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DEDICATION

DONNA ALLEN THE FORCE BEHIND WINTERPORT'S 'NEIGHBOR'S CUPBOARD'

It was May of 1987 when Donna Allen first opened the Kaler Street doors of the downtown Winterport Methodist Church to local residents waiting for donated food at the Neighbor's Cupboard.

Now, 25 year later, with very little change except the location of the Cupboard, every Wednesday 9 to 10 a.m., Donna still opens the doors to those from Winterport and Frankfort who find themselves in need of emergency food assistance.

A quarter century ago, Donna was busy working with her husband, Mike, operating their family business, Winterport Boot Store in Brewer. The two also were raising their children, Gabe and Summer. But Donna still found time to take on “the most rewarding volunteer effort of my life...” providing food assistance for the needy through an agency that she aptly named “Neighbor's Cupboard.”

The early efforts were somewhat meager, Donna says. Accompanied by a few volunteers, she began gathering donated food and distributing it from the cellar of the Methodist Church. A few years passed before the pastor needed the space for church-related programs and the director of Neighbor's Cupboard found herself looking for a new location.

Always a forward thinker, Donna had fortified her Board of Directors with the pastors of nearly all the churches in town. Thus, it took little time to find another location for the Cupboard. She massed her volunteers and moved every box of food and all the shelving to the Apostolic Church on North Main Street.

In recent years, two major crisis struck Donna's life: in 2009 her son, Gabe, was seriously injured in an accident in California; two years later, the Apostolic Church was destroyed by fire.

Although her son returned home and needed a great deal of rehab – much of it personally overseen by Donna – she still maintained her level of commitment to the Cupboard. When fire destroyed the Apostolic Church building in 2011 - including all the food and equipment stored in the basement where the Cupboard had found its home for many years - Donna began a search for a new location.

She appealed to the Winterport Town Council and was granted permission to relocate the Cupboard to the town's Vickie Grant Civic Center, where it still distributes donated commodities one day each week.

Wednesdays these days, when Donna opens the doors of the Neighbor's Cupboard, she organizes her nearly 20 volunteers to conduct the week's distribution of food. Much of the food comes from the Good Shepherd Food Bank and from surplus federal foods – both delivered by members of the Winterport Volunteer Fire Department. Local donations come from food drives by schools, Scouts and Letter Carriers.

Donna takes no credit for the distribution of food at the Cupboard. “It's the volunteers who do all the work ...” she says. “All I do is arrange for food pick-up in Augusta and Brewer and write the annual report.”

The people of Winterport certainly know better. Ask the many volunteers who have been part of the Cupboard over the years; or ask those who have gotten a helping hand from her, or a new place to live.

They'll tell you about Donna – their words filled with praise. And they will not be surprised to see the town report dedicated to Donna Allen.

Pitula the current town manager, Susan Rioux town councilor, Lledrew Hackett former selectman and nephew of the recipient, granddaughter Kathy Urquehart, grandson Toby Montgomery, daughter-in-law Arthelene Hammond, friends Lynn Anderson, Clydella Anderson, and Linda Hoff, Bangor Daily News reporter Walter Griffin, Republican Journal reporter Megan Richardson, and State Representative Michael Thibodeau.

Mrs. Fletcher was born on October 27, 1910 at her families Washington Street residence in Winterport, one year after the Boston Post Cane's were first distributed. Edwina was married for 55 years to the late Henry Fletcher, a retired Chief Engineer from the Merchant Marine, and together they raised four children in Winterport.

The Winterport Fire and Rescue Association is a group of volunteers who are dedicated to lending a helping hand to the citizens of Winterport and surrounding towns. The association operates the Ambulance Service and performs a number of volunteer tasks which prepare us to assist you. The members donate many hours receiving training to be prepared to render aid on the ambulance when you are sick or injured and to be prepared with equipment, such as the Jaws of Life, to assist the ambulance service at accident scenes. The ambulance attendants and drivers donate untold unpaid hours responding to calls and training. On the fire side of the slate the volunteers attend training three times a month. This training is everything from how to operate the different pieces of equipment we have, safety, traffic control and fire suppression.

Many thanks to those who donate your returnable bottles at the transfer station. Also to J & M Redemption for their assistance in getting the bottles to their facility. Through donations from such activities as: Burning Grass, Burning Brush Piles and returnable bottle money we are able to purchase items for the Fire Department which reduces the amount of money which is needed to be raised through taxation to support the Fire Department.

The association also takes on a number of volunteer activities, including: Placing the Christmas decorations and the banners which take there place during the rest of the year; Providing traffic control for various function such as the annual Christmas Pageant and Parades;

Greeting Residents of Winterport!

In an effort to gain a quicker response to your home in the event of a medical emergency we ask that you please mark the end of your driveway with a clear house number that is visible from both direction of travel. This will help our crews locate your house a little quicker.

During 2011 the service responded to 401 calls with an average call duration of two hours. Normal staffing per call is a Driver and two Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) for a total of approximately 2,406 man hours of donated time. Time is also given for training to maintain proficiency and licensing level. Additional time is donated for administrative functions, cleaning and maintenance of the ambulance for an approximate total time of 3,000 hours of donated time to the Citizens of Winterport.

In the past year two new members joined our service and they are; Darren Nadeau, EMT-B and Brittany Whittlesey, EMT-I. Welcome Darren and Brittany!.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

October 7, 2011

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Winterport, Maine as of and for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2011, which collectively comprise the Town's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Town of Winterport, Maine's management. Our responsibility is to express opinions on these financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinions.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the governmental activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Winterport, Maine as of June 30, 2011, and the respective changes in financial position thereof for the year then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

The management's discussion and analysis and budgetary comparison information on pages 2-6 and 27, are not a required part of the basic financial statements but are supplementary information required by accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. We have applied certain limited procedures, which consisted principally of inquiries of management regarding the methods of measurement and presentation of the required supplementary information. However, we did not audit the information and express no opinion on it.

April 2012

We've moved! We are now in the basement of the Victoria Grant Civic Center (the community building on Park Drive). Our hours are 9:00 AM to 10:00 AM every Wednesday. If you live in Winterport or Frankfort, need food, and are low to "no" income, come and see us. If you have food to donate call Donna Allen (525-3208) and arrange a convenient time.

Our old location at the Calvary Apostolic Church was destroyed by fire last May and the Community quickly swung into action to get us up and running. Hampden treated our clients at their pantry for two weeks. Many local pantries donated food to us. The Town Council voted to provide us space until we could find a better location. The Winterport Fire Department transported the donated food to the new spot and helped to assemble new shelves. A freezer filled with meat was donated and a commercial refrigerator purchased with donated funds. Our volunteers cleaned, organized, stocked shelves and we were ready for business.

Our food line has lengthened this year with a number of residents out of work or put on part time and not easily obtaining new jobs. Physical and mental illnesses bring us many clients. Our retired fixed income folk are really suffering. The Good Shepherd Food Bank, our prime source of food, has cut way back on food availability. The Federal Government has cut back also. Typically we have 25 families visit each week. Recently that has jumped to 30 and 40 families a week. We could actually use a food drive every month!

Thank you to the local Letter Carriers, Boy Scouts, Smith and Wagner Schools, and local Churches for your efforts in food gathering. Thank you to our local farmers -- the Anderson's and Fisher Organic Farm for the ton of fresh vegetables.

Thank you most of all to the loyal group of volunteers who shop, fetch the bread, transport, stock, distribute food, keep records, write the thank you notes, break down boxes, make dump runs, sweep the floors, return plastic crates, and transport, care for and hug our clients—this means you Betty Williams, Phylis Allen, Kristen Hallett, Laurel Coulter, Coleen Rancourt, Janet Keene, Annie Robinson, Keith Ritchie, Brenda Lavalley, Don Quigley, Chris Bates, Sherrie and Bud Alford, Sandy Comeau, Shelley Jernigan, Joseph Urin, Connor Patrick, Dottie Clark, and Stan Bowden.

WINTERPORT CEMETERY DISTRICT

We are still recovering from the loss of our longtime Sexton, Sam Butler last year. Sam had served on the District Board since it was created and we continue to be reminded of all that he did over the years. Donald Nelson has kindly agreed to serve as Sexton and we thank him for that. The District Board meets on the third Wednesday of each month throughout the year. Time has been spent adopting a unified policy of regulations for operation of the cemeteries, developing an updated inventory of the cemetery lots and repairing damage caused by time and vandalism. For the first time in many years the Oak Hill Cemetery tool shed had been repaired.

For those who may not know, there are seven public cemeteries in Winterport:

1. Oak Hill Cemetery on Lebanon Road
2. Bald Hill Cove Cemetery on the Rt. 1A and Old County Road
3. Grant/Littlefield Cemetery on Goshen Road
4. Clements Cemetery on the Monroe Road
5. Ellingwoods Corner Cemetery at Rt. 69/Ellingwoods Corner
6. Twining Cemetery on Twining Road
7. Cole Cemetery on Meadow Road

In addition to providing a final resting place, these cemeteries are also one of the best sources of the history of the people of Winterport, commemorating citizens and soldiers from as far back as the Revolutionary War. Unfortunately, time and neglect have put us in danger of losing permanently some of this history, especially in the smaller cemeteries. The Cemetery District is committed to preserving this part of our heritage.

Grave lots in the Cemeteries are available for \$225.00 per grave (\$75.00 per grave, \$150.00 for perpetual care). Although the traditional sales of graves in lots of six are still available, they are also available individually or in groups of less than six. Our meetings are held the second Monday of each month, October through May. You do not have to be a member; you are welcome to attend and bring a guest. During the months of July and August the museum is open from 2:00-4:00 PM on Tuesdays. If you would like access to our collections at any time, please contact our archivist, Theodora Weston 223-5556.

The organization has published "MORE RIVER TOWN HISTORY", a soft covered book of 156 pages and 30 illustrations. Prepared by the archivist, Teddy Weston, it contains interesting information concerning many people and places which is part of the heritage of this community. The book may be purchased at the Town Office, the Library or the Weston residence at 760 N. Main Street.

The Thomas Rod Company of Bangor was the focus of Richard Jagels' talk at the December 2011 meeting. Fred Thomas, who apprenticed with legendary bamboo rod maker, Hiram Leonard, built bamboo fishing rods in Bangor for four decades in the early 20th century. His son, Leon, a resident of Winterport, carried on the business until 1958. Thomas rods are now very desirable collectables and many continue to be fished. Jagels is a UMaine Emeritus Professor of Forest Biology and WoodenBoat magazine columnist.

The January lecture "Remarkable Shipwrecks of New England, New York and the Canadian Maritimes" was given by Jon Johansen. The lecture began with the loss of the circus ship ROYAL TAR in East Penobscot Bay in October 1836 and concluded with the conspiracy theories surrounding the loss of the American submarine SCORPION and the Russian submarine K-129. Many of the disasters discussed told of vessels going aground in horrific weather conditions well away from the safety of shore. Lifesavers braved the elements, but at times all their efforts failed and they could only recover the bodies of the unfortunate. Some of the other disasters discussed included: LEXINGTON, ARCTIC, ATLANTIC, CITY OF COLUMBUS, PORTLAND, GENERAL SLOCUM, LARCHMONT, EMPRESS OF IRELAND and MONT BLANC. Johansen said there is still a lot of research to do. Frankfort/Winterport built 159 vessels and a number of these met an untimely end, but the actual accounts are lacking. Johansen is publisher of Maine Coastal News and TugBitts; president of Maine Built Boats, Maine Lobster Boat Racing and Tugboat Enthusiast Society; and is a researcher at Penobscot Marine Museum.

TOWN DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

A woodland trail nearly three miles long and leading from Abbott Park on Route 1A to Marsh Stream will become a reality in the next year as the Town Development Committee nears completion of Phase One of its first project aimed at enhancing the economic growth of downtown Winterport.

The TDC was formed in the summer of 2010 by the Town Council to assist in developing and promoting projects that encourage business and residential growth of our community.

Made up of a number of civic leaders and volunteers, the TDC decided its first project would be the nearly cost-free trail that would highlight the beauty of the town's waterfront and lead hikers and walkers to a location near the swimming hole on Marsh Stream off the Stream Road.

Because much of the trail will be located on town-owned property and SAD 22 land, the overall cost will be limited to survey work.

The Town Council has already sanctioned use of town-owned land along Marsh Stream for the trail. In addition, the TDC is working with two private land owners who have indicated they will consent to agreements that range from easements to outright donations. The TDC believes that will happen later this summer. Therefore, no land purchases will be required.

The School Board of SAD 22 earlier this year voted unanimously to join in the trail project by granting access to its land surrounding the Smith and Wagner schools. The location of the trail near the schools will give access to existing trails that lead to and from the town's recreation park and downtown area.

Working out the details of the exact location of the trail is the final step toward completion of this project. Tentative plans in Phase One of the project call for the trail to begin at Abbott Park on Route 1A, wind past the Smith School and travel westerly to its intersection with Stream Road. The trail will cross Stream Road and end at Marsh Stream, a short distance from the swimming hole.

Phase Two of the TDC work on the trail system will begin next year and will include extension of the trail across Route 1A to water's edge on the Penobscot River. The idea is to have a small park near the waterfront, featuring picnic tables and a boardwalk, taking advantage of the scenic river views of that area of town.

WINTERPORT FIRE DEPARTMENT

To the Citizens of Winterport

Unlike previous years emergency responses to structure fires was approximately tripled in 2011. The cost of home heating oil and the resulting risks associated with alternate heating methods continues to be of great concern. Appropriate care needs to be exercised, including: Being sure that you have properly operating smoke detectors in your home; heating equipment is serviced annually and your house number clearly displayed.

Our 2011 application for an **Assistance to Firefighters Grant** was unsuccessful again. As you read this we will have applied again in 2012. Should we be so lucky as to have the “GRANT GODS” look favorably upon us, we will be purchasing a new engine which is setup identically to our 2004 pumper/tanker, except that it will be on a single axle truck with less water carrying capacity which will provide for improved mobility.

Our fleet is aging. The trucks are 8, 26, 22 and 34 years old. With the effort to keep taxes down the capital reserve account has not been funded to the level which is required for timely replacement without borrowing. If we are not successful in getting a grant for a new fire engine soon, either the funding of the capital reserve account will have to rise significantly or the purchase will need to be financed. I am working with the Council and Town Manager on a long term plan for the equipment.

It is EXTREMELY important that you have your street number posted to make your address easy to locate. Since about half the time it is dark, these numbers should be *reflective*. It is particularly important that these numbers are displayed so as to be easily viewed as responders approach from either direction. “First red house on the right” does not work well as a description at night.

Fire permits are required for ALL open burning, year round. Permits are available from Fire Warden, Thomas Doe, or at the town office (9 to 5, Monday thru Friday). These permits are issued at no cost. For a fee of \$7.00 permits may be obtained any hour of the day or night on line at <http://www.maineburnpermit.com/> subject to the conditions imposed due to the environmental conditions. Thanks go out to Adam Gould who planned fabricated and installed our Fire Danger sign at the fire station as his Eagle Scout project.

The firefighters continue with mandatory training to be fully prepared to address whatever emergency we may be confronted with. This training is both internal and working with our mutual aid departments.

We have added additional firefighters this year. Anyone interested in joining our ranks should contact the Fire Chief, Thomas Doe at 223-4412, or come to our monthly meeting which is generally the first Sunday of each month at 7:00 pm, at the fire station.

Dear Citizens of Waldo County,

Once again I take great pride in providing you with the annual report of the Waldo County Office of the Sheriff. I draft this report from our new offices at 6 Public Safety Way, which is geographically located directly behind the jail and reentry center. This new facility provides us with space, technology, public access, safety and security that our previous facility was never designed for when it was built as a home in the 1800s. We offer our thanks to the citizens of Waldo County for supporting this new facility and a special thanks to the County Commissioners for making it happen.

2012 will bring many changes to the Sheriff's Office. The new facility is certainly the most visible physical change; however, there will be a number of new faces at the Sheriff's Office. The most notable change at our office will be the retirement of Chief Deputy Robert Keating. Chief Keating has dedicated his life to law enforcement; and after a long distinguished career at the City of Belfast as their Chief and later Public Safety Director, he joined the Sheriff's Office as our Chief Deputy in 2002. Chief Keating brought his experience here, and helped to bring this agency to yet again, another level of professionalism. His absence as our Chief will be missed, however, he will continue to serve this agency part time through the service of civil paperwork. When I was aware of Chief Keating's retirement, I needed to find a replacement that could take this agency into the future, building on the successes that had already been obtained. Although I have taken a bit of ribbing for my continued thefts from the City of Belfast, I invited Police Chief Jeffrey Trafton to take on the Chief Deputy position here. Chief Deputy Trafton comes to us after a twenty year career with the Maine State Police, retiring from there at the rank of Troop Commander. He served as Chief of Police for the City of Belfast for six and half years prior to joining us in November. He is a fantastic addition to this agency.

This past year we implemented our first School Resource Officer (SRO) program at the Mount View High complex. Deputy Gerald Lincoln has taken on this new program and has been received very well by both the staff and students at the school. This program is far more than just a deputy in the school. This position offers educational components, mentoring, liaison between law enforcement and youth, as well as security. The SRO program is a partnership between this agency and the school district and is considered part of the staff at the school.

The Maine Coastal Regional Reentry Center received both national and international recognition this past year. An award from the National Association of Counties recognized the work that has taken place at the new facility to reduce recidivism. An invitation for our program director Mike Tausek to speak in Singapore at an international reentry symposium was another honor. Our reentry center population is now nearing it's capacity of 32 with our numbers currently in the high twenties.

As we do every year, this report will accompany statistical data of the work your Sheriff's Office is doing, and once again I offer that if you have any questions or concerns feel free to contact us as we are YOUR SHERIFF'S OFFICE.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT WINTERPORT WATER DISTRICT 2011

As Superintendent of the Winterport Water District, I am pleased to present my annual report to the Town of Winterport.

The year 2011 was indeed a very busy time for our small utility. The District's sewer division continued to take advantage of very favorable funding it received from various agencies, including the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, the Maine DEP Clean Water State Revolving Fund, and from the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Rural Development Utilities Program. Sewer system rehabilitation work took place on Kaler and Water Streets in 2011. The Eastwood Construction Company was awarded the project as the low bidder. A total of 1,985 linear feet of sewer main was replaced along with 551 linear feet of house laterals on Kaler Street. A severely leaking manhole at the intersection of Commercial Street and Water Street was also replaced.

The continuance of the sewer system rehabilitation project will help the wastewater treatment plant mitigate overflows of partially treated wastewater into the Penobscot River during spring runoff and other wet weather events. The sewer collection system will be evaluated for flow reduction to gauge the amount of groundwater infiltration that has been removed as a result of these improvements.

Financing for the sewer system rehabilitation project was partially funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture Rural Development Utilities Program. Of the \$710,000 in funding the District received, \$460,000 was in the form of grant and \$250,000 was loan with an interest rate of 3%. The District closed the loan in the fall of 2011 and implemented a 5.6% increase in sewer user rates to aid in the funding of this additional debt service.

Senator Mike Thibodeau assisted the District with seeking a solution to repair 26 defectively installed manholes along Route 1A. These manholes were installed during the Main St. reconstruction project in 2003. With Senator Thibodeau's persistence the ratepayers did not have to fund these repairs.

The District continues to prepare for the eventual upgrade of its primary wastewater treatment plant to meet secondary standards. Notification was given in 2007 from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency that it would not reissue a waiver from secondary treatment standards. The District has contracted with the engineering firm of Olver Associates, Inc. to conduct a facilities plan to explore types of secondary treatment and funding options for the anticipated future project.

The connection of the 8-inch redundant drinking water well installed in 2009 at the Don Weston Pumping Station was completed by the contracting firm of R.F. Jordan. Pending successful analysis of the water quality of the new well it will be placed into service in 2012.

The remaining 490-foot cast iron portion of the 100-year-old transmission main between the Don Weston Pumping Station on Nason Bean Lane and Route 1A was replaced with 8-inch ductile iron pipe. Approximately 200 feet of 2-inch waterline was also installed on Pleasant Street, along with new house services. This project eliminated a longtime maintenance problem on this street.

A water meter upgrade program has continued in 2011, with 52 water meters being replaced in the system. It's anticipated that another 40 water meters will be replaced in 2012.

In December 2011 the District notified customers that it had filed with the Maine Public Utilities Commission a revised 7.12% overall increase in its water rate structure. The increase was necessary to finance additional debt service encumbered as a result of water system improvements from the 2010 North Main St. MDOT Project. Approximately 1,600 feet of water main, 600 feet of transmission main, 1,000 of house service lines and 1 fire hydrant were replaced as part of this project. Two additional fire hydrants were also installed for increased fire protection, one at the Lowes Brook crossing and the other by Littlefield's farm. Portions of the water main on Route 1A were found to be in excess of 100 years old. These improvements were made possible with \$434,000 in funding from the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Rural Development Utilities Program. Of the \$434,000 in financial support the District received for this project, included were a \$193,000 grant and the remaining \$241,000 was in the form of a low-interest loan. District personnel conducted a spring system-wide flushing of all water mains, a process that is completed every year to maintain water quality and monitor the integrity of the system.

WWD continues to participate in a monthly area water utilities meeting, comprised of nine nearby water systems that share information and resources. The group meets at the Bangor Water District and collaborates on current issues, ways to reduce costs to our customers, and maintaining quality customer services.

In closing, I wish to extend my thanks to the Board of Trustees, the Town of Winterport, our customers, and all of the District's employees for their support during the last 12 months.

Dear Winterport residents and friends:

These days I'm as frustrated as anyone with the partisan gridlock in Washington. Even the most routine congressional functions, such as passing budgets, are caught up in irresponsible political games. One way to stop this is a bill I am pushing that would make sure members of Congress wouldn't get paid if they fail to pass budget and appropriation bills on time. It is time for Congress to get serious and show some common sense.

Yet, despite congressional dysfunction, I'm pleased to report progress on a number of initiatives important to Maine. Last year, Congress passed the Small Business Jobs Act, which included my amendment to ensure Maine small business lending agencies qualified for funding under the bill. As a result, Maine received \$13.2 million last September to support small business development. Since a requirement of the funding was to match every federal dollar with 10 additional dollars, that one investment is expected to spur \$132 million in small business lending in our state.

My work in support of our nation's veterans continues to be very important to me. Last October, the House passed a measure I authored to ensure that severely disabled and elderly veterans are able to get the care they need at Maine's state veterans' homes. I'm pleased that it passed unanimously in the House, and I'm hopeful the Senate acts on it soon.

We still have much work to do to create jobs and grow our national and state economies. Last year, I visited many Maine manufacturers and received a tremendous amount of valuable feedback. After these visits, and having heard back from over 85 Maine companies that filled out an online survey I created, it was made clear to me that legislative action is needed at the federal level to do more to boost our manufacturers and the positive impact they have on our economy.

My highest priority has always been ensuring that Mainers receive timely and quality constituent services. A Message from Senator Michael Thibodeau

February 2012

Dear Friends and Neighbors:

I am grateful for the trust you have placed in me to work for the citizens of Winterport and our region. Representing your interests this past year in the Maine State Senate has been truly a rewarding experience. Thank you for allowing me the opportunity to be your voice in Augusta.

When Republicans took their oath of office last December, we promised to move Maine in a new direction and to make our state more prosperous and affordable to all Mainers. Lawmakers also faced dire budget projections of a billion dollar shortfall. Many doubted we could attain anything substantive with the obstacles before us. Instead of looking at quick-fix solutions to the problems before us, we met our challenges head on by rolling up our sleeves and working together. Over the months that ensued, the Legislature approved a number of significant reform measures to our health insurance market, tax policies, and state regulations.

Looking back at the results of the First Regular Session, I believe legislators made significant strides in addressing Maine's most pressing needs during extremely difficult times. We did so while avoiding a government shutdown and the polarizing situations that occurred in other states. Leadership made the decision early on in the session that we would insist on a two-thirds budget and we would create a culture of inclusion, respect and consensus. We increased state funding to local schools by \$65 million, brought solvency to the retiree pension system, insisted on more transparency and accountability at the Maine Turnpike Authority, and paid back our local hospitals millions of dollars that had been owed to them for years. We worked hard to deliver the changes we promised, and we succeeded.

Though important progress has been made, lawmakers have had a great deal of work since returning to Augusta in January. The most daunting task has been addressing a staggering \$120 million shortfall within the Department of Health and Human Services and its MaineCare program. In terms of all spending, MaineCare accounts for 32 percent of the state budget and enrollment is expected to grow at more than three times the rate of our revenues over the next four years. Difficult structural changes to the MaineCare program must be made soon; but I am confident that if we continue to work together as we did last year, we can return MaineCare back to a sustainable and quality system that protects Maine's most at-risk citizens.

Again, thank you for entrusting me to represent you in Augusta. Please feel free to contact me if you ever need my help in navigating the state bureaucracy. I can be reached in Augusta at 287-1505.



Dear Friends,

As we begin a new year, I welcome this opportunity to share some of my recent work for the people of our great state.

The economy and jobs remain my highest priorities. More efficient transportation is essential to our economic growth. After a years-long, hard-fought battle, I successfully pushed through Congress a bill I wrote to allow the heaviest trucks to travel on Maine's federal interstates, instead of forcing them to use our secondary roads and downtown streets. This will make our streets safer, reduce fuel consumption, and allow our businesses to be more competitive. I was pleased to have the support of many Maine groups, from the Maine State Police and the Parent-Teacher Association to the Maine Motor Transport Association and many others that helped me advocate for this sensible change.

I was also successful in my efforts to prevent the federal government from limiting certain vegetables, including Maine's potatoes, in school meal programs. Nationwide this ill-conceived proposal would have cost our schools, the states, and families an estimated \$6.8 billion over five years. I built support from both sides of the aisle and from across the country to ensure that schools maintain the flexibility they need to serve students healthy and affordable meals. This proposed rule was a prime example of excessive Washington regulation.

In my effort to protect jobs, I also introduced bipartisan legislation to ensure that the proposed EPA regulations known as the "Boiler MACT" rules protect the environment and public health without jeopardizing jobs in our state, particularly in the forest products industry. I also continued to help advance the development of deep water, off-shore wind energy at the University of Maine, which has the potential to provide clean energy and to create thousands of new jobs.

On the Armed Services Committee, I worked to secure funding for shipbuilding at Bath Iron Works, submarine overhauls at Portsmouth Naval Shipyard, and the manufacturing of aircraft engines at Pratt and Whitney, as well as to strengthen the 101st Air Refueling Wing in Bangor and the Maine Military Authority in Limestone. The new defense funding bill also includes my amendment to expedite the claims of veterans with severe disabilities like the soldier I met who is suffering from ALS, also known as Lou Gehrig's disease.

Last year, the President signed legislation I coauthored creating a national plan for combating Alzheimer's disease, which affects more than five million Americans and their families. In another health-related development, at my urging, the Food and Drug Administration allowed clinical trials to begin on the artificial pancreas, a device that could dramatically improve the health and quality of life for people with Type I diabetes.

Many Mainers have contacted me to express concern about the Postal Service, which is the linchpin of a nearly \$1 trillion mailing industry that employs 8.6 million people. I've sponsored bipartisan legislation to rescue the U.S. Postal Service from financial failure next year. This bill provides flexibility to the USPS to restructure itself in an effort to save billions of dollars and preserve universal postal service for all Americans, no matter where they live.

In December, I cast my 4,825th consecutive vote, making me the longest currently serving Senator never to have missed a vote. I am grateful for the opportunity to serve the Town of Winterport and Maine in the United States Senate.
