Teddy Weston was born in Springfield, VT on 17 February 1921. She graduated from Colby College in 1943. In 1940 while attending Colby, she met Donald Weston during a visit to the Weston farm in Madison over Thanksgiving. On 12 January 1942 a justice of the peace in Connecticut, where Don was serving in the Army, married Teddy and Don. Just a few days after the wedding, Don left for the South Pacific and did not return home for 46 months. After graduation from Colby, Teddy worked in Schenectady, NY for GE until Don returned home from the war.

They moved to Caribou, Maine where Don worked as an engineer. All four of their children were born in Caribou. In 1957 Don accepted a position at Dow Air Force Base in Bangor, and the family moved to Winterport, to the home where Teddy still lives today. The four children attended the Winterport school system, although they ended up graduating from different high schools. John graduated from Winterport High School, Anne from Bangor, Stephen from Brewer and Peter from Hampden Academy.

When her children were young, Teddy was an active substitute teacher in the Winterport schools and as a result all students got to know her. In 1970 she accepted a full time position at Hampden Academy teaching math. After Dow closed, Don finished out his career teaching at EMVTI. Both retired in 1979.

Teddy and Don were active in the community from the first day they arrived. She was an accomplished piano player and performed in many town events, like the 1960 Winterport Centennial celebration. Teddy has been active in the Women's Club, the Universalist Church in Bangor, Girls and Boy Scouts, the Union Meeting House, and the Winterport Historical Society. The time spent with the Historical Society has been and is still very rewarding for her. She has written several books and numerous papers on various historical subjects, including the book about Winterport More River Town History, published in 2011.

Teddy has been and continues to be a mentor for many people in Winterport, whether as a den mother, Girl Scout leader, a teacher, neighbor, or just a good friend. People recognize her and wave as she takes her walks through town.

Teddy Weston finds it hard to believe she is the oldest person in Winterport because while the calendar and the body says she is getting older, her mind is still as sharp as when she was explaining algebra to her pupils 45 years ago.

TOWN MANAGERS AND COUNCIL REPORT

It is hard to believe that we have been in our new Municipal Complex for a little over a year already, time truly does fly. The Council would like to report that the final figures for this project are as follows; Council Approved Budget - \$1,650,000.00 / Final Project Cost - \$1,625,799.58 / Monies from the sale of the old town office, fire station, and parking lot - \$293,655.00. We would like to thank all of our residents for making this project a reality.

The Council and I have been working on many things during this year and one area we have addressed will result in two proposed Charter amendments. The first article clarifies when a new Town Councilor actually takes office and the second one changes the language referring to our school system from an S.A.D. to an R.S.U. The Charter was originally adopted in 2004 and the Council felt that we should update things that have changed over that period of time and have a general review to see if everything in the Charter still has relevance 15 years later. The Water District will also have a warrant article to be voted on this year as they need to raise their debt ceiling in order to replace the existing water tower, which has been failing over the past few years. These three (3) warrant articles will appear on the ballot at the Tuesday General Election to insure that as many of our residents as possible get to vote on these issues.

This upcoming new fiscal year will again present some budget challenges due to the last stepped change in the States Homestead program taking effect, another increase in our portion of the County budget of \$17,962.00, along with a dramatic increase in our proposed share of the RSU 22 school assessment of \$343,542.00. The Council, Budget Committee, and I worked diligently on the proposed budget you see contained in the Warrant and unless the State allocates more money for our schools, or the overall school budget is reduced, our current mil rate for next year will see an increase of at least 1.5 mils. As we have stated in the past many years we would encourage all of the taxpayers of Winterport to become more active in the school budget process by attending the meetings and making your voices heard, as this is where the lion's share of your property assessment goes.

In closing, this will be my last town meeting and I would like to thank all of the residents of Winterport for letting me serve as town Manager for the past thirteen (13) years, it has been a pleasure. The Town Council has started a new Manager search with the Maine Municipal Association and I hope that as a town we welcome the new Manager and show the person chosen how special our town really is. We look forward to seeing all of you at Town Meeting on Thursday evening June 14th at the Wagner School cafeteria. We promise you that we will do our best, working with you, and for you, as Town Manager and Town Council, to keep Winterport the place we love to call home.

Greeting Residents of Winterport!

The Winterport Fire & Rescue Service (WF&RA), DBA Winterport Volunteer Ambulance Service (WVAS) is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization. The Service was started in February 1972 with an Oldsmobile ambulance the saw service at Pease Air Force base in New Hampshire. From that humble beginning in 1972 the Service has grown into a state of the art ambulance service, with some of the most advanced and sophisticated equipment for a service of it's size. WVAS currently owns and operates two ambulances. Both ambulances have been used simultaneously several times over the past year. Funding for the WVAS comes from Insurance billings, donations from the community, subscriptions and contributions. Please consider contributing to the Ambulance Service.

In 2017 the WVAS continued to have exciting challenges. During the year WVAS responded to 430 responses. All calls have an average duration of two hours. Normal staffing per call is a Driver and a Paramedic/EMT. This translate into approximately 1,720-man hours. Crews are paid a Stipend for being available for calls. Additional time is donated for administrative functions, cleaning and maintenance of the ambulance for an approximate total time of 725 hours of donated time to the Service.

During 2018 the Service will upgrade the 2009 ambulance from a basic level of service to an Intermediate Level. This will allow us to provide a higher level of care should the second ambulance be needed.

Finally, I would like to note that donations go directly to the operating cost of the WVAS and are used to purchase supplies and equipment to help meet its goal of providing the best possible Emergency Medical Services to the residents of Winterport. In closing none of our success would be possible with out the contributions of the members of the Winterport Fire and Rescue Association. To them I say "Thank you."

Report on Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Winterport, Maine as of and for the year ended June 30, 2017, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the Town's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express opinions on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for audit opinions.

Opinions

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the governmental activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Winterport, Maine as of June 30, 2017, and the respective changes in financial position for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Required Supplementary Information

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that the management's discussion and analysis and budgetary comparison information on pages 3-7 and 28, be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board, who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. We have applied certain limited procedures to the required supplementary information in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which consisted of inquiries of management about the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance.

Supplementary Information

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the Town of Winterport, Maine's basic financial statements. The introductory section, combining and individual nonmajor fund financial statements are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements.

THE NEIGHBOR'S CUPBOARD

April 2018

The Neighbor's Cupboard is Winterport and Frankfort's emergency food pantry. Last year 153 families used the Cupboard. We served 413 unique individuals. The families made 1276 visits, of our 153 families, 45 were new families that had never visited us before. These families received 3025 bags of food. This is an increase in the number of families from last year.

The Government's food allotment to our cupboard has decreased slightly from last year. Fisher's Organic Farm and the Waldo County Pre-release Program supplied us with a ton or more of fresh vegetables in season. Our fundraising enables us to purchase food from Good Shepherd and grocery stores to round out our food supplies.

Fundraising and food drives keep our shelves stocked with a rich variety of foods, personal care items, and detergents. Please support the local food drives, the schools, Wagner and Smith, the Woman's Club Thanksgiving Turkey Drive, and The Letter Carrier Food Drive. The Winterport Cub Scouts are planning to restart the "Scouting for Food" drive in the fall of 2018. Tea Maineia and the Winterport Winery collect food and money year round.

Our local churches; Frankfort Congregational, St Gabriel's and Ellingwood's Corner Church in Winterport, and Nealley's Corner Church in Newburgh bring us food and have provided us with many volunteers over the years.

We thank the dedicated volunteers, Donna Allen, Phylis Allen, Donna Atwood, Pauline Botting, Stan Bowden, Marty Clark, Sandy Comeau, Judy Cuddy, Kristen Hallett, Paul Hallett, Richard Jagels, Ellie Jordan, Janet Keene, Brenda Lavelley, Dianna Moore, Don Quigly, Keith Ritchie, Anie Robinson, Tom Skratt, and Betty Williams.

For those who may not know, there are seven public cemeteries in Winterport:

3. Grant/Littlefield Cemetery on Goshen Road
4. Perkins/Vinal Cemetery on the Monroe Road
5. Ellingwoods Corner Cemetery at Rt. 69/Ellingwoods Corner
6. Twining Cemetery on Twining Road
7. Cole Cemetery on Meadow Road

In addition to providing a final resting place, these cemeteries are also one of the best sources of the history of the people of Winterport, commemorating citizens and soldiers from as far back as the Revolutionary War. Unfortunately, time and neglect have put us in danger of losing permanently some of this history, especially in the smaller cemeteries. The Cemetery District is committed to preserving this part of our heritage.

Grave lots in the Cemeteries are available for \$300.00 per grave (\$150.00 per grave, \$150.00 for perpetual care). Although the traditional sales of graves in lots of six are still available, they are also available individually or in groups of less than six. This past year has seen continued growth in our sports programs, another successful Craft Fair and several other highlights.

A strong core of coaches propelled all three of our sports to successful seasons. Our T Ball/Instructional baseball and soccer seasons benefited greatly from our consistent core group of coaches. Most started coaching at grades PreK/K and moved up through the age groups. We hosted Frankfort, Searsport, and Glenburn in a round robin soccer tournament and played them several other times as well.

Our basketball program continued to make significant strides. Several people stepped forward and joined our more seasoned coaches to create our strongest group of coaches in my tenure as Rec. Director. Our older kids played Bangor, Searsport, and Belfast. They also participated in tournaments in Hampden and Belfast. A combination of free clinics (run by several residents) and the summer and fall clinics hosted by RESULTS Basketball supplemented the efforts of coaches to give us our best season in several years.

Our 3rd Annual Craft Fair was our biggest and best yet. More than 40 vendors offered 50+ tables of handmade crafts. The concession sales raised over \$600 for the Smith School Holiday Fund and the 50/50 raffle raised \$122 for the Winterport Women's Club (to be used to help replace aging Christmas decorations on Main Street).

This winter saw the triumphant return of the Winter Festival. The inconsistent winter weather has caused several cancellations of the event since its initial successful first year. This year the kids were able to sled and skate to their heart's content. When they needed a break there were hot food and drinks courtesy of our potluck lunch. Winterport Fire & Rescue provided vehicles for the kids to explore.

In the Fall we offered open adult softball and it was quite a success. Every Sunday afternoon we gathered at Abbott Park, assembled teams and played for a couple of hours. The open format allowed players with little to no experience to learn the ropes and gave veteran players a chance to play. We will also play in the spring. Keep an eye on our Facebook page for the details.

I am continuing to work with RSU 22, the school board, Dr. Richard Glencross (the principal at Wagner Middle School) and Town Manager Phil Pitula to get the baseball and softball fields up to standard. This will allow the Wagner teams to play their home games in town as opposed to being bussed to Hampden for home games. The Town has paid for improvements the last two years and we are hoping on build on that this year.

Other activities included in the Easter Egg Hunt, the Fall Festival (in conjunction with PIE), Skate Night at the Abbott Park Rink, ice skating at the rink, Saturday Kid Gym at the Smith School, and more.

WINTERPORT WOMAN'S CLUB GFWC

It is a pleasure to report to the citizens of Winterport the ongoing work of the Winterport Women's Club GFWC. Our club members continue to beautify, support and inform the community with various projects and programs, as we have done for the past 85 years! Our club was organized and federated in 1932, and we are extremely proud to have operated continually since that time.

Our membership continues to support the Town Fuel Assistance Fund. The Winterport Fire & Ambulance Service, The Neighbor's Cupboard, The Winterport Memorial Library, and to beautify the Town of Winterport with seasonal plantings and holiday wreaths. This year we were able to purchase and install a beautiful new sign at our stone planter in the village.

In September we celebrated our 85th birthday with a gathering of club members old and new, past presidents, and friends. Dorothy Havey, Special Assistant to Maine Senate President Michael Thibodeau of Winterport, presented us that evening with an official Legislative Sentiment.

Once again, we partnered with the Neighbor's Cupboard and held our second annual turkey drive on a chilly November Saturday, to provide turkey dinners to feed local families at Thanksgiving. Through the generosity of our community neighbors and friend we collected 18 turkeys, non-perishable food and \$400 in cash, checks and gift cards to donate to the Cupboard! In December, our club provided holiday gifts for local children through the Smith School, donated a decorated tree to the Wagner School's second annual Community Christmas Fair, and assisted a family through New Hope for Women in Waldo County.

In January our club voted to contribute to the prize awarded to the student winner of the 2018 Maine high school essay contest on elder abuse awareness. WINTERPORT FIRE DEPARTMENT

To the citizens of Winterport

The Fire Department moved into the new station this calendar year. This new facility is truly great! There are only a few of the firemen remaining who moved from the facility which was housed below the old Town Hall. When we moved to what is now the old station we thought we had the ultimate. I believe this newest station has actually gotten us to the ultimate in state of the art facilities.

We had Fifty-Six calls for service in calendar in 2017. Eighteen were for traffic control and to assist the ambulance. We had four structure fires and went to the aid of our mutual aid partners four times. The remainder are varied in nature from chimney fires to CO detectors, smoke alarms and fire alarms at the schools and trees in the road from the fall wind storms.

It is EXTREMELY important that you have your street number posted to make your address easy to locate. Since about half the time it is dark, these numbers should be reflective. It is particularly important that these numbers are displayed for easy visibility to responders approach from either direction. "First red house on the right" does not work well as a description at night.

Progress on the 1989 Mack fire engine which was purchased in 2013 continues. Although not complete, the truck is in service. Our plan to convert the 1983 Mack, we bought ten years ago, into a tank truck is not going to be viable as we have found the rear axle is at capacity already. Replacement of the steel body would be required in addition to the new larger tank. In the interim we have repaired the leak in the tank on the 1986 GMC.

Although our fleet is aging (newest truck is 14 years old), the upgrades detailed above will allow some breathing room. Funding of the Capital Reserve Account should be at a level which will restore the balance as quickly as reasonably possible to keep our options open to be in good financial shape to buy either good used equipment when the opportunity arises or to be able to buy new if needed. I continue to be concerned that solutions to budget issues in Augusta will continue to flow down hill to the municipalities putting pressure on already strained resources.

Fire permits are required for ALL open burning, year round. Permits are available from the Town Fire Warden (new person to be named in July) or at the town office (9 to 5, Monday thru Friday). These permits are issued at no cost. For a fee of \$7.00 permits may be obtained any hour of the day or night on line at <http://www.maineburnpermit.com/> subject to the conditions environmental conditions imposed. All outdoor burns are required to be conducted after 5:00 pm unless there is a steady rain or the ground is completely covered with snow. It is illegal to burn: Treated wood, shingles, siding, wiring, insulation and all other non-wood materials.

The firefighters continue with mandatory training to be fully prepared to address whatever emergency we may be confronted with. This training is both internal and working with our mutual aid departments. One of our newer members is enrolled in Basic Fire School and should be qualified as an Interior Firefighter before summer.

During the planning of the new Municipal Building, there appeared to be interest in developing a substation to shorten response times and thereby improve fire protection. I have discussed this with the Town Manager and the Town Council. The concept has full support. Presently we have not had any new volunteers identify themselves. With trained volunteers in place, locating and planning the substation could begin.

Anyone interested in joining our ranks should contact the Town Office, or come to our monthly meeting which is generally the first Sunday of each month at 7:00 pm, at the Municipal Complex.

In June of 2018 I will be fully retired. A new Fire Chief will be appointed by the Town Manager in July. It has been my honor to serve as your Fire Chief for the last twelve years.

Citizens of Waldo County,

The members of the Waldo County Sheriff's Office are proud to serve the citizens of our great County. We want to thank the members of the public for their continued support. We are a full service Sheriff's Office providing the Law Enforcement, Corrections, and Civil Paperwork Service to folks who live, work, and visit Waldo County.

Some highlights of 2017 included our new Domestic Violence Detective Program, our first full-time female Deputy graduated from the Maine Criminal Justice Academy, and the County Garden produced more than 100,000 pounds of vegetables that were distributed to folks in need throughout Waldo County.

Our patrol division handled 8,733 calls for service in 2017. These calls included all types of incidents from murders, domestic violence, robberies, burglaries, thefts, child abuse, sexual abuse, drug overdoses, and much more. The drug abuse epidemic continues to ravage our citizens and cause much of the crime in our country. The patrol division also conducted 1,895 traffic stops throughout the county in an effort to increase traffic safety on our roads and highways.

Our Corrections Division continues to excel in the operation of the Maine Coastal Regional Re-entry Center serving 57 residents in 2017. These are men who were nearing the end of their term of incarceration. Our many programs assist them with their integration back into society as productive and contributing citizens. During their stay at the re-entry center, residents provided 7,690 hours of community service throughout Waldo County. This translated to \$69,210 in free labor to citizens and non-profit agencies. Residents also provided more than 100,000 pounds of fresh vegetables to local food pantries and those in need from the County's Garden Project overseen by Waldo County Commissioner William Shorey. The residents also paid \$14,476 in room and board to the County and they paid \$22,146 in restitution to their victims in 2017.

The 72 hour holding and booking facility processed 941 persons who were arrested in Waldo County by all the law enforcement agencies serving our County. If a person who has been arrested cannot make bail within 72 hours, he or she is transported to the Two Bridges Regional Jail in Wiscasset by our Transport Division. Our average daily population of Waldo County prisoners held at Two Bridges was 34 men and women. This along with bringing prisoners to court and medical appointments, generated 394 transports traveling more than 72,000 miles in 2017. Our Civil Service Division served 1,746 sets of legal paperwork all over the County in 2017.

It has been an honor for all of us to serve all of you in 2017. We look forward to a safe and productive 2018.

WINTERPORT WATER DISTRICT- ANNUAL REPORT-2017

The Winterport Water District's goal is to operate and maintain the District's facilities as required by the Maine Department of Environmental Protection and the Maine Drinking Water Program and as required by its various permits and all applicable regulations. The Winterport Water District operates the wastewater treatment facility at 34 Sampson Street and the water treatment facility at the end of Reservoir Road.

This past year the wastewater treatment facility's main activities included the raising of several manholes. Overtime, these manholes have either recessed or concaved into the pavement due to the weather and heavy traffic. This coming summer the District will be working to continue this work on all problem areas. The treatment plant placed a fresh coat of paint on its pipes, pumps, and the Imhoff tank. Continued work has gone into obtaining funding for the conversion of the facility from a primary level of treatment to a secondary level of treatment that would remove 85 percent of solids and organic materials. In 2012 the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency revoked the District's long-standing waiver from secondary treatment due to the discharge in an estuary that is also in a water body with nonattainment for bacteria not directly related to the District's discharge. The District is hopeful that progress will be made on an acceptable funding package and that an upgrade to the plant will be made available in the next few years. In 2017 the District also had zero Combined Sewer Overflow events.

The District's water system includes a water treatment plant that relies on two groundwater wells to supply water to the Town. The District's treatment facility at the end of the Reservoir Road monitors the water supplied to the distribution system and adds three chemicals to its water: fluoride, chlorine, and a sequestering agent. Fluoride is used as a dental supplement, chlorine is used as a disinfection agent, and the sequestering agent is used to coat the piping and prevent downstream problems in boilers and other utility systems that use the water. The daily average for 2017 was 53,000 gallons or 19.42 million gallons of water pumped to the system. The District completed its annual spring/fall flushing. This flushing cleans out any sediments that may be present and improves the quality of the water. There are 40 hydrants located throughout the Town. These hydrants are inspected by the District employees on a weekly basis, as part of our routine maintenance program. This helps locate any issues so that hydrants can be repaired and placed back into service promptly. This past year a hydrant was replaced on Dean Street. This hydrant had a worn seal on the hose nozzle that could not be repaired due to the age of the hydrant and the inability to order replacement parts. The District also rebuilt three hydrants located at the following locations: Whig Street/Main Street, Recreational Building/Standpipe Road, and 103 Whig Street. Ongoing efforts were made this past year to inspect curb stops and exercise gate valves. Many curb stops were repaired, brought to grade, or had extensions installed, and all gate valves were inspected and cleaned out by means of vacuuming. This coming summer the District will work on locating and updating all water ties on customer lines. District employees installed 20 new water meters in customers' homes that had nonfunctioning meters. The District includes the expense for new meters in its annual budget to improve its revenues.

Overall, the water system is in very good condition, other than the two galvanized steel water lines (Lincoln Street and Parsonage Street) and the water storage tank. In 2017 the District was selected to receive a grant from the Drinking Water Program. The District has been maintaining the current standpipe, but several significant repairs are now needed. This DWP grant will provide \$488,000 in funding. The total cost of the new standpipe will be approximately \$1,220,000, of which the District will be responsible for the remaining \$732,000. The District has been working toward increasing its borrowing capacity to complete this process. When this is completed, the new standpipe will be constructed in 2018 and provide its customers with increased pressure.

In Waldo County Probate Court, we address family matters such as guardianships (for both minors and adults), adoptions, name changes, and wills and trusts. In many of these matters, we have the opportunity to work with unsung heroes offering amazing help to loved ones.

For families who cannot agree, we try to help first by offering them a reduced-price mediation opportunity. Most opt to try mediation. And most who opt to try actually do resolve differences.

For those who cannot resolve differences in mediation, we next offer a pre-trial conference to prepare the parties for the hearing. For the many who appear in court without a lawyer, at this pre-trial conference, we explain their need to organize arguments, witnesses and exhibits. In so doing, we hope to help all parties be able to appear at their hearing ready and able to present their case effectively and efficiently.

Beyond mediation and litigation, we offer educational opportunities in the form of “probate basics” workshops. On this note, please be reminded that every fall you are invited to a free probate basics workshop. At these, you can receive free Maine legal forms and explanations for organizing your very important advance directive for health care and financial power of attorney. If you are interested in attending one of these free probate basics workshops, starting in September, watch in local papers and adult education booklets for the dates, times, and places.

Lastly, a note regarding passports: Please note that you can save yourself any extra time to travel to Bangor or Augusta and simply apply for your passport in the Office of the Registrar of Probate.

Concerning our location, Waldo County Probate Court and the Office of the Registrar of Probate is located at 39A Spring Street in Belfast (on the floor below the District Court). Office hours are Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Annual Report to the Town of Winterport
A Message from Senate President Michael Thibodeau

Dear Friends and Neighbors:

It is an honor to represent you in the Maine State Senate for a fourth term, and the second as the Senate President. Term limits prevent me from running for the Maine Senate again. I am grateful for the trust and confidence you have placed in me over the years by allowing me to represent you in Augusta.

The second session of the 128th Legislature is underway, and before we adjourn in April my fellow legislators and I will be considering important matters such as tax conformity, marijuana legalization implementation, Medicaid expansion, and many others.

I am glad to inform you that in the previous session, Maine Senate Republicans were successful in our effort to eliminate the surtax from the state budget. This was a top priority for my Senate Republican colleagues. In November 2016, voters sent a clear message that education funding was to be a priority of the 128th Legislature, and we heard that message loud and clear. However, the funding mechanism which was included in the measure – the surtax – presented a serious threat to the state’s economy. This new tax gave Maine the ominous distinction of being the highest-taxed state in the country and primarily impacted small businesses, which are the backbone of our economy, taxing them at a rate that is higher than larger corporations are subject to pay. I am proud to say that after a lot of hard work and negotiating, thanks to our rebounding economy, we were able to support our local schools at a level we have never been able to before – without any additional taxation.

The Homestead Exemption, which provides much-needed property tax relief for homeowners, was also preserved in the budget with an increased exemption of \$20,000.

The Legislature also reinstated the tip credit for food servers following the longest public hearing at the State House in recent memory.

Finally, we passed a measure to make Maine compliant with the REAL ID Act. Because of this important new law, the federal government has granted Maine a waiver, meaning that Maine citizens will continue to be able to use their driver’s licenses to board commercial airplanes and access certain federal buildings beginning.

Again, thank you for entrusting me to represent you in Augusta. Please feel free to contact me if you ever need my help in navigating the state bureaucracy. I would be happy to help in any way that I can. I can be reached in Augusta at 287-1500.

Dear Friends:

It is an honor to represent Maine in the United States Senate. I am grateful for the trust the people of our State have placed in me and welcome this opportunity to share some key accomplishments from this past year.

Maine has the oldest average age in the nation. As Chairman of the Senate Aging Committee, my top three priorities for the Committee are fighting fraud and financial abuse directed at our nation's seniors, increasing investments in biomedical research, and improving retirement security. Following the Committee's investigation into skyrocketing prescription drug costs, I authored bipartisan legislation to foster generic competition, which was signed into law. The Aging Committee's toll-free hotline (1-855-303-9470) makes it easier for seniors to report suspected fraud and receive assistance. To support the 40 million family caregivers in the United States, I am proud to have authored the RAISE Family Caregivers Act to create a coordinated strategy to support family members who make countless personal and financial sacrifices to care for their loved ones.

The opioid crisis touches families and communities across our state. As a member of the Appropriations Committee, I fought for significant increases in funding to support community, law-enforcement, and public health efforts. In April, the State of Maine was awarded over \$2 million to fight this devastating public health crisis. Additionally, I have authored legislation to support grandparents and other extended family members who are raising grandchildren as a result of the nation's opioid epidemic.

Biomedical research has the potential to improve and save lives, and also supports good jobs at research facilities here in Maine. Last year, the Appropriations Committee approved a \$2 billion increase for the National Institutes of Health for the third consecutive year. This includes an increase of nearly 30 percent for research on Alzheimer's, our nation's most costly disease. As founder and co-chair of the Senate Diabetes Caucus, I work to raise awareness of the threats posed by diabetes, invest in research, and improve access to treatment options. My bill to establish a national commission of health care experts on diabetes care and prevention was signed into law in 2017.

We owe our veterans so much. Last year, I worked to secure the authorization of a Community-Based Outpatient Clinic in Portland to support the health care of Maine's veterans in the southern part of our state. I also worked to secure funding extensions to help veterans throughout rural Maine receive health care within their communities. I also worked to secure funding for housing vouchers for veterans to reduce veterans' homelessness.

Maine's contributions to our national security stretch from Kittery to Limestone. I successfully advocated for critical funding for projects at the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard for construction of an additional ship that will likely be built at Bath Iron Works. This funding will strengthen our national security and preserve great jobs in our state.

As chairman of the Transportation and Housing Appropriations Subcommittee, I worked to increase funding for the TIGER program that has provided Maine with more than \$122 million for vital transportation projects. For housing, I worked to provide \$160 million to help communities protect children from the harmful effects of lead poisoning.

Growing our economy remains a top priority. I supported the comprehensive tax reform bill because it will help lower- and middle-income families keep more of their hard-earned money; boost the economy; and encourage businesses, both small and large, to grow and create jobs here in Maine and around the country. This legislation contains key provisions I authored that are important to Mainers, including preserving the deduction for state and local taxes, expanding the deduction for medical expenses, and enabling public employees such as firefighters, teachers, and police officers, as well as clergy and employees of nonprofits, to make "catch-up" contributions to their retirement accounts. I led the effort to ensure that the tax cut will not trigger automatic budget cuts to Medicare or any other programs.

A Maine value that always guides me is our unsurpassed work ethic. As of December 2017, I have cast more than 6,500 consecutive votes, continuing my record of never missing a roll-call vote since my Senate service began in 1997.

Dear Citizens of Winterport:

For the past seven years as your Governor, my priority has been to make Maine—our people—prosper. Helping you keep more money in your wallet by reducing taxes has been part of that mission.

Too many Maine families are facing skyrocketing property taxes that strain household budgets. Our elderly on fixed incomes are particularly vulnerable to these increases. School budgets are often blamed for annual increases in property taxes. But there's another reason. A tremendous amount of land and property value has been taken off the tax rolls, leaving homeowners to pick up the tab.

As of 2016, towns and cities owned land and buildings valued at nearly \$5.5 billion statewide. Large and wealthy non-profits, such as hospitals and colleges, often escape paying property taxes on their vast real estate holdings—totaling more than \$5.1 billion statewide.

In Maine, nearly 2.5 million acres of land have been set aside for conservation by the federal and state governments and non-profit organizations, including land trusts. Municipalities are losing out on property taxes on an estimated \$2 billion in land that has been either removed from the tax rolls or prohibited from development—shifting the cost of municipal services to local homeowners through higher property taxes.

It's time to recognize the results of taking property off the tax rolls and identify solutions to reduce the burden on our homeowners. My administration's proposals have been met with staunch resistance.

In 1993, about 35,800 acres of land were documented as land-trust owned. That number has increased by an astonishing 1,270 percent. Land trusts now control over 490,000 acres with an estimated value of \$403 million. We must restore the balance. We will be working this session to ensure all land owners are contributing to the local tax base. It's time for them to pay their fair share.

I encourage you to ask your local officials how much land in your municipality has been taken off the tax rolls, as well as how much in tax revenue that land would have been contributing today to offset your property taxes.
