He joined the US Army April 26, 1954 to February 28, 1960 as a track vehicle mechanic. He was a Maine Inland Fish and Game Warden September 29, 1957. He worked for Winterport Water Company in 1958, and was a Waldo County Deputy Sheriff.

Fred married Mary E Millet Combs and helped raise her four children, George, Mark, Robin and Barbara in 1967. He worked as a janitor and then as head custodian for SAD#22 as a grounds keeper until just a few years ago. Fred also served on The Board of Selectman for the Town of Winterport. Health concerns forced him to sell his home on Rt. 1A in Winterport and move to Bangor, but he still visits Winterport often.

Fred is one the those "Good" guys that everyone liked and he would do what he could to help, even if it was just to put a smile on someones face.

Teddy Weston was born in Springfield, VT on 17 February 1921. She graduated from Colby College in 1943. In 1940 while attending Colby, she met Donald Weston during a visit to the Weston farm in Madison over Thanksgiving. On 12 January 1942 a justice of the peace in Connecticut, where Don was serving in the Army, married Teddy and Don. Just a few days after the wedding, Don left for the South Pacific and did not return home for 46 months. After graduation from Colby, Teddy worked in Schenectady, NY for GE until Don returned home from the war.

They moved to Caribou, Maine where Don worked as an engineer. All four of their children were born in Caribou. In 1957 Don accepted a position at Dow Air Force Base in Bangor, and the family moved to Winterport, to the home where Teddy still lives today. The four children attended the Winterport school system, although they ended up graduating from different high schools. John graduated from Winterport High School, Anne from Bangor, Stephen from Brewer and Peter from Hampden Academy.

When her children were young, Teddy was an active substitute teacher in the Winterport schools and as a result all students got to know her. In 1970 she accepted a full time position at Hampden Academy teaching math. After Dow closed, Don finished out his career teaching at EMVTI. Both retired in 1979.

Teddy and Don were active in the community from the first day they arrived. She was an accomplished piano player and performed in many town events, like the 1960 Winterport Centennial celebration. Teddy has been active in the Women's Club, the Universalist Church in Bangor, Girls and Boy Scouts, the Union Meeting House, and the Winterport Historical Society. The time spent with the Historical Society has been and is still very rewarding for her. She has written several books and numerous papers on various historical subjects, including the book about Winterport More River Town History, published in 2011.

Teddy has been and continues to be a mentor for many people in Winterport, whether as a den mother, Girl Scout leader, a teacher, neighbor, or just a good friend. People recognize her and wave as she takes her walks through town.

Teddy Weston finds it hard to believe she is the oldest person in Winterport because while the calendar and the body says she is getting older, her mind is still as sharp as when she was explaining algebra to her pupils 45 years ago.

TOWN MANAGERS AND COUNCIL REPORT

After two years in a row of cold temperatures and plenty of snow we enjoyed the break that this past winter brought us, milder temperatures and little in the way of snow. We also enjoyed the lowest pricing we have seen in over eight years for heating fuel for our homes and town buildings along with reasonable gasoline prices. One reoccurring theme though, is that spring has been slow in coming and we all are looking forward to warmer weather and the rebirth that comes with blooming flowers and budding trees.

I am sure that everyone is wondering what is going on with the Winterport Municipal Building Committee and the progress towards our new facility. I am happy to report that after numerous meetings over the past year and one half and recommendations to the Town Council things are moving forward and Lewis & Malm Architects will have the project going out to bid in May 2016. The Town Council and I would like to thank our voluntary committee members; Chair Thomas Doe, Vice Chair Linda Casteris El-Hajj, Dale Rowley, Ted Pearson, Jeffards Verrill, Marcel St. Denis, Lew Aurelio, and alternates Raymond Porter and Randy Poulton for the hours and hours of work they put in to bring us to this point.

The upcoming new fiscal year has presented some challenges due to changes in the States Homestead program resulting in loss of revenue to Winterport along with continued increases in our portion of the County budget by approximately \$19,000.00 and our share of the RSU 22 school assessment by \$68,090.00. The Council, Budget Committee, and I worked diligently on the proposed budget you see contained in the Warrant and we believe that when all is said and done we should be able to maintain our current mil rate for next year. I would encourage all the taxpayers of Winterport to become more active in the school budget process by attending the meetings and making your voices heard as this is where the lion's share of your property taxes go.

In closing, the Town Council and I look forward to seeing all of you at Town Meeting on Thursday evening June 16^{th} at the Wagner School cafeteria. We promise you that we will do our best, working with you, and for you, as Town Manager and Town Council, to keep Winterport the place we love to call home.

Please remember that when you are at the town office make sure you take the time to say hello.

Greeting Residents of Winterport!

During 2015 the Winterport Volunteer Ambulance Services (WVAS) responded to 330 calls with an average call duration of two hours. This is a decrease in call volume from 2014 levels. With that decrease we have been forced to make staffing changes. Putting a paramedic on calls went from 95% of calls in 2015 to 80% for 2016 call volume. This has forced us to rely on our Mutual Aid partners to a greater extent. Normal staffing for 2016 will be a Driver and an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT/EMT-P) for a total of approximately 1,320 man hours of time. Additional time is donated for administrative functions, cleaning and maintenance of the ambulance for an approximate total time of 725 hours of donated time to the residents of Winterport.

The Service had an exciting year in 2015. We took possession of our new 2015 Ford Ambulance and purchased a new stretcher. The old ambulance is being held in storage until we decide what capacity it will serve. Beginning in July the service tried an experiment to attract qualified higher licensed level volunteers to the service. We were able to attract Two paramedics to our service. We welcome Dan Landers, EMT-P and Adam Olmstead, EMT-P, two very competent Paramedics. In July of 2015 the service began paying stipends on a per shift and call basis. We strive to provide a Paramedic on at least 90% of our daytime responses.

In the expenses we purchased a new ambulance and power lift stretcher totaling just under \$200,000.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

Report on Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Winterport, Maine as of and for the year ended June 30, 2015, and related notes to the financial statements ,which collectively comprise the Town's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents,.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express opinions on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for audit opinions.

Opinions

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the governmental activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Winterport, Maine as of June 30, 2015, and the respective changes in financial position for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Other Matters

Required Supplementary Information

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that the management's discussion and analysis and budgetary comparison information on pages 3-7 and 28, be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board, who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. We have applied certain limited procedures to the required supplementary information in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which consisted of inquiries of management about the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance.

Other Information

- 2. Bald Hill Cove Cemetery on the Rt. 1A and Old County Road
- 3. Grant/Littlefield Cemetery on Goshen Road
- 4. Perkins/Vinal Cemetery on the Monroe Road
- 5. Ellingwood Corner Cemetery at Rt. 69/Ellingwood Corner
- 6. Twining Cemetery on Twining Road
- 7. Cole Cemetery on Meadow Road

In addition to providing a final resting place, these cemeteries are also one of the best sources of the history of the people of Winterport, commemorating citizens and soldiers from as far back as the Revolutionary War. Unfortunately, time and neglect have put us in danger of losing permanently some of this history, especially in the smaller cemeteries. The Cemetery District is committed to preserving this part of our heritage.

Grave lots in the Cemeteries are available for \$300.00 per grave (\$150.00 per grave, \$150.00 for perpetual care). Although the traditional sales of graves in lots of six are still available, they are also available individually or in groups of less than six. WINTERPORT FIRE DEPARTMENT

To the Citizens of Winterport

Thankfully, our responses, particularly to structure fires, in 2015 were again well below historic levels. Even with the lower cost of home heating oil experienced this fall, the risks associated with alternate heating methods continues to be of great concern. Appropriate care needs to be exercised, including: Being sure that you have properly operating smoke detectors in your home; heating equipment is serviced annually and your house number clearly displayed.

On a good note, calls for service from the Fire Department were down in 2015. In 2015 about 35% was for traffic control and to assist the ambulance. We had one structure fires and went to the aid of our mutual aid partners six times. The remainder are varied in nature from chimney fires to CO detector and smoke alarms and fire alarms at the schools.

It is EXTREMELY important that you have your street number posted to make your address easy to locate. Since about half the time it is dark, these numbers should be *reflective*. It is particularly important that these numbers are displayed so as to be easily viewed as responders approach from either direction. "First red house on the right" does not work well as a description at night. Progress on the 1989 Mack fire engine which was purchased in 2013 was not what we had hoped in 2015. We did get the tank replaced and began final adjustments to get it into service. It will completed and be in service before the town meeting in June. We plan to convert the 1983 Mack, we bought a few years ago, into a tank truck before winter. This will allow the retirement of the rather light duty GMC tank truck that has a gasoline engine and hydraulic brakes. The tank body on this truck was built locally, we have made rust repairs a couple of times and the tank needs another leak repair now. We feel it best to move to the more heavy duty truck and avoid a complete refit of this twenty-eight (30) year old truck.

Although our fleet is aging, the upgrades detailed above will allow some breathing room. When the above detailed work is complete, our fleet will be 12, 27, and 33 years old. The Capital Reserve Account will also be significantly reduced to get the work done. Funding of the Capital Reserve Account should be at a level which will restore the balance as quickly as reasonably possible to keep our options open to be in good financial shape to buy either good used equipment when the opportunity arises or to be able to buy new if needed. I continue to be concerned that solutions to budget issues in Augusta will continue to flow down hill to the municipalities putting pressure on already strained resources. Fire permits are required for <u>ALL</u> open burning, year round. Permits are available from Fire Warden, Thomas Doe, or at the town office (9 to 5, Monday thru Friday). These permits are issued at no cost. For a fee of \$7.00 permits may be obtained any hour of the day or night on line at http://www.maineburnpermit.com/ subject to the conditions imposed due to the environmental conditions. All burns are required to be conducted after 5:00 pm unless there is a steady rain or the ground is completely covered with snow. It is illegal to burn: Treated wood, shingles, siding, wiring, insulation and all other non-wood materials.

The firefighters continue with mandatory training to be fully prepared to address whatever emergency we may be confronted with. This training is both internal and working with our mutual aid departments. One of our newer members is enrolled in Basic Fire School and should be qualified as an Interior Firefighter before summer.

During the planning of the new Municipal Building, there appeared to be interest in developing a substation to shorten response times and thereby improve fire protection. I have discussed this with the Town Manager and the Town Council. The concept has full support. The first step is to identify volunteers and get them trained. With trained volunteers in place, locating and planning the substation could begin. I will have an open house in early summer to allow potential volunteers to see what firefighting and the training is all about.

Anyone interested in joining our ranks should contact the Fire Chief, Thomas Doe at 223-4412, or come to our monthly meeting which is generally the first Sunday of each month at 7:00 pm, at the fire station.

Honorable Commissioners, Citizens of Waldo County,

I am honored to provide you with the annual report of the Waldo County Sheriff's Office. 2015 was an exciting year at the Sheriff's Office. Along with me being sworn in as Sheriff, several promotions were made among the ranks. Jason Trundy was promoted to Chief Deputy. Chief Trundy is a twenty-two year veteran of the Sheriff's Office where he has served as a Corrections Officer, Patrol Deputy, Detective, Jail Administrator, and Patrol/Detective Division Lieutenant. Matthew Curtis was promoted to Lieutenant where he will oversee the Patrol and Detective Divisions. Matt is a twenty year veteran of the Sheriff's Office also with a wide range of experience. He has served as a Patrol Deputy, Detective and Patrol Sergeant. Nicholas Oettinger was promoted to Patrol Sergeant. Nick most recently served as the School Resource Officer at the Mt. View School Complex in Thorndike. In 2015, Sergeant Oettinger received the honor of being named Deputy of the Year by the Maine Sheriff's Association. This leadership team will assist me in taking the Sheriff's Office to even greater levels of service and professionalism.

The patrol division had another very busy year in 2015, handling 7,652 calls for service from the public. These calls include all manner of incidents to include domestic violence, burglaries, thefts, child abuse, sexual abuse, motor vehicle crashes and more. The epidemic of drug dependence continues to ravage the citizens of Waldo County generating much of the crime experienced in our county.

The Maine Coastal Regional Re-entry Center served 52 residents in 2015. These residents were men who were nearing the end of their term of incarceration. Our many programs assist them with their integration back into society as productive and contributing citizens. The re-entry residents provided 6,587 hours of free community service all over Waldo County. If this labor was paid at minimum wage, it would translate to \$48,403 in free labor to Waldo County Communities. The re-entry residents also provided 63,000 pounds of fresh produce to local food pantries from the County's Garden Project overseen by Waldo County Commissioner William Shorey. The residents also paid \$23,992 dollars in room and board payments to the County during the year.

The 72 hour holding and booking facility processed 1,023 persons who were arrested in Waldo County by all the law enforcement agencies serving our County. If a person who has been arrested cannot make bail within 72 hours, he or she has to be transported to the Two Bridges Regional Jail in Wiscasset by our Transport Division. This, along with bringing prisoners to court and medical appointments, generated 390 transports traveling approximately 70,000 miles in 2015.

Our Civil Service Division served 1,536 sets of legal paperwork all over Waldo County. The members of the Waldo County Sheriff's Office Team are proud to serve the citizens of this great county and we look forward to providing professional law enforcement and corrections services to our County in 2016.

WINTERPORT WATER DISTRICT - ANNUAL REPORT – 2015

It is the goal of the Winterport Water District to operate and maintain the District's facilities as required by the Maine Department of Environmental Protection and the Drinking Water Program and as required by its various permits and all applicable regulations. The Winterport Water District operates the wastewater treatment facility at 34 Sampson Street and the water treatment facility at the end of Reservoir Road.

At the wastewater treatment facility, the main activities for 2015 included completing an income survey to continue the process of obtaining funding for building a new treatment plant. The District is in the process of converting from a primary level of treatment that removes 50 percent of solids and 30 percent of organic materials from its sewage to a secondary level of treatment that removes 85 percent of solids and organic materials. In 2012 the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency revoked the District's long-standing waiver from secondary treatment due to the discharge in an estuary. The District met its previous permit requirements for primary treatment throughout the year and experienced two Combined Sewer Overflows (CSOs) due to excessive rain events. In 2015, the wastewater treatment facility treated 23.7 million gallons at a primary level of treatment, and only 90,000 gallons were discharged through its licensed CSO.

The water treatment plant utilizes two groundwater wells to pump water into the treatment building, which monitors flow and chemical addition. The system adds fluoride, chlorine, and a sequestering agent to the water. The fluoride is used as a dental supplement, the chlorine is used as a disinfection agent, and the sequestering agent is used to coat the piping and prevent downstream problems in boilers and other utility systems that use the water. In 2015, the water treatment facility pumped 20.6 million gallons of water, and of this amount 10.6 million gallons was billable revenue. The difference between the pumped water and billable revenue is water that was lost because of leaks and faulty meters, routine hydrant flushing, fire protection, and process water to name a few. Overall, the water system is in very good condition except for the water storage tank, which will be fully inspected in 2016 to determine the best option for its rehabilitation to replace the coating and to update certain features to meet current regulatory standards. The District will be working to obtain funding for these projects to minimize their impact on the ratepayers.

Annual Report to the Town of Winterport A Message from Senate President Michael Thibodeau

Dear Friends and Neighbors:

It is an honor to represent you in the Legislature and to serve as the Maine Senate President. I am grateful for the trust and confidence you have placed in me. We are now in the Second Regular Session of the 127th Legislature. We are scheduled to adjourn in mid-April. The first session is the longer of the two and ended last June. During the first session, the Legislature approved a two-year budget which is now in effect and took up about 1500 other pieces of proposed legislation. The second session is typically reserved for emergency bills. This year we have about 300 of them in front of us.

I am proud to say that one of them has already been signed into law. It is an emergency measure to address the escalating drug crisis in Maine. Law enforcement and public health officials have reported a troubling spike in the number of heroin- related overdoes and deaths in recent months. Shortly after the Legislature began work this year, we signed into law a measure that will put 10 new drug agents on the streets and make funding available for drug treatment and prevention efforts. The bill passed unanimously in the Maine Senate and House of Representatives and was quickly signed into law by Governor Paul LePage. This is, by no means, the only steps the Legislature will be taking to combat illegal drugs in Maine, but it is a promising start.

The economic reforms passed by a Republican-led Legislature continue to pay dividends. Maine's unemployment rate is down to 4 percent, statewide. The state reported a surplus of nearly \$60 million at the end of the previous fiscal year, and the quarterly economic reports since have been encouraging, as well.

But there are still enormous challenges ahead of us.

This past year, for example Maine has seen a number of paper mills either declare bankruptcy or close their doors altogether, laying off hundreds of employees. The paper mill owners have identified electricity costs as one of the reasons for their economic woes. I remain committed to lowering energy costs for both businesses and all Maine residents. I believe that Maine can be a leader in paper and pulp production because we have abundant resources and the best-trained, most qualified workers in the nation. But we must do everything in our power to make Maine more attractive to businesses.

Again, thank you for entrusting me to represent you in Augusta. Please feel free to contact me if you ever need my help in navigating the state bureaucracy. I would be happy to help in any way that I can. I can be reached in Augusta at 287-1500.

Not only does an income tax cut put more money back in your pockets, but it will also attract businesses that can offer good-paying careers to keep our young people here in Maine. It shows the nation that we are serious about wanting people and businesses to come—and stay—in Maine.

Another of my priorities is to lower the cost of student debt in Maine. If young people are struggling with too much student debt, they are unable to afford homes or vehicles. We are now offering programs to help them lower their debt, stay in Maine, begin their careers and start families.

To provide good-paying jobs for our young people, we must also work hard to reduce our energy costs. High energy costs are a major factor in driving out manufacturers, mills and other businesses that need low-cost electricity. I am committed to lowering the cost of energy, not only to attract job creators, but also to allow Maine people to heat and power their homes affordably and effectively.

And finally, we are making progress to address the drug pandemic in our state. It is my most important duty to keep the Maine people safe. While education, treatment and prevention efforts are important, we must get the dealers off the streets. I am pleased the Legislature has finally agreed to fund my proposal for more drug agents to stem the supply of deadly opiates flowing into our communities, but our law enforcement agencies are still understaffed. We must do more.

Dear Friends:

It is an honor to represent Maine in the United States Senate. I am grateful for the trust the people of our State have placed in me and welcome this opportunity to share some key accomplishments from 2015.

Growing the economy by encouraging job creation was and remains my top priority. The tax-relief bill signed into law at the close of last year contains three key provisions I authored to help foster job creation and provide small businesses with the certainty they need to invest, grow, and, most important, hire new workers. Another provision I authored that became law last year gives a boost to both Maine's economy and traffic safety. This provision permanently changed the federal law that previously had forced the heaviest trucks onto our country roads and downtown streets, rather than allowing them to use Maine's federal Interstates. In addition, I was glad to help secure another significant award for the University of Maine's deepwater offshore wind initiative, which has the potential to advance an emerging industry and create thousands of good jobs in our state.

Maine's historic contributions to our nation's defense must continue. In 2015, I secured funding toward a much-needed additional Navy destroyer, likely to be built at Bath Iron Works. Modernization projects at the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard that I have long advocated for were also completed, as were projects for the Maine National Guard.

I was also deeply involved in crafting the new education reform law to better empower states and communities in setting educational policy for their students. The law also extends a program I co-authored that provides additional assistance to rural schools, which has greatly benefitted our state. A \$250 tax deduction I authored in 2002 for teachers who spend their own money on classroom supplies was also made permanent last year.

As a result of a scientific evaluation of the nutritional value of potatoes required by a law that I wrote, the wholesome fresh potato finally was included in the federal WIC nutrition program. I also worked on other issues important to Maine's farmers and growers, including research on wild blueberries and pollinating bees.

As Chairman of the Housing Appropriations Subcommittee, I have made combating veterans' homelessness a priority. This year's housing funding law includes \$60 million for 8,000 new supportive housing vouchers for homeless veterans. Since this program began in 2008, the number of homeless veterans nationwide has dropped by one third. Maine has received nearly 200 vouchers to support homeless veterans.

Last year, I became Chairman of the Senate Aging Committee. My top three priorities for the committee are retirement security, investing more in biomedical research, and fighting fraud and financial abuses targeting our nation's seniors. I advocated for the \$2 billion increase in funding for the National Institutes of Health to advance research on such diseases as diabetes and Alzheimer's. The Senate also unanimously passed my bill to support family caregivers. The Aging Committee's toll-free hotline (1-855-303-9470) makes it easier for senior citizens to report suspected fraud and receive assistance and has already received more than 1,000 calls.

A Maine value that always guides me is our unsurpassed work ethic. As 2015 ended, I cast my 6,072nd consecutive vote, continuing my record of never missing a roll-call vote since my Senate service began in 1997.
