retain good paying jobs.

Our state is also making important strides in developing the types of jobs and economic opportunities that can only be done here in Maine. For example, when Eastport partnered with a U.S.-based company to act as an embarkation port for 500 dairy heifers heading to Turkey, congressional efforts were able to help cut through red tape and bureaucratic challenges. Moreover, the entire bipartisan congressional delegation has successfully urged the federal permitting agency to begin the process for a long-term certification of the Port of Eastport as a livestock exportation facility.

To that end, I cosponsored and helped pass into law last year the "America COMPETES Act," which will create jobs through innovative technology loan guarantees for small and mid-sized manufacturers. I was pleased that two amendments I offered also made it into the final bill ensuring that when implementing the bill federal agencies work together to prioritize the needs of small businesses and that those communities most hurt by our trade agreements will be given special consideration. There are too many small businesses that are struggling to survive, and we must listen to these independent owners when they tell us what they need to grow and create jobs.

A Message from Senator Michael Thibodeau

February 2011

Dear Friends and Neighbors:

It is an honor to represent you in the Maine Senate, and I am grateful for the trust you have placed in me to work for the betterment of our region.

In February, the Legislature enacted a supplemental budget that made a number of positive changes and fulfilled obligations of repaying our state's medical facilities. In total, the budget included a \$247.4 million payment in both state and federal funds to Maine hospitals. This is great news for our hospitals, which have been dependent at times on using lines of credit to survive. Additionally, the supplemental budget also included \$4.5 million tax relief through conformity to recent changes in the federal tax code. This will be a big benefit to approximately 100,000 filers including teachers who purchase classroom supplies, those who itemize, parents who claim child care expenses and people taking the earned income tax credit.

Lawmakers are now tackling the state's two-year budget and how to fill an \$800 million revenue shortfall. In order to bring the budget into balance, lawmakers will need to make some significant changes in the way state services are delivered and how taxpayer money is spent. We are committed to crafting a budget that reins in the unsustainable growth of state government, prioritizes core services like public health and safety, education, a safety net for our most vulnerable citizens, and our transportation infrastructure.

The problems before us can be fixed. I believe this is a great opportunity to make state government more efficient, reduce the size of the bureaucracy, carefully review the effectiveness of current programs, and set Maine on a new course.

Dear Town of Winterport:

As the new session of Congress began, I was honored to become the longest, currently serving member of the U.S. Senate to have never missed a roll call vote. As the 111th Congress ended, I cast my 4,563rd consecutive vote. It is a privilege to represent you in Washington, D.C. and I appreciate this opportunity to share some of my recent work as we look forward to the opportunities and challenges that lie ahead in the 112th Congress.

Creating jobs and strengthening our economy remain our nation's most pressing challenges. Far too many families and individuals throughout Maine and our nation are still suffering from a sluggish economy and high unemployment. That is why it was so vital for Congress to extend the 2001 and 2003 tax relief laws. I strongly supported a two-year extension because allowing these laws to expire would have resulted in one of the largest tax increases in our nation's history, and job killing tax hikes could well have plunged our economy deeper into recession.

Last year, I spoke to small business owners throughout Maine who told me that a tax increase could result in a loss of jobs and threaten the viability of their businesses. It is good news that Congress passed the two-year extension of these tax relief laws before 2010 came to a close, providing more certainty to businesses and relief for all taxpayers.

After years of repeated but unsuccessful attempts by the Maine delegation to address the federal truck weights law, I authored a successful truck weights pilot program in 2009 that was in effect for one year. The pilot program permitted trucks weighing up to 100,000 pounds to travel on Maine's federal interstates, where these trucks belong, rather than being diverted to secondary roads, through small communities, downtown areas, and school zones. The benefits have been evident: improved safety, lower costs, reduced energy use, and reduced emissions. I was disappointed that the U.S. House of Representatives failed to take action either to extend the pilot program or to make it permanent. Making the truck weights program permanent will be one of my top priorities this year and will be the first bill I introduce in the new Congress.

The President signed into law a number of bills that I authored or coauthored. I was proud to join Senator Joe Lieberman in leading the effort to repeal the so-called "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" law that applied to our armed forces. This long-overdue repeal enables the U.S. to join 35 of our closest allies in welcoming the military service of any qualified individual who is willing and capable of serving our country.

My efforts to counter the smuggling of illegal drugs across the Canadian border into Maine, and vice versa, were advanced when the President signed the "Northern Border Counternarcotics Strategy Act." I was the lead Republican sponsor of this law, which requires the Office of National Drug Control Policy to develop a counternarcotics strategy similar to that of the Southwestern border in collaboration with our Canadian partners. The Senate Homeland Security Committee also conducted an extensive investigation into the Fort Hood terrorist attack. We will soon release a report with recommendations on how to reduce the possibility of such an attack in the future.

Former Senator Evan Bayh and I authored a new law that establishes a new Advisory Council to develop a national plan for combating Alzheimer's disease. For the first time, this law charges federal agencies to develop a strategy to advance efforts to fight this devastating disease, at no additional cost to taxpayers.

As far too many people know, Alzheimer's disease inflicts pain and hardship on families, and costs Medicare and Medicaid billions, yet our nation has been lacking a national strategy to focus on this disease.

Maine's natural resource industries are essential to our prosperity. Last October, along with other Delegation members, I testified at an International Trade Commission hearing that resulted in a ruling that Chinese and Indonesian paper companies had been engaging in illegal trade that is unfair to our domestic industry. During the debate on the Food Safety Modernization Act, I successfully advocated for an amendment, backed by Maine's small and organic farmers, to protect our small farms from excessive regulation.

In my ongoing efforts to save jobs in Maine, I succeeded in convincing the EPA to rework regulations known as "boiler MACT" in a manner that protects the environment and public health without jeopardizing jobs in the forest products industry. I also authored successful legislation to provide small contractors more time to comply with EPA lead-based paint regulations. The high fines for non-compliance would have put many small contractors in Maine out of business.

Working with the University of Maine, I helped advance the development of deep water, off-shore wind energy. Last summer, Energy Secretary Steven Chu visited UMaine at my request, which resulted in an announcement that the Department would dedicate \$20 million to develop and test deepwater offshore wind technologies. UMaine remains on the cutting edge of this work, which has the potential to create 15,000 jobs.

I secured funding for a number of important transportation projects in 2010. For example, following my request, U.S. Transportation Secretary Ray LaHood announced that the Department would award \$10.5 million for Maine's effort to save freight railroad service in Northern Maine, and \$20 million for the rehabilitation of the Memorial Bridge between Kittery and Portsmouth.

As a member of the Senate Armed Services Committee, I worked to ensure that our men and women in uniform have the resources and support they need to protect our freedom. In 2010, I supported efforts to improve health care and other services for our military personnel and veterans, and authored key provisions to strengthen our national defense by supporting the vital work at Bath Iron Works, the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard, Pratt & Whitney, the Maine Military Authority, and other Maine industries. Following my letter last year to the President's top budget official urging him to include increased funding for the DDG-51 program in next year's budget, Defense Secretary Gates recently announced that the Pentagon would seek an additional DDG-51 in its five-year budget.

The 112th Congress will bring extraordinary challenges as we work to improve the economy, lower the unemployment rate, seek ways to reduce federal spending to bring the federal debt under control, and debate a host of other important issues. I am grateful for the opportunity to serve Winterport and Maine in the United States Senate.
